

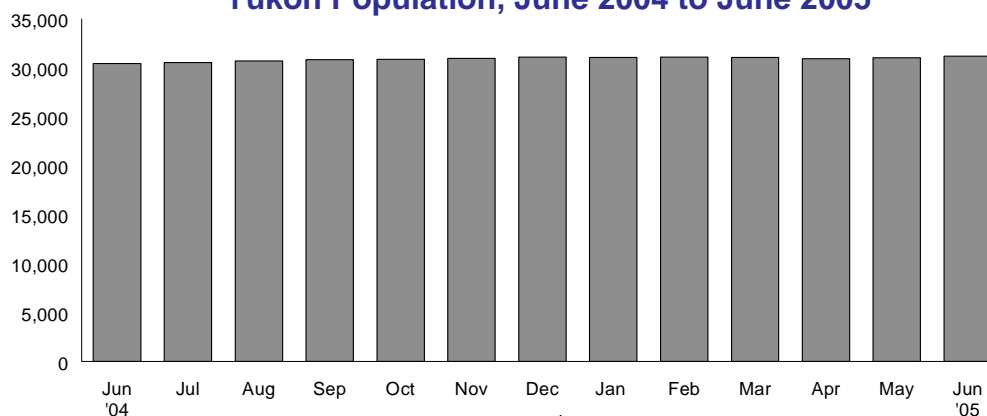

## Monthly Yukon Population Estimates for 2004 & 2005

- Between June 2004 and June 2005, the monthly population of the Yukon increased from a low of 30,469 in June 2004 to a high of 31,222 in June 2005, a variation of 753 people.
- The average population of the Yukon over the last twelve months (July 2004 to June 2005) was 30,970. This is an increase of 757 persons, or 2.5%, from the 2003/04 average of 30,213 for the same time period.
- Over the last twelve months, the Yukon's population has increased steadily in the latter half of 2004, followed by small decreases in the first part of 2005. The population then steadily increased in May and June.

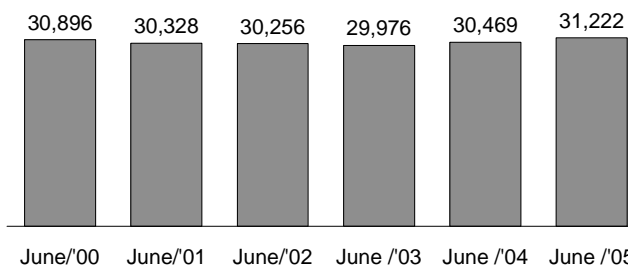
### Yukon Population, June 2004 to June 2005

### The Yukon's Population In June, 2000 to 2005

As of June 2005, the population of the Yukon was **31,222**. This is the highest population for any June in the last six years. This is also the second consecutive June population increase after six consecutive decreases in the June population after the Faro mine closure in 1997.

- In June 2005, the Yukon's population consisted of 15,639 males (50.1%) and 15,583 females (49.9%).
- There were 5,861 people (18.8%) under 15 years of age, 23,163 (74.2%) between 15 and 64 years of age, and 2,198 people (7.0%) who were 65 years of age or older.

## Community Populations by Month

- In the larger communities, Whitehorse's population increased by 2.6%, Dawson City increased 1.4%, Watson Lake's population decreased 2.0%, and in Haines Junction the population increased 5.8% from June 2004 to June 2005.
- As of January 2002, Marsh Lake is now being counted separately as a community. However, it should be noted that only residents whose mailing address is Marsh Lake are included in the community data for the purposes of this report. As of June 2005, there were 336 residents who received their mail at Marsh Lake, while the Census 2001 count for the area was 400 residents. Increases in Marsh Lake population figures are attributable in part to the changing of postal addresses from Whitehorse to Marsh Lake.

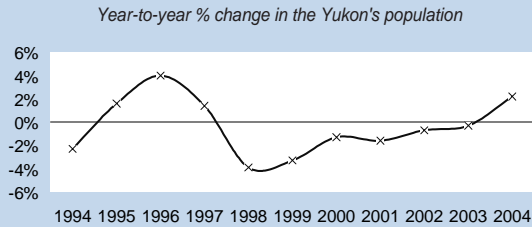

## 5 Historical Population Estimates

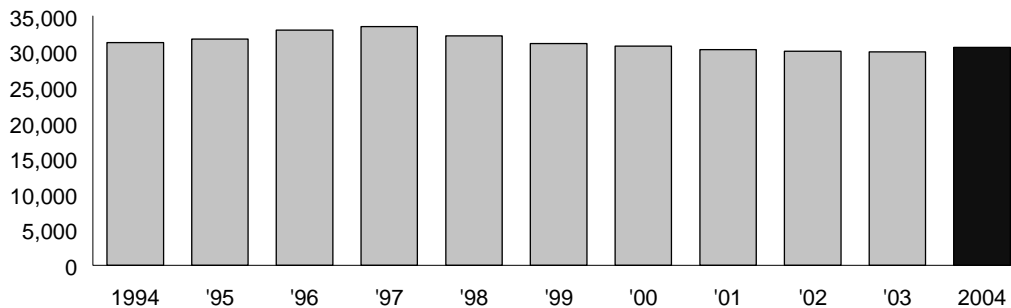
- From 1994 to 2004, the population of the Yukon decreased by 649 people (from 31,276 to 30,627). This represents an average annual growth rate of -0.2%. However, this growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. Rather, it has ranged from a high of 4.0% between '95 and '96 to a low of -3.9% between '97 and '98.

Population estimates are used by the public sector, private sector and the general public. The Yukon Bureau of Statistics produces population estimates twice a year. Figures for the months of January to June are released in July of the same year while population estimates for the months of July to December are released in January of the next year.

These population estimates are statistically based on the Yukon Health Care Registration file. The figures are sorted by postal codes and community codes. Users of this information should be aware that the community population includes not only the legally defined city limits, but also the population that lives in the immediately surrounding area.
