

### Monthly Yukon Population Estimates for 2004 & 2005

- Between December 2004 and December 2005, the monthly population of the Yukon increased from a low of 30,960 in April 2005 to a high of 31,587 in December 2005, a variation of 627 people.
- The average population of the Yukon over the last twelve months (January to December 2005) was 31,240. This is an increase of 613 persons, or 2.0%, from the 2004 average of 30,627.
- Over the last twelve months, the Yukon's population has dipped slightly in March and April. The population then increased each month, reaching a high 31,587 in December. This is the highest population figure of any month in almost 7 years. In January 1999, the Yukon's population was 31,621.


### Yukon Population, December 2004 to December 2005

### The Yukon's Population In December, 2000 to 2005

As of December 2005, the population of the Yukon was **31,587**. This is the highest population for any December in the last seven years. This is also the third consecutive December population increase after five consecutive decreases in the December population.

## Community Populations by Month

- In the larger communities, Whitehorse's population increased by 1.3%, Dawson City increased 0.9%, Watson Lake's population decreased 0.2%, and in Haines Junction the population increased 4.4% from December 2004 to December 2005.
- As of January 2002, Marsh Lake is being counted separately as a community. However, it should be noted that only residents whose mailing address is Marsh Lake are included in the community data for the purposes of this report. As of December 2005, there were 364 residents who received their mail at Marsh Lake, while the Census 2001 count for the area was 400 residents. Increases in Marsh Lake population figures are attributable in part to the changing of postal addresses from Whitehorse to Marsh Lake.



## Historical Population Estimates


- Comparing 1995 to 2005, the population of the Yukon decreased by 538 people (from 31,778 to 31,240). This represents an average annual growth rate of -0.2%. However, this growth has not occurred evenly from year to year. Rather, it has ranged from a high of 4.0% between '95 and '96 to a low of -3.9% between '97 and '98.

Population estimates are used by the public sector, private sector and the general public. The Yukon Bureau of Statistics produces population estimates twice a year. Figures for the months of January to June are released in July of the same year while population estimates for the months of July to December are released in January of the next year.

These population estimates are statistically based on the Yukon Health Care Registration file. The figures are sorted by postal codes and community codes. Users of this information should be aware that the community population includes not only the legally defined city limits, but also the population that lives in the immediately surrounding area.
