2.	The Permittee shall not conduct this Land Use Operation on any lands not designated in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Engineer.	PLANS

 - c) all the methods for contacting the above person(s).
- The Permittee shall contact the Land Use Inspector not less than 5 days prior to start-up during each season during which work will be undertaken; including changes to equipment, contractors or method of operation.

4. The Permittee shall supply a Campsite Development Plan at least 5 days prior to camp establishment. The Permittee shall clearly mark with stakes or flags the REPORT location of any spill of any petroleum and forthwith report PETROLEUM the time, manner, location, amount and type of spill to the SPILLS Engineer and Environmental Protection Service. (Environmental Protection Service can be contacted by Phone (867)-667-7244, or Fax (867) 667-7962 in Whitehorse, Yukon). 2. The Permittee shall not place any petroleum fuel storage FUEL containers within 30 metres of the normal high water mark **BY STREAM** of any stream. 3. The Permittee shall not allow petroleum products to spread to FUEL surrounding lands or into water bodies. CONTAINMENT

4. The Permittee shall dispose of all combustible waste petroleum products as per the Special Waste Regulations of the Yukon Environment Act.
