

Labour Market



Highlights

The following statistics are from the 2001 Census of Canada which occurred on **May 15, 2001**.



Age Groups

The proportion of individuals in the labour force ages 15 to 24 has decreased from 17.4% in 1991 to 15.8% in 2001. The percentage of people ages 55 to 64 has increased to 9.7% in 2001 from 6.7% in 1991.

Industry

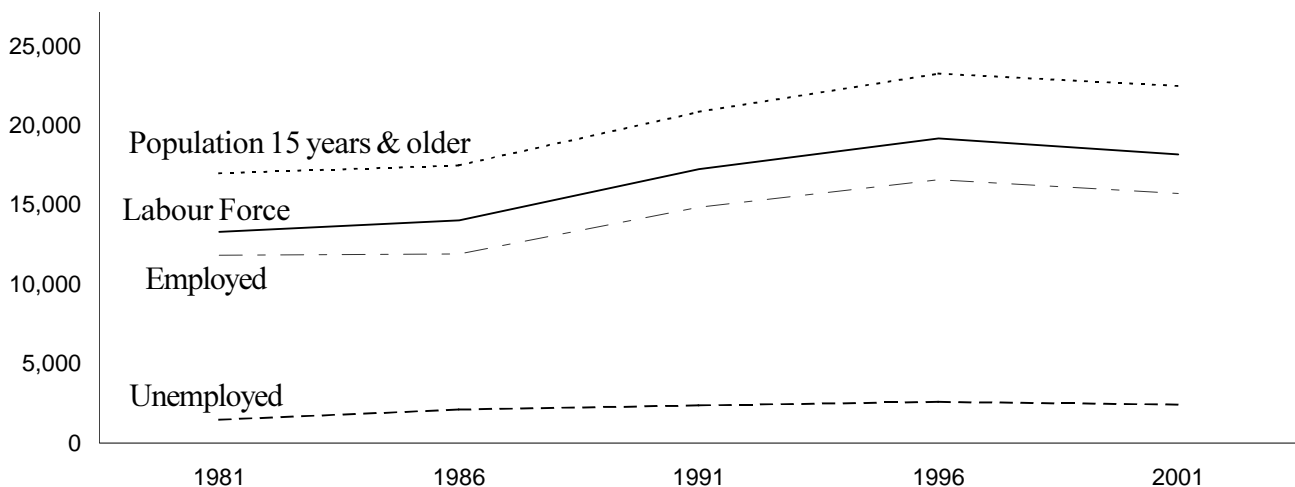
The public administration industry employed the largest portion of the Yukon's labour force in 2001 with 3,730 people (21.1%), followed by retail trade (1,945 people, 11.0%)

Occupation

The occupation division employing the largest portion of the labour force in the Yukon were the sales and service occupations (22.9%), followed by the business, finance and administration occupations (17.7%).

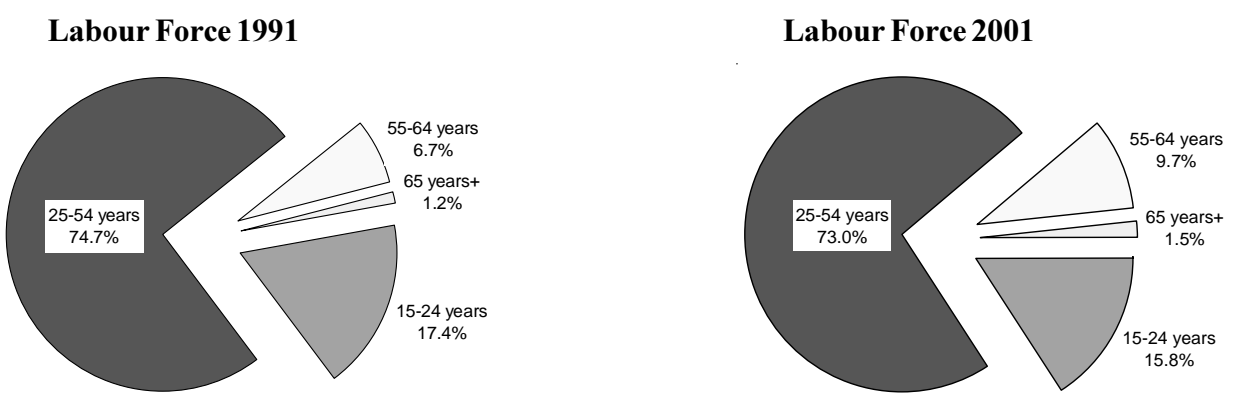
Labour Force, Employed, Unemployed and Population 15 Years and Over, Yukon, 1981 - 2001 Censuses
