SASKATCHEWAN FIRE FACTS:

Fire is the 2nd leading cause of death due to injury for children aged 1 to 4.

Annual average

- 18 fire related deaths
- 5 of these deaths are children
- 80% of fire deaths happen in the home
- children set 100 fires causing 3 deaths and 8 injuries

GOAL:

To reduce child fire deaths and injuries through the use of the LEARN NOT TO BURN PRESCHOOL PROGRAM in child care homes & facilities across Saskatchewan.

THE PROGRAM:

- A practical, evaluated program to teach fire safety to children aged 3 to 5.
- Eight easy to follow lesson plans.
- Teaches in a positive non-threatening way i.e. does not use scare tactics.
- Makes learning active and fun.
- Empowers children with the knowledge they need to prevent fires and to protect themselves in the event of a fire.

IMPLEMENTATION:

- There is a 2 hour workshop on the how to's of the Learn Not To Burn Preschool Program.
- A workshop guide is available from the OFC Fire and Life Safety Education Resource Library (#4501) to assist fire departments to implement the program in their community. The workshop is recognized by the Child Day Care Division as meeting the criteria of a required workshop for licensed home day care operators.
- The program book and cassette tape will be provided to each participating child care home/facility at no cost.
