Population by Age and Sex

The following statistics are from the 1996 Census of Canada which occurred on May 14, 1996.

1 - Highlights


- The population of the Yukon, as enumerated by the 1996 Census on May 14, 1996, shows an aging population when compared to the 1991 Census. The largest percentage increase (39.6%) was in the 45-49 year old age group. This same age group also has the highest percentage change for Canada at 27.6%.

- In 1996, 4.4% of the Yukon's population was 65 years or older, while in 1991, 3.9% of the population was 65 years or older.
In 1996, 12.2% of Canada's population was aged 65 or older. In 1991 this same age group composed 11.6% of the population.

COMMUNITY FEATURE

Of all Yukon communities with a population under 400 the Ibex Valley has had the most significant growth from the 1991 Census to the 1996 Census at 35.4%. In 1991, the population of the Ibex Valley was 240, and in 1996 it was 325. The 10-14 years of age category increased in number from 15 to 40 which is equal to an increase of 166.7%.

Notes For Using Census Figures

Differences between the population count from the 1996 Census and the count from the Yukon Health Care system are due to three factors:

- 1) The Census is a "de jure" population count, ie., it includes only those individuals who consider themselves fully resident in the Yukon. Figures from the Yukon Health Care system are a "current" or "de facto" population count, i.e., the figures include those individuals who are in the Yukon at least long enough to register for Health Care or to be employed.
- 2) Census figures under enumerate population counts simply because it is virtually impossible to ensure 100% coverage of a particular area. For example, the 1991 Census under enumerated the Yukon's population by 4.06%.
- 3) The 1996 Census and the Yukon Health Care population counts use different methods of locating individuals within the Yukon. The Census is based on enumeration areas whereas the Yukon Health Care estimates locate individuals by postal code.
