Subject: The Bell Canada Broadband Expansion Proposal filed in the proceeding initiated by Public Notice 2004-1, Review and disposition of deferral accounts for the second price cap period

This letter comes in support of Bell Canada's Broadband Expansion Proposal, which is intended to support rural and remote areas that currently do not have access to broadband services.

Many Anishinabek First Nations in Ontario are located in remote or rural areas that have not traditionally had easy access to many of the basic infrastructure services that so many other Ontarians have enjoyed. In the past this has included basic modern necessities such has hydro and phone services. In today's current environment, these types of services have come to include broadband connectivity.

It is my understanding that the purpose of the deferral accounts Bell Canada is proposing to utilize is to set aside revenues representing amounts by which Bell Canada would have reduced local rates in absence of local competition restrictions. The Union of Ontario Indians feels strongly that intended savings for Anishinabek First Nations should be utilized for projects that will assist them in accessing technologies that are not currently available to them.

The Union of Ontario Indians recognizes the need for Bell Canada to continue to expand and support broadband services to First Nations in rural and remote areas. The Union of Ontario Indians supports Bell Canada in its efforts to access resources to support this broadband initiative and in turn to keep the Anishinabek informed on what resources are accessed and how our member communities have benefited.

Subject: Bell Canada's Proposed Broadband Expansion Program

WHEREAS many of the member First Nations of the Union of Ontario Indians are located in rural and remote areas that currently do not have access to broadband services; and

WHEREAS on May 19<sup>th</sup>, 2004, Bell Canada filed a proposal with the Canadian Radiotelevision and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) in the deferral account proceeding initiated by Public Notice 2004-1; and

WHEREAS the purpose of the deferral accounts is to set aside revenues representing amounts by which Bell Canada would have reduced local rates in absence of local competition restrictions; and

WHEREAS the funds in the deferral account are intended to benefit customers, competitors and incumbents, and will be used to fund initiatives that provide such benefits; and

WHEREAS in its submissions with the CRTC, Bell Canada proposed to implement a three-year program that would make broadband service available to an additional 200,000 homes and business lines in over 1,100 rural and remote communities in Ontario and Quebec where broadband is not currently available and will not be commercially feasible.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Anishinabek Chiefs in Assembly recognize the need for Bell Canada to continue to expand and support broadband services to First Nations in rural and remote areas; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Anishinabek Chiefs in Assembly support Bell Canada in its efforts to access resources to support this broadband initiative and to keep the Anishinabek informed on what resources are accessed; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Anishinabek Chiefs in Assembly direct the Grand Council Chief to provide Bell Canada with a support letter for this expansion of broadband services and to begin discussion on sharing of revenue generation from these activities.
