New Brunswick	New Brunswick increases its score over previous years with greater depth of support for energy efficiency. British Columbia	British Columbia is not funding energy efficiency initiatives to the extent it could. The commitment to regulating energy efficiency is strong. Very effective programs delivered by the utilities counterbalance the lack of new activities by the government.	B	B+	B-	C-	D-

PEI	PEI's efforts are impressive and the province is commended for increasing its score. Existing programs are shored up by ambitious plans for new programs and undertakings including the creation of a policy infrastructure that supports and promotes energy efficiency.	B-	C	C-	D	D
Saskatchewan	Through the establishment of a new energy efficiency office and strong collaboration with Sask Power, Saskatchewan made significant gains this year. Also noted are solid efforts with its own buildings and with the Saskatchewan Housing Corporation.	C	D	F	F	D-
Ontario	A strong Energy Efficiency Act represents the cornerstone of activities in Ontario. The government does have ambitious plans through the creation of a Conservation Secretariat and the Premier is formally supporting a new “conservation culture” in Ontario. Alberta	Alberta has started implementing its “Climate Change Plan for Action” and is working with municipalities to deliver solutions on a variety of fronts. However, results have been thin to date and given Alberta’s economic strength, much more can be done.	D+	C+	C-	C	D
Nunavut	This is the first year that Nunavut has submitted to the Report Card. The CEEA notes early stage activities in support of energy efficiency and the territory's support for broad scale environmental initiatives. Newfoundland & Labrador	The government’s efforts continue to focus almost exclusively on its own facilities. Positive results from these undertakings have not been expanded to the rest of the economy. Newfoundland and Labrador is not meeting the minimum expected capability.	F	D	D+	C	C+
Northwest Territories	The Territories failed to report this year, however the CEEA notes the continuation of a number of strong initiatives including the Climate Change Centre.
