
# Census '96

# Occupied Private Dwellings

The following statistics are from the 1996 Census of Canada which occurred on May 14, 1996.

### 1 – Highlights

- One third (33.4%) of all occupied private dwellings in the Yukon were constructed between 1971 and 1980, and the majority (53.4%) of all dwellings only require regular maintenance.
- ◆ In 1996, 58.5% of occupied private dwellings in the Yukon were owned, 35.3% were rented and 6.2% were band housing.
- ◆ The average number of rooms in occupied private dwellings in the Yukon was 5.7, with the largest percentage (20.1%) of dwellings containing five rooms.
- In 1996, the average value of an owner-occupied private dwelling in the Yukon was \$138,234.
- Of all the owner-occupied private dwellings in the Yukon, 29.4% were valued between \$150,000 and \$199,999.





#### Notes

**Private Dwelling:** Refers to a separate set of living quarters with a private entrance either from the outside or from a common hall, lobby, vestibule or stairway inside the building. The entrance to the dwelling must be one that can be used without passing through the living quarters of someone else. The dwelling must meet the three conditions necessary for year-round living:

- (a) a source of heat or power (as evidenced by chimneys, power lines, oil or gas pipes or meters, generators, woodpiles, electric heaters, heating pumps, solar heating panels etc.);
- (b) access to a source of drinking water throughout the year (as evidenced by faucets, drain pipes, wells, water pumps, etc.);
- (c) an enclosed space that provides shelter from the elements (as evidenced by complete and enclosed walls and roof, and doors and windows that provide protection from wind, rain and snow).

Occupied Private Dwelling: Refers to a private dwelling in which a person or a group of persons are permanently residing. Also included are private dwellings whose usual residents are temporarily absent on Census Day. Unless otherwise specified, all data in housing reports are for occupied private dwellings rather than unoccupied private dwellings or dwellings occupied solely by foreign and/or temporary residents.
