1. General —Continued

- (C) An interconnecting circuit with trunk side access may be arranged to provide for the routing of toll free (800/888...) calls destined for the IXC's network. This arrangement is available for Access Tandem connections only and may use MF or CCS7 signalling.
- (D) When CCS7 signaling is requested, CCS7 links are required. CCS7 links refer to the DS-0 channels between ILEC designated gateway Signaling Transfer Points (STPs) and the IXC's STPs or between the ILEC's gateway STPs and the IXC's switch(es). This interconnecting arrangement may be provided by, subject to availability of suitable facilities, SaskTel or another designated company as determined by network design requirements to carry CCS7 signaling information associated with interconnecting circuits with trunk side access which connect SaskTel to the IXC for the purpose of call set-up and take down.
- (E) The facility over which interconnecting circuits with trunk side access and CCS7 links are provided is furnished at the rates and charges specified in the Digital Private Line item of SaskTel's General Tariff.
- (F) In addition to the service charges associated with 1 (E) above, service charges associated with the provision of interconnecting circuits with trunk side access and CCS7 links will apply for each DS-0 set. A DS-0 set is defined as a group of DS-0's which are of the same type (i.e. Feature Group D or toll free), within the same DS-1, connected at the same location and ordered at the same time.

2. Network Charges

- (A) When the IXC requests an Interconnecting Circuit providing Trunk Side Access, a switching and aggregation charge as specified in (D) below applies to each minute of traffic carried on the Interconnecting Circuit.
 - 1) When a call is blocked from the Direct Connection and, using overflow routing, is routed to the IXC by means of Access Tandem (AT) Connection, the switching and aggregation charge related to an AT Connection, as specified in (D) 2 below, applies for that call.
- (B) The switching and aggregation charge relates to switching, transport and signaling functions performed by SaskTel at the originating or terminating end of a call, including and subject to availability:
 - hardware answer supervision
 - · delivery of calling line identification.
- (C) The charge is assessed on the basis of conversation minutes and is derived by multiplying the charge based on total elapsed carrier connect time by the connect time to conversation minutes ratio.

3. PIC Processing - continued

- (E) In the case of PIC selection changes which are disputed by the subscriber or an IXC on behalf of the subscriber, the subscriber's PIC selection will be reinstated to the previous PIC. The IXC must then provide evidence of subscriber authorization as described in section 4.5 of Schedule 4 (PIC Information Processing) of the CSG Agreement. If such subscriber authorization is not provided within fifteen (15) business days from the date of the request from SaskTel, the IXC will be deemed to have requested an unauthorized PIC change and will be assessed the unauthorized PIC charge specified in (H) 5 below. A PIC processing charge will also be assessed to the IXC having requested the unauthorized PIC change, to cover the reinstatement of the unauthorized PIC to the previous PIC selection.
- (F) To enable the IXC to validate or place PIC subscription orders at the Working Telephone Number (WTN) level, the IXC may request and obtain from SaskTel a detailed record transaction in CARE format of all WTN's subscribed to a specific Billing Telephone Number (BTN). Charges are specified in (H) 6 below.
- (G) To enable the IXC to perform a reconciliation between the IXC's billing records and SaskTel's PIC database, the IXC may request a Verification Record from SaskTel. Verification Records transactions are subject to the charge as specified in (H) 7 below.

- (A) Before an IXC is initially provided with interconnecting circuits with trunk side access, the IXC is required to complete a Carrier Profile Questionnaire (CPQ) to select network and translation options. The CPQ data is subsequently programmed as required into SaskTel's switches, as required.
- (B) Service charges as outlined in (C) below, apply to change the selected options and change the network translations in SaskTel's switches associated with each impacted Carrier Identification Code (CIC) at any time subsequent to the initial programming.

Loop Selection Charges apply when a CLEC requests the identification of the availability of a loop, in a given location, meeting a specific loop category profile. This service charge includes a report which identifies whether a loop meeting a specific loop category profile is available in a given location, and provides the loop make-up.

Loop Modification Charges apply if a loop which meets a CLEC's requested loop profile is not available in a given location, and the CLEC requests the removal of bridge taps and/or loading coils from an unbundled loop at that location. This charge is based on the amount of work and the time required to modify the existing loop. Labour charges as specified in the 'Labour charges' table in this item will apply.

Additional charges apply in situations where the provision of specific loop types requires extra work or equipment (e.g., loop extenders for Type B loops), or when a CLEC requests further performance or qualification measurements than provided for within this tariff. Additional charges may include material provided at current cost. Labour charges as specified in the 'Labour charges' table in this item will apply.

Connecting Link B is a digital transmission path which supports the transmission of an IDSN BRI type signal.

A monthly rate for the use of central office riser space (per meter, per cable) also applies.

Connecting Link C is provided at the rates and charges specified in SaskTel General Tariff Item on Digital Network Access or in SaskTel Competitor Access Tariff Item on Competitor Digital Network Services.

A connecting link repair charge applies for a co-operative test and a connecting link change when a co-operative test determines that there is no trouble found in SaskTel's network. The repair charge will be the labour charges as specified in section 4.2 b) of this item.

e) Message Relay Service

Message Relay Service provides a deaf, deafened, hard of hearing or speech impaired customer with the ability to communicate with other customers through the use of a Teletypewriter (TTY) and a hearing customer to communicate with customers who use a TTY.

Access to Message Relay Service is available on a line-side basis to CLECs using their own switches. CLECs are required to provide connections from their local switches to SaskTel's. DS-1 facilities to provide this connection are available through SaskTel's General Tariff items on Megalink Service or Digital Exchange Access Service.

A one-time set-up charge and a monthly charge per Network Access Service (NAS) or Working Telephone Number (WTN) applies, per CLEC, as detailed in this Tariff Item. In addition, a CLEC is responsible for all charges related to toll calls made by the CLEC's subscribers by means of Message Relay Service.

3. Compensation for Traffic Termination

a) Termination of CLEC Intraexchange Traffic

For traffic that is interchanged between a CLEC and SaskTel, and terminated within the same exchange, traffic imbalance may occur. When traffic imbalance exists, excluding any imbalance due to internet traffic, the party which originates less local traffic than it terminates (either the CLEC or SaskTel) is entitled to compensation. It is the responsibility of the party who is entitled to the compensation to detect and apply charges for the imbalance.

When SaskTel detects an imbalance of 20% or greater, the monthly rates specified in this Tariff Item apply, for each trunk, from the time SaskTel advises the CLEC of the imbalance, for as long as the imbalance exists.
