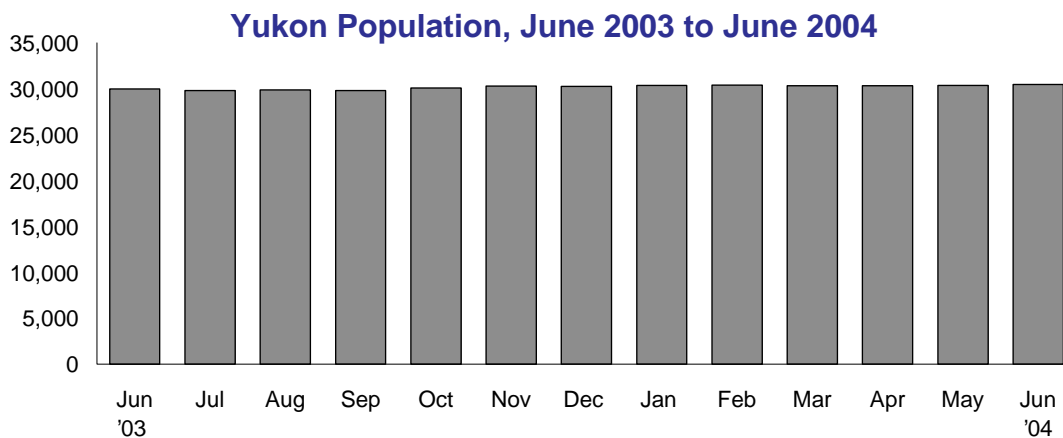


POPULATION REPORT June 2004

1 Monthly Yukon Population Estimates for 2003 & 2004

- Between June 2003 and June 2004, the population of the Yukon fluctuated from a low of 29,810 in September 2003 to a high of 30,469 in June 2004, a variation of 659 people.
- The average population of the Yukon over the last twelve months (July 2003 to June 2004) was 30,213. This is an increase of 249 persons, or 0.8%, from the 2002/'03 average of 29,964 for the same time period.
- Over the last twelve months, the Yukon's population has fluctuated, with a small increase from July to August 2003, followed by small decrease from August to September 2003. The population then increased until December, when it fell slightly. It increased again in January and February 2004, decreased in March and April, then increased again in May and June.

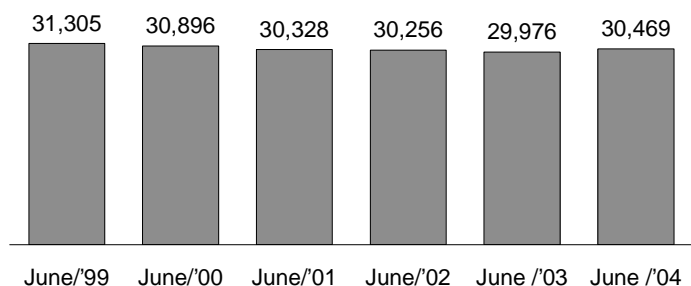

As of June 2004, the population of the Yukon was **30,469**. A year ago, in June 2003, the population was 29,976. From June 2003 to June 2004, the population increased 493, or 1.6%.

Whitehorse experienced an increase of 432 people or 1.9% over this period. Of the larger communities, Carcross had the largest percentage change for this period, a 6.3% increase, or a gain of 25 people.

- In June 2004, the Yukon's population consisted of 15,184 males (49.8%) and 15,285 females (50.2%).
- There were 5,893 people (19.4%) under 15 years of age, 22,526 (73.9%) between 15 and 64 years of age, and 2,050 people (6.7%) who were 65 years of age or older.

- The community with the highest proportion of its total population in the youngest age category (0-to-4) was Carmacks at 9.0%.
- The community with the highest proportion of its total population in the oldest age category (65+) was Tagish at 19.7%.

Community Populations by Month

- In the larger communities, Whitehorse's population increased by 1.9%, Dawson City increased 2.0%, Haines Junction decreased 3.6%, and in Watson Lake the population increased 0.5% from June 2003 to June 2004.
- As of January 2002, Marsh Lake is now being counted separately as a community. However, it should be noted that only residents whose mailing address is Marsh Lake are included in the community data for the purposes of this report. As of June 2004, there were 302 residents who received their mail at Marsh Lake, while the Census 2001 count for the area was 400 residents. Increases in Marsh Lake population figures are attributable in part to the changing of postal addresses from Whitehorse to Marsh Lake.

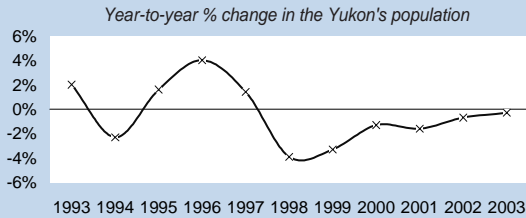

5 Historical Population Estimates

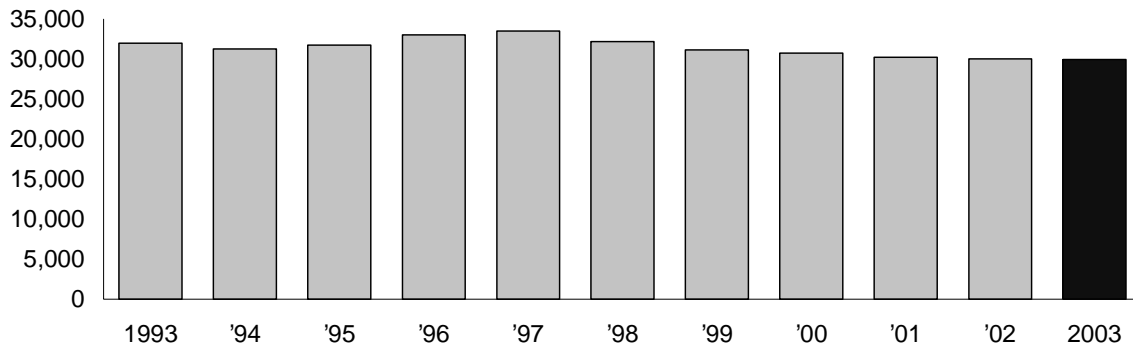
- From 1993 to 2003, the population of the Yukon decreased by 2,034 people (from 32,001 to 29,967). This represents an average annual growth rate of -0.6%. However, this growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. Rather, it has ranged from a high of 4.0% between '95 and '96 to a low of -3.9% between '97 and '98.

Population estimates are used by the public sector, private sector and the general public. The Yukon Bureau of Statistics produces population estimates twice a year. Figures for the months of January to June are released in July of the same year while population estimates for the months of July to December are released in January of the next year.

These population estimates are statistically based on the Yukon Health Care Registration file. The figures are sorted by postal codes and community codes. Users of this information should be aware that the community population includes not only the legally defined city limits, but also the population that lives in the immediately surrounding area.
