DANGEROUS GOODS TRANSPORTATION ACT

Pursuant to section 28 of the Dangerous Goods Transportation Act, the Commissioner in Executive Council orders as follows:

1. The annexed Multiple Collection Regulations are hereby made.

MULTIPLE COLLECTION REGULATIONS

Interpretation

1. In these Regulations,

"carrier" means a carrier as defined in section 1.2 of the Federal Regulations; «transporteur»

"consignee" means a consignee as defined in section 1.2 of the Federal Regulations; «destinataire»

"consignor" means a consignor as defined in section 1.2 of the Federal Regulations; «expéditeur»

"Federal Regulations" means the Transportation of Dangerous Goods Regulations (Canada),

SOR/85/77 of January 18, 1985, as amended from time to time; «règlement fédéral»

"manifest" means the manifest as set out in Form 1 of Schedule IV of the Federal Regulations; «manifeste»

"Minister" means the Minister as defined in the Environment Act: «ministre»

"multiple consignor form" means the multiple collection record as set out in Form 1 of Schedule I of these regulations; «formulaire pour expéditeurs multiples»

"special waste" means a special waste as defined in the Environment Act. «déchets spéciaux»

Application

- 2. Notwithstanding s. 3(1) of the Dangerous Goods Transportation Regulations, these regulations apply to all handling, offering for transport and transporting of special waste, as it relates to the multiple collection of special waste, whether or not for hire or reward, within the Yukon.
- 3. These regulations do not apply to the handling, offering for transport or transporting of special waste
- (a) solely within the boundaries of property owned, leased or controlled by persons who generate, carry or store special waste; or
- (b) as described in section 2.3 of the Federal Regulations.

Consignor Identification Number

- 4. No person shall offer for transport a special waste unless
- (a) she or he first obtains a consignor identification number from the Minister; and
- (b) provides this number to every carrier to whom a load is offered for consignment.
- 5.(1) Every consignor who consigns special waste as a part of a multiple collection shall keep a record of the number of the accompanying manifest for at least two years.

Loads from multiple consignors

- 6.(1) Where a carrier collects special waste of the same type from two or more consignors to establish a single bulk load, the carrier may use one manifest for each single bulk load to be transported and shall
- (a) complete a multiple consignor form in Form 1 of Schedule I, and
- (b) prior to transferring a bulk load to a consignee,
- (i) complete Parts A and B of the manifest and enter the word "multiple" for the company name and the shipping site address in Part A, and
- (ii) distribute copies of the manifest and the multiple consignor form, as indicated on the multiple consignor form.
 - (2) On delivery of the shipment and documents by the carrier, the consignee shall
- (a) complete Part C of the manifest and retain for a period of two years,
- (b) retain copy C of the multiple consignor form for a period of at least two years, and
- (c) send a copy of the manifest and of the multiple consignor form to each consignor listed on the multiple consignor form.
- (3) On completion of the shipment, the carrier shall retain copy 2 of the manifest and copy B of the multiple consignors from for a period of at least two years.
- (4) Each consignor listed on the multiple consignor form shall retain the copies of the completed manifest and the multiple consignor form received from the consignee, for a period of at least two years.
- 7. If a consignor does not receive from the consignee a copy of the manifest acknowledging receipt of the special waste within 10 clear days of the day the initial carrier collected the special waste, the consignor shall
- (a) make all reasonable efforts to ascertain the whereabouts of the special waste; and
- (b) within a further five clear days provide the Minister with a copy of the manifest and a covering letter explaining the efforts taken to locate the special waste and the results of those efforts.
