## Census ‘96

## Education

## 1- Highlights

- The number of Yukoners aged 15 and older with less than a grade nine education declined to 1,320 in 1996 from 1,420 in 1991 and from 1,900 in 1986.
- The percentage of the Yukon's population aged 15 and older with a university degree was $14.5 \%$ in 1996. This figure is an increase of 2.0 percentage points from the 1991 Census ( $12.5 \%$ ) and an increase of 4.8 percentage points from the 1986 Census $(9.7 \%)$.
- According to the 1996 Census $54 \%$ of Canada's Aboriginal population aged 15 and over had not received a high school diploma.
- In the 1996 Census, $35 \%$ of Canada's non-Aboriginal population aged 15 and older had not received a high school diploma.
- Aboriginal people aged 20 to 29 with a postsecondary degree or diploma (university or non-university) increased from $19 \%$ in 1981 to $23 \%$ in 1996 while the proportion of the non-Aboriginal population aged 20 to 29 with a postsecondary degree or diploma (university or non-university) increased from $37 \%$ to $47 \%$ during the same period.
- Census 1996 data shows that it's becoming more difficult to find a job without a high school diploma. The unemployment rate for persons aged 25 to 34 without a high school diploma increased from $10 \%$ in 1981 to $18 \%$ in 1996.
- School attendance in the Yukon for persons aged 15 years and over decreased 2.3 percentage points from 1991 to 1996.
