Re: Amendment to the MALI between TCI and Bell West

Attached for the Commission's approval pursuant to Section 29 of the *Telecommunications Act* is a true copy of Schedule C.4 to the Master Agreement for Local Interconnection ("MALI") specifying the interconnection arrangement between TELUS Communications Inc. ("TCI") and Bell West Inc. (formerly Bell Intrigna Inc.). Schedule C.4 includes Appendices which describe the interconnection arrangements for the exchanges of Port Coquitlam, North Vancouver and Chilliwack, B.C.

TCI designates Schedule C.4 to the MALI as confidential pursuant to Section 39 of the *Telecommunications Act*. This Schedule C.4 and the Appendices thereto contain sensitive network and commercial information that is consistently treated in a confidential manner by TCI. The release of this information would provide competitors with sensitive network configuration information not otherwise available to them thereby conferring an undue competitive advantage upon them, causing the company direct and specific harm. TCI therefore requests that the Commission neither publish nor reveal this confidential information to any person. TCI is not providing an abridged version of this Schedule C.4 or its Appendices for the public record because the documents are not meaningful when abridged.

TCI respectfully requests that the Commission grant approval of the enclosed MALI amendment in due course.
