



Gaston Arseneault, General Counsel

Since July 1997, Mr. Arseneault has been General Counsel for the Public Service Commission of Canada (PSC). Reporting to the President of the PSC and to the Senior Assistant Deputy Minister, Public Law and Central Agencies Group, Department of Justice, Mr. Arseneault provides in-house legal services in the areas of employment law in the Public Service of Canada. He was appointed Senior Counsel for the PSC in October 1989.

After receiving a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology in 1974, Mr. Arseneault completed a Bachelor in Civil Law in 1977 and a Bachelor in Common Law in 1978 all from the University of Ottawa. He was called to the Quebec Bar in 1978 and the Ontario Bar in 1981.

Mr. Arseneault began his career in 1981 as a staff lawyer with Community Legal Services of Ottawa-Carleton, joining the federal government and the Public Service Commission as Counsel from 1982 until 1986. During an assignment in 1985, Mr. Arseneault participated as a member of the Nielson Task Force on Justice Programs. From 1986 to 1989, he was Counsel in the Legal Services Unit at the Department of National Health and Welfare before rejoining the PSC.

A member of various committees at the Department of Justice and the Public Service Commission, Mr. Arseneault speaks regularly on public service employment law and has authored and co-authored a number of articles on employment law. He resides in Ottawa.
