## **ROAD CONSTRUCTION AWARENESS MEASURES UNDERWAY**

WHITEHORSE – The Yukon government is taking proactive measures to alert the traveling public and tourists about construction zones along the north Alaska Highway that will improve road conditions.

"A number of initiatives have already been implemented and more are underway," Infrastructure Minister Scott Kent said. "We have run print ads of the summer road construction program and provided a schedule to Visitor Reception Centres (VRCs) in the territory. We also issue a daily road report via a telephone hot line, the government website and local radio stations."

A brochure entitled "Driving the Alaska Highway" is being re-issued. It contains road construction zones, information on the Shakwak project, directory listings and travel safety tips. The brochure is being distributed to the VRCs in Dawson Creek and Fort Nelson, B.C., in Tok, Alaska and throughout the Yukon. As well, department staff is working with the contractors to improve traffic control in construction zones and minimize the disruption to the extent possible.

Approximately 22 kilometres of new Bituminous Surface Treatments (BST) has been completed north of Haines Junction this year and a further 26 kilometres will be completed over the coming weeks, which will relieve the situation considerably.

In addition, three major construction projects involving 33 kilometres of the highway are currently under way. The reconstruction work involves rebuilding or relocating inferior sections of the original road. This construction is much more difficult than the southerly areas because of the presence of permafrost. Permafrost areas are subject to continuous thawing and heaving as ice within the underlying soil either melts or builds up. The disturbance caused by construction work can accelerate these changes.

"Reconstruction of the old highway means a better driving experience for tourists and Yukoners in the future," Kent said. "A certain amount of delay and inconvenience to travelers is inevitable, but it's only temporary. If normal conditions were expected on every kilometre of highway at all times, there would not be a construction program of any kind and our road conditions would never improve."

Most of the reconstruction of the north Alaska Highway, which began in 1992, has been completed. In addition, the Haines Road has been fully reconstructed. The Yukon portion of the Alaska Highway totals 958 kilometres, of which 804 kilometres are now fully reconstructed to a modern two-lane paved or BST-surfaced highway.
