- provide land applications, copies of maps and lists of available lots for sale in Whitehorse and the communities;
- assist with the land application process, policies and procedures;
- administer the Yukon Mining Incentives program, the Assay Coupon program and the Mineral Exploration Tax Credit;
- publish and distribute new geoscience information;
- issue permits to harvest timber;
- issue and maintain mineral titles;
- sell claim maps;
- house the Yukon's largest collection of scientific resources (EMR Library);
- issue and inspect timber and burning permits;
- work to promote northern pipelines;
- support the oil and gas industry through education and training;
- research mitigation and the prevention of environmental problems related to mining and mineral exploration (MERG); and
- run the annual Master Gardener's course.
