#### Applications must be received at Yukon Department of Environment by May 15, 2006

**Selection Process:** Your application will be reviewed by representatives of Yukon Department of Environment. Final selections will be made on the content of your Statement of Interest and the Nomination Form.

We'll let you know by early June if you've been accepted. If you have, we'll send you program schedules, a medical form to fill out, a list of things you need to bring, and information about camp fees.

**Camp Fees:** These are due after you've been accepted, so don't send anything with the application. (Alternate arrangements may be made for families unable to pay the full fee). Good luck with your application.

#### Frequently Asked Questions about the Conservation Action Team

#### What is the Conservation Action Team?

The Conservation Action Team is a summer camp program for Yukon youth. It offers outdoor adventure, learning about the environment, and hands-on conservation work. The Action Team is a mobile program, and participants travel to different parts of the Yukon.

#### Who can be in the Team?

Any Yukon boy or girl going into Grade 7-10 in September 2006 (i.e. in Grade 6-9 this spring) may apply. You also have to be cooperative and willing and physically capable of doing strenuous outdoor activity.

#### What will I be doing if I join the Team?

Adventure: Since Team activities will be all outdoors, you'll be learning how to camp safely and comfortably. You'll also learn and use outdoor skills such as canoeing, map and compass, first aid and photography. Each Team will do a wilderness trip in a remote area of the Yukon.

Environmental Education: Through fun, handson activities, you'll be learning about: ecology, wildlife management, plants and animals, mining, agriculture, forestry, hunting, fishing, trapping and First Nations views of the environment.

<u>Conservation Work:</u> Each team may take on a service project like assisting biologists with field work, doing cleanup or helping a farmer.

#### How long are the camps and when are they?

Cheechako (going into Grade 7-8) 8 days
Cheechako I: June 19 - 26, 2006
Cheechako II: July 10 - July 17, 2006
Sourdough (going into Grade 9-10) 10 days
Sourdough: August 7 - August 16, 2006
Each Team will have 11 participants (with a balance of boys and girls) and three qualified instructors.



#### Is there a camp fee?

Participants are required to pay a fee to help cover expenses. The cost is \$50.00 for Cheechako camps and \$100.00 for the Sourdough session. If you and your parents are unable to pay this amount, subsidies may be available!

#### Do I need lots of fancy equipment?

No. Tents, sleeping bags, raincoats, rain pants, backpacks and other equipment are supplied. All you'll need is warm, durable clothes, a few personal items, and some sturdy footwear. (We'll send you a list).

# I live in one of the communities: can I be in the program?

Of course! All eligible Yukon youth are encouraged to apply, from Old Crow to Watson Lake. In fact, some spaces on the Team are reserved for students outside Whitehorse. Sessions usually start in Whitehorse. Depending on our trip route, we may be able to pick you up along the way, or if the cost to get you to Whitehorse is especially high (eg. Old Crow) we may be able to help cover your travel costs.

#### Who will be leading the Team?

Each Team will have one experienced instructor and two summer student assistant instructors. They will have considerable outdoor experience and be fully certified in first aid and emergency rescue techniques. Instructors are chosen for their ability to lead a safe, fun and educational adventure program. Guest resource people will also be on hand from time-to-time to give instruction in their field of expertise.

#### How are Team members selected?

All applications are screened by Department of Environment employees. Selection is based on a Statement of Interest and the content of a Nomination Form.

#### Description: Activities, Responsibilities and Potential Risks

The **Conservation Action Team (CAT)** provides youth going into Grades 7-10 with an opportunity to learn about the Yukon's environment while experiencing outdoor adventure and participating in conservation-related projects.

Group leaders are responsible for the safety and educational elements of the program. CAT leaders have considerable outdoor experience and are qualified in first aid and emergency rescue techniques. The program will, however, involve travel through wilderness areas, remote from urban amenities and medical services. In case of serious accident, evacuation to a hospital may be delayed due to isolated conditions.

The CAT program uses land and water environments containing a number of potential hazards. Extremes of temperature and weather may be experienced. Mountain and forest travel may subject participants to possible rock falls, steep slopes and cliffs, and rough and broken terrain. The use of canoes, kayaks and small motor boats increase the chance of immersion and hypothermia. Students must use approved safety equipment and follow procedures outlined by instructors.

The program also incorporates activities related to the various uses of the environment, including hunting, trapping, fishing, mining, tourism, forestry, and agriculture. The traditional harvest and economic activities of Yukon First Nations people will be covered. Experiences related to these topics may include visits to fish camps, farms and mining operations. Instruction in the safe handling of firearms may be given. Students will only be able to use firearms under strict supervision.

Proper clothing and equipment are necessary to ensure safety and comfort. The Department is providing some high quality outerwear and equipment to minimize risk. Students are responsible for proper use and maintenance of supplied equipment.

Conservation work may be one element of the Conservation Action Team program. Should this work entail the use of potentially hazardous tools, the Team participant will be fully trained in its use.

Student cooperation is necessary for a safe and enjoyable program. Failure to comply with leaders' instructions may result in injury to the student or others. Team members who exhibit negative or uncooperative behaviour may endanger themselves and others, and may be sent home at the parent/guardian's expense.

Possession and/or consumption of alcohol, illegal drugs or tobacco is strictly forbidden. Participants are required to disclose all physical and psychological ailments and medications prior to the commencement of program activities.

#### **Dear Nominator:**

The Conservation Action Team (CAT) is an outdoor summer program for students going into Grades 7-10 (or equivalent level in home education). Team members will travel to different parts of the Yukon by van, canoe and foot. Activities will combine adventure (wilderness skills, canoe and backpacking trips), environmental education (reflecting a wide range of environmental values, from subsistence to mining), and conservation work.

The **Cheechako** program (Grades 7 & 8) is eight days in length and the **Sourdough** program (Grades 9 & 10) covers ten days. Participants must be able to meet the challenges of a physically demanding wilderness experience. They must also be prepared to be away from home and urban amenities for the duration of the Team program. Please consider these things while filling out this form.

For the purposes of confidentiality, please return the completed form in a separate sealed envelope. The applicant will include this with his/her completed forms.
