## **Highlights**

The following statistics are from the 2001 Census of Canada which occurred on **May 15, 2001.** 

### **Mother Tongue**

In the Yukon, English is the mother tongue of 24,945 people (87.0%) and French is the mother tongue of 875 people (3.1%). In Canada, English is the mother tongue of 59.3% of the population while French is 22.1% of the population.


### Language Spoken At Home

Official Languages

89.4% of Yukoners reported knowing only English, 0.2% knew only French, and 10.2% knew both English and French.

In 2001, the majority of Yukoners spoke only English at home (91.5%). 0.7% of the population spoke only French at home.





Additional statistics from the 2001 Census are currently available, including population, dwelling counts, age, sex, marital status, mobility, migration, citizenship, immigration, ethnic origin, aboriginal peoples, labour force activity, occupation, place of work, mode of transportation, unpaid work, school attendance, education, highest level of schooling and earnings. As well, on May 13, statistics were released on religion, family income and shelter costs.

Please Note: The majority of figures shown in this publication have been subjected to a confidentiality procedure known as "random rounding" in which counts are rounded to a multiple of "5".
