PREAMBLE

For items 1 to 18

On 13 May 2005, the Commission issued *Broadcasting Public Notice CRTC 2005-48*, calling for applications for a broadcasting licence to carry on a radio programming undertaking to serve Calgary, Alberta.

As well, on 14 July 2005, the Commission issued *Broadcasting Public Notice CRTC* 2005-67, calling for applications for a broadcasting licence to carry on a radio programming undertaking to serve Lethbridge, Alberta.

Further to both calls, the Commission has received a significant number of applications for licences to serve the aforementioned markets (Items 1 to 18). A number of these applications are proposing to use similar frequencies and are therefore technically mutually exclusive.

a) Calgary market technically mutually exclusive applications:
