

Emergency Plans and Operations (EPO)

Course Sponsor:

Newfoundland & Labrador Emergency Measures Organization (NLEMO)

Target Audience:

The course is designed for first responders (police, fire, ambulance, etc.), municipal staff (clerks, managers, maintenance, etc.), hospital/nursing home staff (medical and support), pertinent provincial government department staff (Municipal and Provincial Affairs, Natural Resources, Social Services, Health, etc.), volunteer organizations (ground search and rescue, amateur radio operators, Red Cross, etc.) involved in emergency situations and response efforts and other individuals invited by NLEMO.

Participant Restrictions:

Seat allocation for this course is based on eight (8) syndicate groups (Police, Fire, Municipal, Health, Social Services, Provincial Government Departments, Federal Government Departments and Volunteer Groups), therefore candidates will be accepted on a first come first serve basis within each syndicate group.

Course Description:

Duration – 3 days (written exam at end of course)

This course is designed to allow candidates to participate in a wide range of sessions, including lectures and paper exercises, in the planning and operations for a response to various emergency situations.

Prerequisite:

This is an entry-level course and therefore is a prerequisite for advanced-level courses offered by NLEMO or the Canadian Emergency Preparedness College (CEPC) in Ottawa, Ontario.
