

### December 2002

### Monthly Yukon Population Estimates for 2001 & 2002

- Between December 2001 and December 2002, the population of the Yukon fluctuated from a high of 30,418 in December 2001 to a low of 29,960 in December 2002, a variation of 458 people.
- The average population of the Yukon over the last twelve months (from January 2002 to December 2002) was 30,063. This is a decrease of 210 persons, or 0.7%, from the 2001 average of 30,273 for the same period.
- Over the last twelve months, the Yukon's population fluctuated, with decreases at the first of the year, followed by increases in early summer and then a slow decrease towards the end of the year.


As of December 2002, the population of the Yukon was **29,960**. A year ago, in December 2001, the population was 30,418. From December 2001 to December 2002, the population decreased 458, or 1.5%.

Of the larger communities (greater than 400 people), Teslin experienced the largest percentage change when its population decreased from 437 in December '01 to 401 in December '02 (a decrease of 36, or 8.2%).

- In December 2002, the Yukon's population consisted of 14,927 males (49.8%) and 15,033 females (50.2%).
- There were 6,010 people (20.1%) under 15 years of age, 22,045 (73.6%) between 15 and 64 years of age, and 1,905 people (6.4%) who were 65 years of age or older.

# 4 Community Populations, by Month

- In the larger communities, Whitehorse's population decreased by 1.8%, Dawson City decreased 2.1%, Haines Junction increased 3.6%, and in Watson Lake the population decreased 2.4% from December 2001 to December 2002.
- As of January 2002, Marsh Lake is now being counted separately as a community. However, it should be noted that only residents whose mailing address is Marsh Lake are included in the community data for the purposes of this report.
   As of December 2002, there are 222 residents at Marsh Lake.



## 5 Historical Population Estimates


• From 1992 to 2002, the population of the Yukon decreased by 1,302 people (from 31,365 to 30,063). This is an annual average growth rate of -0.4%. This growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. Rather, it has ranged from a high of 4.0% between '95 and '96 to a low of -3.9% between '97 and '98.

### **Average Annual Yukon Population, 1992 to 2002**



Population estimates are used by the public sector, private sector and the general public. The Yukon Bureau of Statistics produces population estimates twice a year. Figures for the months of January to June are released in July of the same year while population estimates for the months of July to December are released in January of the next year.

These population estimates are statistically based on the Yukon Health Care Registration file. The figures are sorted by postal codes and community codes. Users of this information should be aware that the community population includes not only the legally defined city limits, but also the population that lives in the immediately surrounding area.
