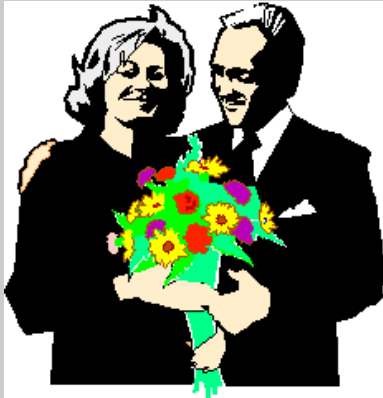

INTRODUCTION

This report presents statistics on births, deaths and marriages in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995. The data presented is the most current available at the time of publication. The source of the statistics are the records of births, deaths and marriages maintained by the Yukon Government.

HIGHLIGHTS

Population:

- Yukon's population grew by just over 6,000 individuals (approximately the equivalent of three Dawson City size towns) from 1986 to 1995
- The highest annual growth in population (6.0%) occurred in 1987 (the Faro mine reopened early in 1986).
- There has been a small increase in the concentration of Yukoners living in Whitehorse as opposed to the communities: in 1986 70.2% of Yukoners lived in Whitehorse - by 1995 that figure had increased to 72.4%.
- Older Yukoners (that is, those over 45) appear to be forming a larger proportion of the total population. Conversely, younger Yukoners (that is, those under 30) are forming a smaller proportion of the total population.

Births:

- While population increased between 1986 and 1995, the number of births in the Yukon has been relatively unchanged.
- In 8 out of 10 births the mother is under 34 years of age.

- 6 out of 10 newborns have a married mother while a little less than 4 out of 10 have a mother who is single.
- Approximately 2 out of every 3 newborns weigh from 3 to 4 kilograms (6.6 lbs. to 8.8 lbs.)
- The largest group of newborns (42.7%) are born to a mother who has no other children.

Marriages:

- Generally, as goes the population so goes the number of marriages. If the population is on the rise, the number of marriages increases and vice versa.
- In the course of a year over half the marriages occur in the months of June, July and August.
- 7 out of 10 brides and 6 out of 10 grooms are between the ages of 20 and 34.
- Based on vital statistics only it appears that if one has not married by the age of 34 the likelihood of marriage occurring thereafter decreases rapidly with age.
- There is little difference between brides and grooms in terms of their previous

marital status.

Deaths:

- In almost 9 out of 10 deaths occurring in the Yukon, the deceased was a resident of the Yukon.
- Men represent a much higher percentage of deaths than would be expected. Although composing approximately 52% of the population, men accounted for 65% of the deaths in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995.
- About 1 out of 4 deaths was the result of an accident.
- From 1986 to 1995 the number of deaths caused by cancer has increased as a percentage of all deaths.
- From 1986 to 1995 suicide accounted for a little over 5% of all deaths.

Putting the numbers in perspective: a brief look at the Yukon's population from 1986 to 1995

The Yukon's population has grown during the years from 1986 to 1995. In 1986 there were 25,754 Yukoners; in 1995 there were 31,778.

As a percentage, the growth was 23.4% or 2.6% per year.

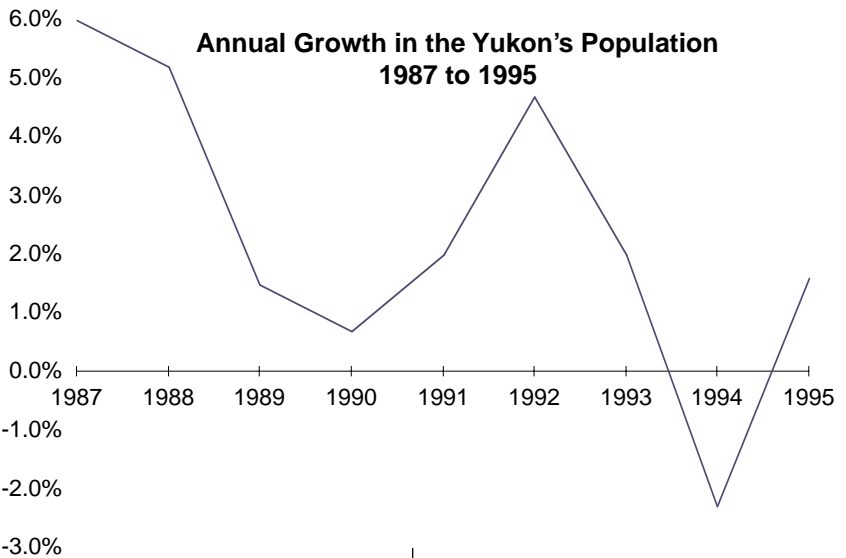

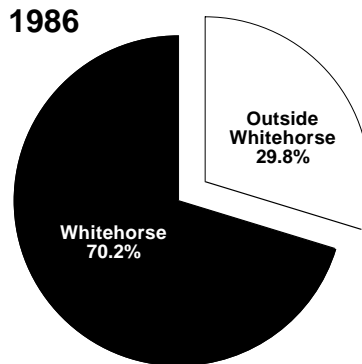

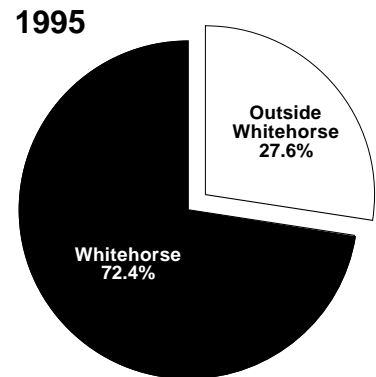
As the above chart shows, the rate of population growth has not been steady and has been on a decline since 1987.

Where Yukoner's live

In 1986 the majority of the population of 25,754 (18,092) lived in Whitehorse. As a percentage, Whitehorse had 70.2% of the Yukon's population.



By 1995 the Yukon's population had grown to 31,778 of which 23,012 or 72.4% lived in Whitehorse.



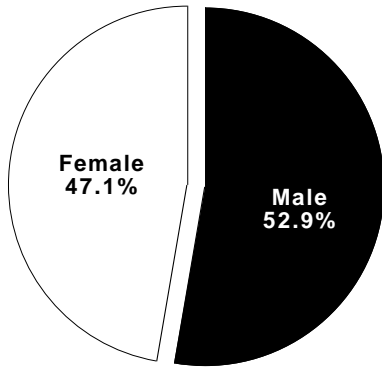
As the pie charts show, the number of Yukoners living in Whitehorse as part of the total Yukon population has increased from 1986 to 1995.

Yukon's Population by Gender

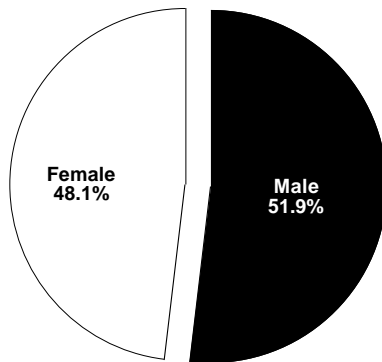
In December 1986 (annual figures are not available) 52.9% of the population was male and 47.1% was female.

In December 1995 there were 51.9% males and 48.1% females in the Yukon's population.

From 1986 to 1995 little change was seen in the relative proportion of men and women in the Yukon's population.

The figures above show the relative proportions amongst the various age groups. For instance, in 1986 25 to 29 year olds (one of the principal child bearing age groups) composed 11.0% of the population. In 1995 the same age group had declined in relative size to 8.1% of the population. It is interesting to note that, overall, the Yukon's population is "aging". With only one exception out of the 14 age groups listed above (10 to 14 year olds), all of the age groups younger than 40 years of age show a decline in their relative size in the total population. This contrasts with the age groups older than 40 years of age which all show an increase in their relative size in the Yukon's total population.

Grouping the age groups into broader categories shows the following changes between 1986 and 1995:

The table above shows that the Yukon's population in 1995 had a greater proportion of individuals in the older age groups than was the case in 1986. For instance, in 1986 12.4% of the population was 45 to 59 years old. In 1995 17.4% of the population was 45 to 59 years old. In the

younger age groups the opposite trend is evident. In 1986 27.7% of the population was 15 to 29 years old. In 1995, the same age group composed 21.6% of the Yukon's population.

Looking at Gender and Age Together

If we look only at women in the Yukon's population and the changes in the relative size of their age groupings the following breakdown is shown:

The table above shows that, for instance, in 1986 20 to 24 year old women composed 9.1% of all Yukon women; in 1995 they composed 7.1%. With the exception of 10 to 14 year olds, all the age groups under 34 years of age were relatively smaller in 1995 than in 1986. The reverse is true for those age groups older than 34 which were larger, relatively speaking, in 1995 than in 1986. A similar though less pronounced change occurred in the Yukon's male population.

The Yukon's Population: Growing Older

The comparisons made between the 1986 and 1995 Yukon population figures have highlighted an apparent "aging" trend for Yukon's population. Generally speaking, the younger age groups (those under 35) are proportionately smaller in the Yukon's population while the older age groups are proportionately bigger. The same holds true when looking only at the female population. What is causing this to happen? Will the trend continue? What will the population look like in the future?

Why is this happening? *Some possible explanations*

- people moving to the Yukon to live and work there may be older than had been the case in the past.
- people leaving the Yukon to work and live elsewhere in Canada or beyond may be younger than had been the case earlier. (note the 6 percentage point drop from 1986 to 1995 in the size of the 15 to 29 year old group)
- the number of newborns in the Yukon is proportionately getting smaller.

Will the trend continue?

Across Canada the trend to an aging population has been clearly identified. The Yukon appears to be following that trend. As a small part of the total Canadian population (approximately one tenth of one percent) the Yukon will continue to be influenced by population trends in the rest of Canada. It is reasonable to conclude that as long as the trend towards an aging population continues in Canada it will also continue in the Yukon.

What will the population look like in the future?

If the "aging" trend continues the Yukon's population should see relatively stronger growth in the 45 year old and older age groups with a decline in the relative size of those age groups under 30 years of age. The middle age group of 30 to 44 year olds should remain relatively stable in terms of its proportion of the Yukon's total population.

What causes changes in population?

Population is affected by two basic factors:

- * migration
- * natural increase

These two factors in turn are generally based on:

- * for migration: the economics of a particular region (job market and cost of living for instance) and
- * for natural increase: the age breakdown of the region's population

Other factors of course are also involved such as the region's environment; remoteness; and community services such as school and health care systems.

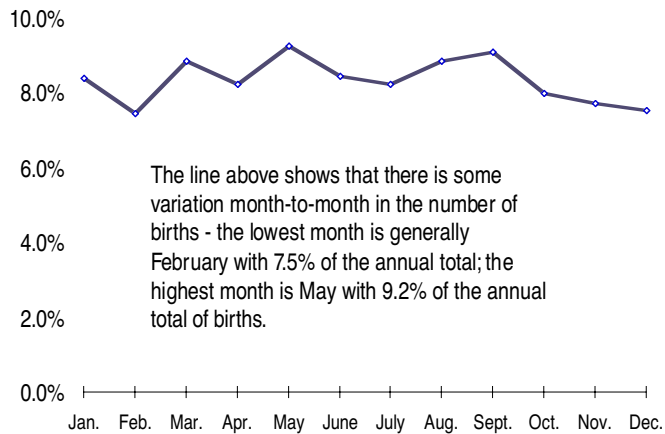

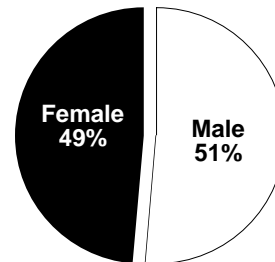

Generally, slightly more male babies were born than female.



Age of the Mother

The above table shows that, for instance, 22.3% of all births were by mothers 20 to 24 years of age. In the case of 8 out of 10 births the mother is from 20 to 34 years old. Mothers aged 35 and over have approximately 12% of all babies born. Since our earlier

look at the Yukon's population indicates an "aging" trend and women over 35 are much less likely to have a baby than younger women, it seems reasonable to predict the number of births in the Yukon in the future should remain relatively stable.

* From 1986 to 1995 there were 5,100 births in the Yukon. Not all of these births were from mothers resident in the Yukon. A small number, 255, were from mothers not resident in the Yukon but who happened to be in the Yukon when they gave birth. These mothers lived in places such as B.C. or Alberta for instance. The great majority of births, 4,845, were by mothers resident in the Yukon

Marital Status of the Mother

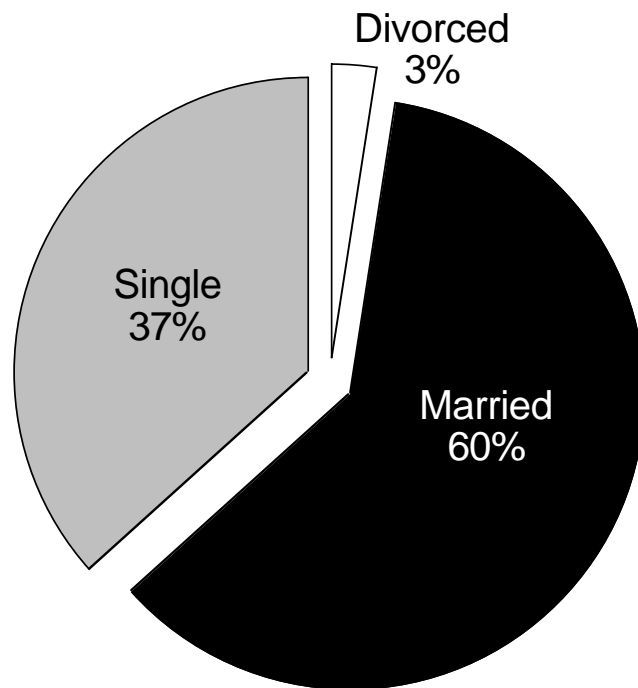
4,845 babies were born in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995. Their mothers were all residents of the Yukon. The marital status of the mothers was as follows:

- * 121 babies or **2.5%** of the total had a mother whose marital status at the time of the birth was **divorced**;
- * 2,941 babies or **60.7%** of the total had mothers who were **married**;
- * 1,776 or **36.7%** of the total had mothers who were **single**; and
- * 7 or **0.1%** of the total had mothers who were **widowed**.

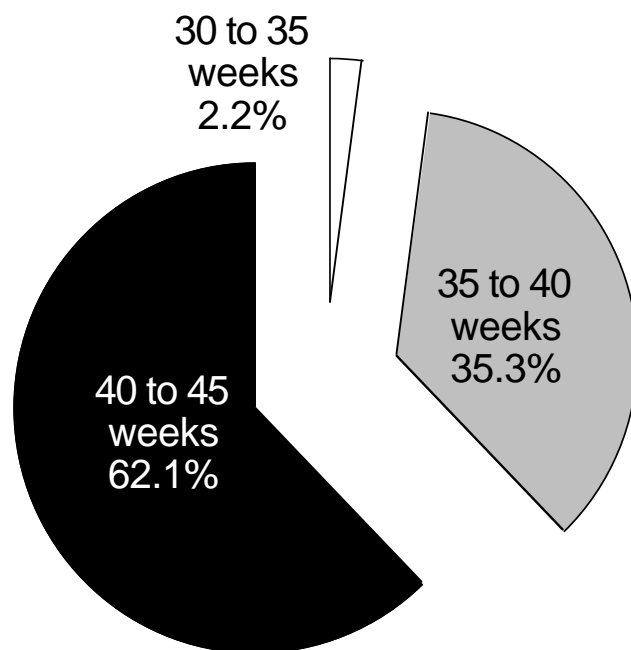
Duration of the Pregnancy

Of all the babies born in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995 (4,845):

- * 18 or **0.4%** had **under a 30 week pregnancy**;
- * 108 or **2.2%** had a **30 to 35 week pregnancy**;
- * 1,708 or **35.3%** had a **35 to 40 week pregnancy**;
- * 3,007 or **62.1%** had a **40 to 45 week pregnancy**; and
- * 4 or **0.08%** had a **45 week or more pregnancy**.



In approximate terms, 6 out of 10 babies have a married mother; a little less than 4 out of 10 have a single mother; and a very few have a divorced or widowed mother.

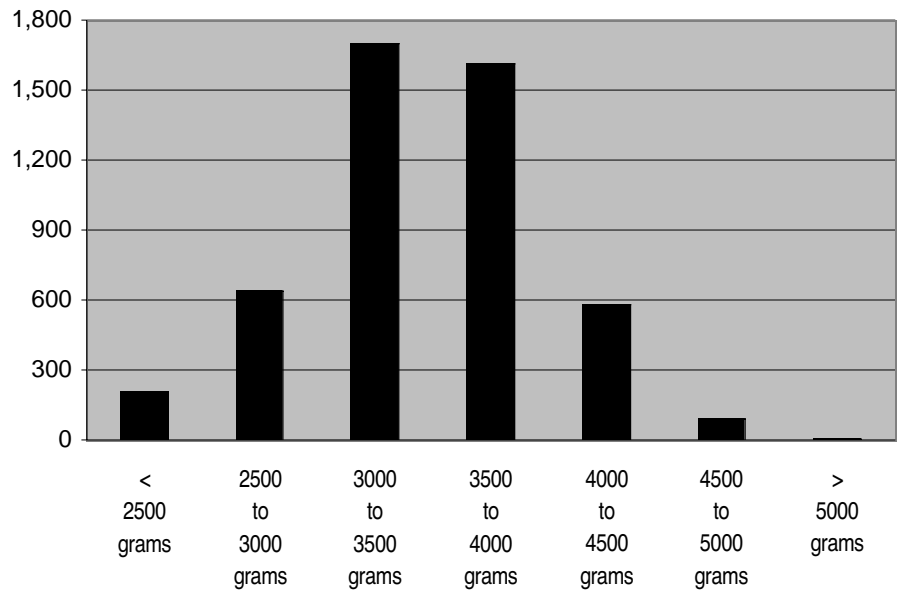


Note: 0.4% had under a 30 week pregnancy and 0.08% had 45 week or more pregnancy. Figures do not total 100% due to rounding.

Birthweight of the Newborn

The chart on the right shows the distribution of newborns by their birthweight. Of the 4,845 babies born in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995:

- * 207 or **4.3%** were under **2,500 grams**;
- * 642 or **13.3%** were from **2,500 to 3,000 grams**;
- * 1,703 or **35.1%** were from **3,000 to 3,500 grams**;
- * 1,614 or **33.3%** were from **3,500 to 4,000 grams**;
- * 582 or **12.0%** were from **4,000 to 4,500 grams**;
- * 90 or **1.9%** were from **4,500 to 5,000 grams**; and
- * 7 or **0.1%** or over **5,000 grams**.

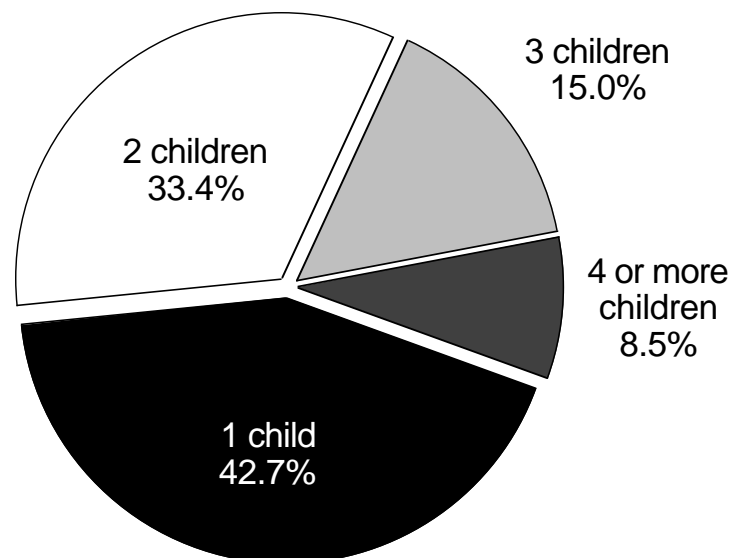

Total Children born to the Mother

Of the 4,845 births which occurred in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995:

- * 2,071 or 42.7% were from mothers with only one child;
- * 1,618 or 33.4% were from mothers with 2 children;
- * 728 or 15.0% were from mothers with 3 children;
- * 410 or 8.5% were from mothers with 4 or more children.



MARRIAGES IN THE YUKON: 1990 TO 1995

A Quick Look:

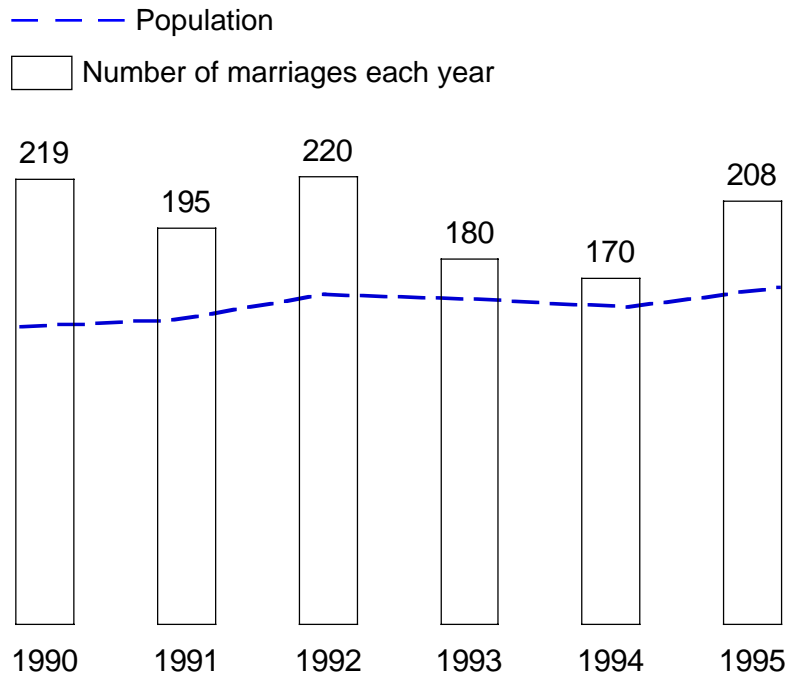
The bar graph to the right shows the number of marriages which occurred in the Yukon each year from 1990 to 1995. The dotted line represents the population of Yukoners 15 years of age and older * in the Yukon from 1990 to 1995.

The change in the number of marriages from year to year and in the 15 and over population is shown below:

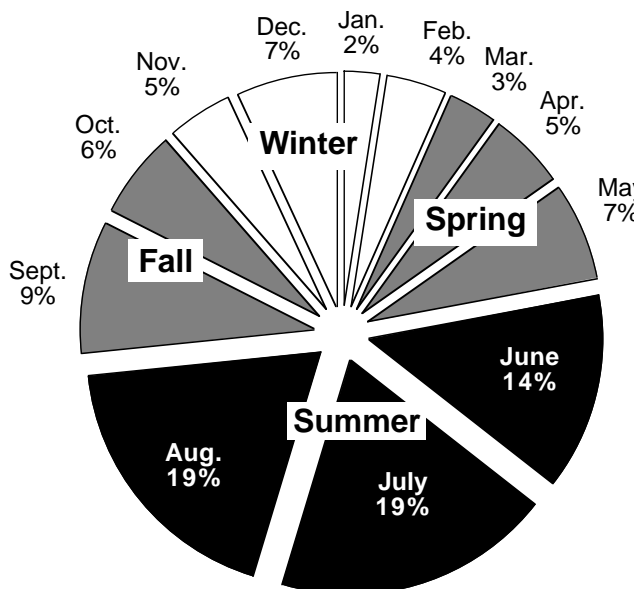
Except for 1991 when population increased while the number of marriages fell compared to 1990, in each year in the table above marriage and population changes were moving in parallel. For instance, in 1992 the number of marriages increased 12.8% while the population (of those 15 years of age and older) increased 6.5%.

** in order to make the comparison of population and marriages more meaningful children were not included in the population numbers.*



Marriages throughout the course of a typical year

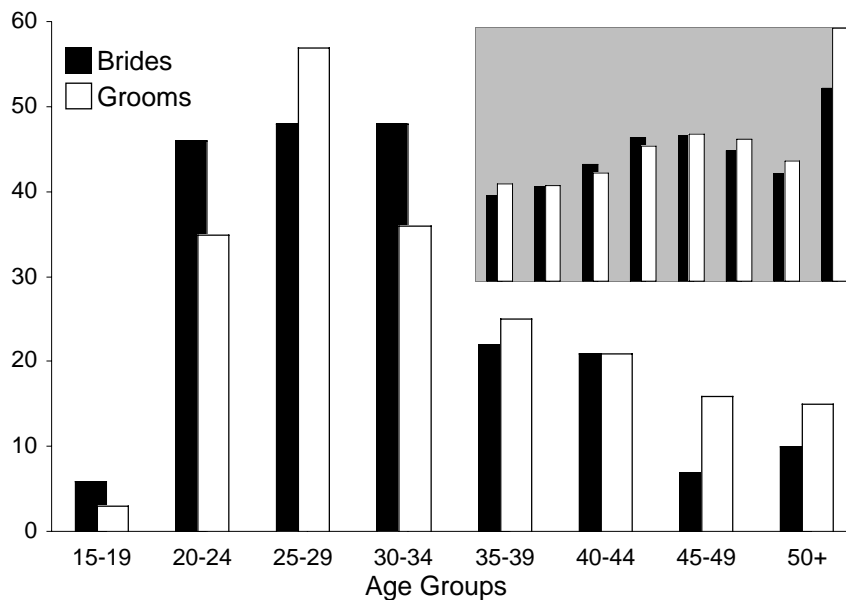
As the chart shows, the most popular month to get married is July with August a close second. January, in the “heart” of winter, does not rank high in the minds of those intent on marriage.



50% of the marriages in a typical year occur in the summer months of June, July and August. Fall: 15%; Winter: 16%; and spring 15%.

Age of Bride and Groom at time of Marriage: 1995

The graph at the right shows the number of brides (black columns) and the number of grooms (white columns) in each age category. The taller the column, the greater the number of brides or grooms. The tallest columns and therefore the greatest number of brides and grooms are in the three age categories “20-24”, “25-29” and “30-34”. With the exception of the “25-29” age group, the age groups younger than 35 have more brides than grooms and the age groups 35 and older have more grooms than brides (except the group “40-44” in which brides and grooms are equal).



There were 208 marriages in the Yukon in 1995:

**6 out of 10 grooms were between the ages of 20 and 34.*

**approximately 7 out of 10 brides were between the ages of 20 and 34.*

The shaded graph above shows the relative size of the same age groups displayed in the larger graph. Males are represented by the white columns and females by the black columns. It seems safe to say that if one has not married by the age of 34 the likelihood of marriage occurring thereafter decreases rapidly.

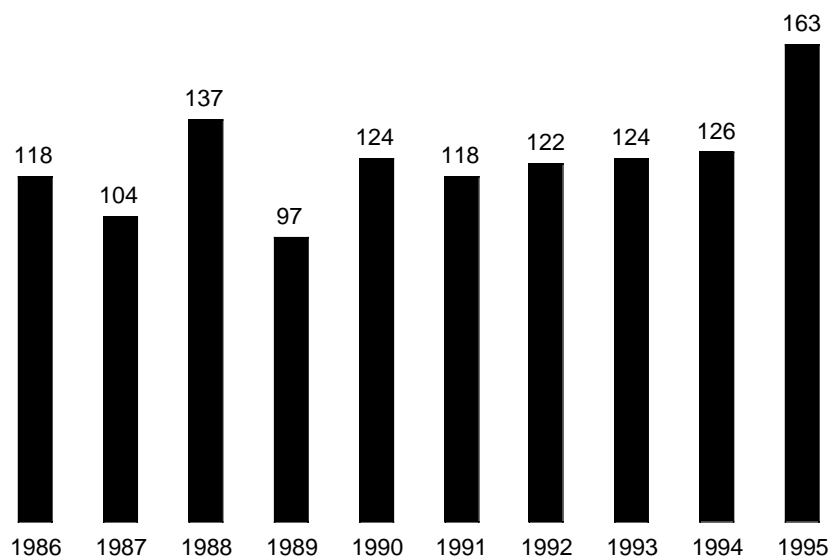
Marital Status of Bride and Groom Prior to Marriage: 1995

There is little difference between brides and grooms in terms of their marital status prior to marriage. The table to the right presents the figures on marital status for brides and grooms.

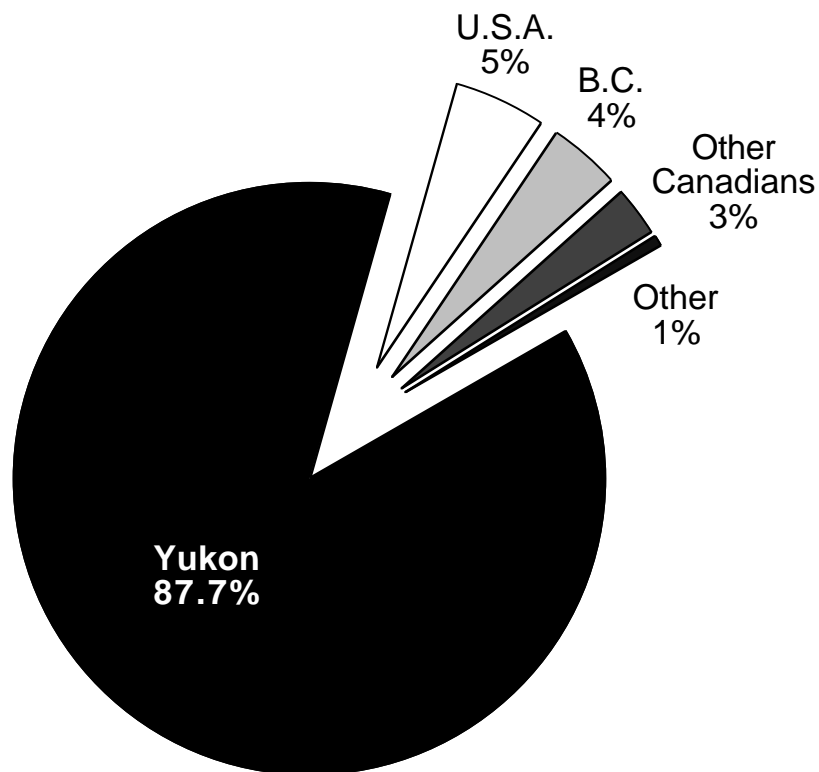

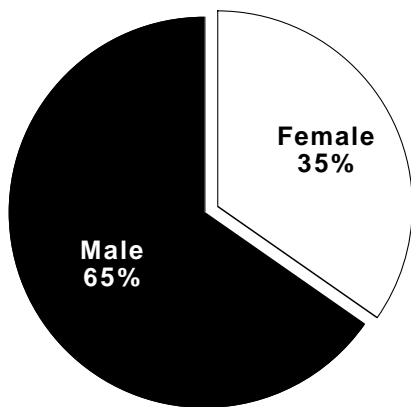
Residency of the Deceased

Not surprisingly, the highest percentage of deaths recorded in the Yukon were Yukoners (87.7% of all deaths recorded from 1986 to 1995 - 1,233). The graph to the right shows the breakdown of deaths by residency of the deceased.



Gender

As the pie chart below clearly shows, of all the deaths recorded in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995 (1,233), 65% were men and 35% were women. The Yukon's population in general consists of approximately 52% men and 48% women. Men compose a much higher percentage of deaths than would be expected (and women the opposite). This may be due in part to the nature of the work environment in the Yukon. One possible explanation would be that death by accident while at work may be more likely for men than for women in the Yukon.

The figures below show the breakdown of all deaths from 1986 to 1995 by marital status of the deceased:

The percentage of the deceased who were divorced at the time of their death has increased substantially from 6.8% in 1986 to 12.9% in 1995. Those widowed at the time of death has also increased (from 16.1% to 20.2% of all deaths) while the deceased who were single or who were married have both declined as a percentage of all deaths.

Age at Time of Death

The table below presents information which gives the percentage of all deaths which occurred by age group. As an example, of all the deaths in the Yukon which happened from 1986 to 1995, how many (as a percentage of the total) were 30 to 34 years old?

From 1986 to 1995 deaths recorded in the Yukon totalled 1,233. Of these deaths:

- * 38 or 3.1% of the 1,233 were Yukoners less than 1 year old;
- * 8 or 0.6% were 1 to 4 years old;
- * 14 or 1.1% were 5 to 14 years old;
- * 24 or 1.9% were 15 to 19 years old;
- * 52 or 4.2% were 20 to 24 years old;
- * 46 or 3.7% were 25 to 29 years old;
- * 42 or 3.4% were 30 to 34 years old;
- * 52 or 4.2% were 35 to 39 years old;
- * 124 or 10.1% were 40 to 44 years old;
- * 179 or 14.5% were 45 to 49 years old; and
- * 654 or 53.0% were 60 years old age or older.

Cause of Death

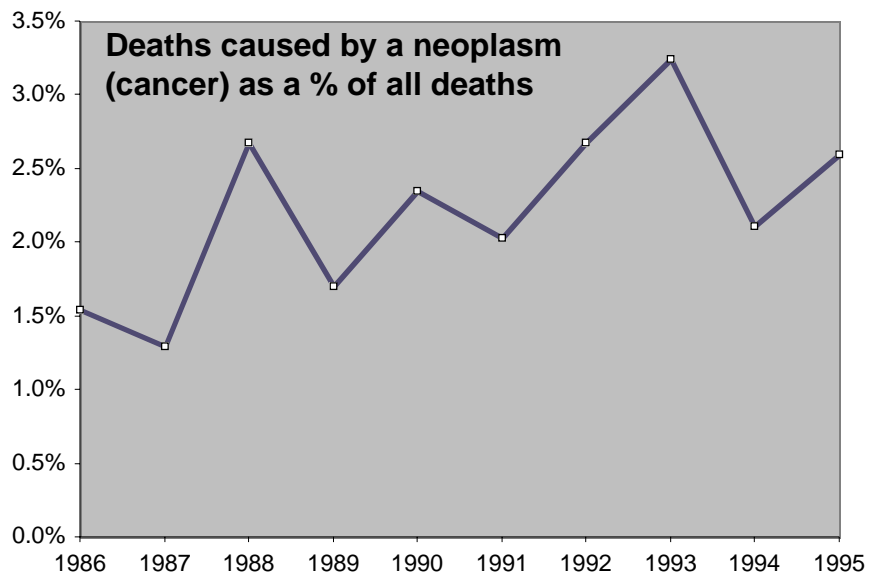
Of the 1,233 deaths recorded in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995, 321 or 26% were by accident or approximately 1 out of every four deaths. Each year from 1986 through to 1995 the percentage of deaths by accident varied as follows:

The following graph looks at neoplasms or cancers as a cause of death each year from 1986 to 1995 (as a percentage of all deaths each year):



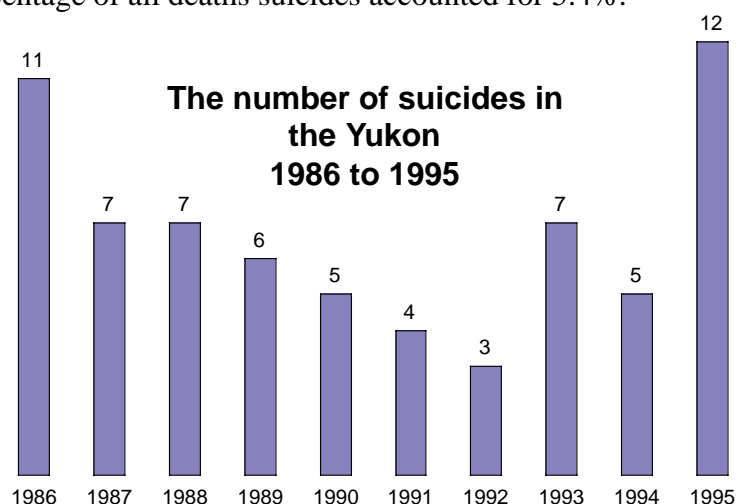
As the graph shows there is a general upward trend for cancer caused deaths although year-to-year variations can be dramatic.

Homicides (murders)

From 1986 to 1995 there were 16 homicides in the Yukon. As a percentage of all deaths from 1986 to 1995 in the Yukon homicides accounted for only 1.3%.

Suicides

From 1986 to 1995 there were 67 suicides in the Yukon. As a percentage of all deaths suicides accounted for 5.4%.



Yukoner Deaths by the Community of the Deceased

Of the 1,233 deaths recorded in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995, 1,081 were Yukoners. Of these 1,081 individuals, the largest number (681 or 63%) lived in Whitehorse.

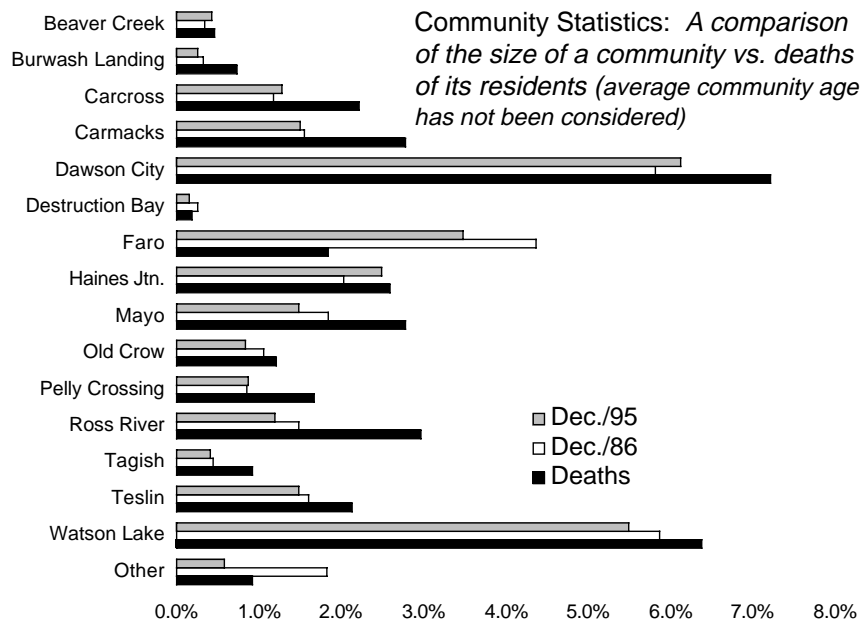

The following graph looks at deaths by the community the deceased lived in (as a percentage of all deaths in the Yukon) with a comparison of the population of the community in 1986 and 1995 (December of each year) as a

percentage of the total Yukon population:



Looking at the community of Faro, for instance, the graph shows 1) in the black column the number of deaths of Faro residents as a percentage of all the deaths in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995, 2) in the white column Faro's population as a percentage of the total Yukon population as of December, 1986 and 3) in the grey column Faro's population as a percentage of the total Yukon population as of December, 1995. Since the black column is much shorter than either of the other two columns deaths of Faro residents are much lower in number than would be expected given the size of the community's population in either 1986 or 1995. Looking at the community of Ross River the opposite trend can be seen. The black column,

representing the number of deaths of Ross River residents as a percentage of all the deaths in the Yukon from 1986 to 1995, is much higher than either of the other two population columns. Ross River has a much higher number of deaths than would be expected given the relative size of the community's population.

Whitehorse is not shown in the graph as its figures, if displayed in the same graph, would make the other smaller figures too small to be seen. Whitehorse had 63% of all the deaths in the Yukon compared with 69% and 72% of the Yukon's population in December of 1986 and December 1995 respectively.
