Duration: 3 days

The session is an introduction to psychosocial response as part of emergency preparedness. The aim of this session is as follows:

- Develop a common understanding among responders of the organization and operation of emergency preparedness in disaster situations;
- Provide the knowledge and skills required to implement psychosocial interventions with a view to facilitating and accelerating a return to dynamic equilibrium in people following a traumatic event.

Course Objectives:

- Module 2- Emergency Preparedness: A Distinct Context for Response
- Module 3- The Regional Emergency Preparedness Plan of the Health and Social Services Network
- Module 4- Adaptation Process
- Module 5- Immediate Action
- Module 6- Transitional Action

- Module 7- Program for Returning to a Normal Life
- Module 8- Stress Management as Responder
