Thank you for your call Monday afternoon regarding comments to the Forest Development Plan for the Quill Creek Bench Harvest Planning Area in the Haines Junction Area. Your comments will be considered in the environmental assessment screening report that the Forest Management Branch is currently conducting. I have provided an overview of your comments; please verify them with a return email.

Block 7J

1. No concerns with Block 7J.

Block 7H

1. Concerns that Block 7H is too large and too close to Crescent Lake and the Kathleen River.
2. Concerns that the visual quality and wilderness values of your property will be affected by Block 7H.
3. Concerns that the most easterly proposed road (marked P on the map) could promote vandalism and lack of privacy to your property.
4. Concerns that the 2wd road (marked L on the map) could promote vandalism and lack of privacy to your property.
5. Recommend that the area of 7H be reduced by relocating the most easterly proposed boundary. The boundary should be relocated to the west side of the cat trail and the most easterly proposed road in Block 7H should be removed.

General Comments:

The most northerly marked private lot is shown in the wrong place-it actually is located adjacent to Granite Creek on the east side of Crescent Lake.
