The following statistics are from the 2001 Census of Canada which occurred on **May 15, 2001.**

Immigrants

In 2001, the percentge of people in the Yukon who were immigrants was 10.6% (3,020 people). This figure has remained fairly constant since the 1991 census.

Age


The largest portion of immigrants who came to the Yukon in 2001 were from the United States (19.2%), followed by the United Kingdom.

In 2001, it was reported that the majority of immigrants to the Yukon who were surveyed were between the ages of 20 and 39 (55.0%)





In 2001, the largest portion of the Yukon's immigrant population was born in the United States (19.2%), followed by the United Kingdom (18.2%), Germany (13.2%), Philippines (5.1%), Netherlands (3.8%), People's Republic of China (3.6%), and Switzerland (3.5%).

There were 3020 immigrants living in the Yukon in 2001. Of these,15.3% immigrated to Canada before 1961, 19.8% immigrated between 1961 and 1970, 18.5% immigrated between 1971 and 1980, 20.6% immigrated between 1981 and 1990, 13.2% immigrated between 1991 and 1995, 5.4% immigrated between 1996 and 1997, and 7.1% immigrated between 1998 and 2001.

Notes

Immigrant Population: Refers to people who are, or have been, landed immigrants in Canada. A landed immigrant is a person who are, or have been, landed immigrants in Canada. A landed immigrant is a person who has been granted the right to live in Canada permanently by immigration authorities. Some immigrants have resided in Canada for a number of years, while others are recent arrivals. Most immigrants are born outside Canada, but a small number were born in Canada.

Non-Immigrant Population: Refers to people who are Canadians citizens by birth. Although most were born in Canada, a small number were born outside Canada to Canadian parents.
