- Have an understanding of the Canadian Contingency Plan for Viral Haemorrhagic Fevers and Other Related Diseases, and understand how the plan fits with the ERAP response
- Understand the history and functional details of how the ERAP works, responsibilities and financial authorities
- Understand the contents of the spill response kit
- Understand the procedure for cleaning up a spill
- Understand how the ERAP teams fit into a local response
