

Broadcasting Decision CRTC 2005-78

Rogers Broadcasting Limited

Vernon and Enderby, British Columbia

Application 2004-0763-6 Public Hearing in the National Capital Region 10 January 2005

CKIZ-FM Vernon – New transmitter in Enderby

- 1. The Commission **approves** the application by Rogers Broadcasting Limited (Rogers) to amend the broadcasting licence for the radio programming undertaking CKIZ-FM Vernon, in order to operate a transmitter in Enderby, British Columbia.
- 2. The new transmitter will operate at 93.9 MHz (channel 230LP) with an effective radiated power of 10 watts.
- 3. The Commission did not receive any interventions in connection with this application.
- 4. Rogers stated that Enderby residents have been unable to receive CKIZ-FM's signal since the conversion of the AM station in Vernon to the FM band, which was approved in *Conversion of AM radio station CJIB to FM*, Decision CRTC 2001-184, 22 March 2001.
- 5. The Department of Industry (the Department) has advised the Commission that, while this application is conditionally technically acceptable, it will only issue a broadcasting certificate when it has determined that the proposed technical parameters will not create any unacceptable interference with aeronautical NAV/COM services.
- 6. The Commission reminds the licensee that, pursuant to section 22(1) of the *Broadcasting Act*, this authority will only be effective when the Department notifies the Commission that its technical requirements have been met, and that a broadcasting certificate will be issued.
- 7. Given that the technical parameters approved in this decision are for a low-power unprotected FM service, the Commission also reminds the licensee that it will have to select another frequency if the Department so requires.
