



Donald Lemaire, Vice-President

Mr. Donald Lemaire was appointed Vice-President of the Services Branch of the Public Service Commission of Canada on January 2, 2006.

Mr. Lemaire has degrees in both economics and law. A member of the Quebec Bar, he has extensive experience and considerable expertise in public administration. He began his career with the federal public service in September 1981 as an economist with Agriculture Canada. After fulfilling various functions with the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council and Correctional Service Canada, in the early 1990s Mr. Lemaire held a variety of executive positions at Treasury Board and the Department of Justice. In April 2003, he took on top executive roles, such as Special Advisor to the Deputy Minister and Acting Assistant Deputy Minister at Justice Canada. He was in this latter role when he was appointed Vice-President with the Public Service Commission.

Mr. Lemaire has acquired international experience. As a consultant with the World Bank, he was involved in reviewing government spending in Haiti. He has also worked as a technical advisor to the Department of Justice in Mali, helping to develop a strategic plan for reforming the justice sector.

Mr. Lemaire holds a law degree and a Master of Economics degree from the University of Ottawa. He also has a post-graduate DEA (diplôme d'études approfondies) from the *Laboratoire d'Économie et de Sociologie du Travail* in Aix-en-Provence, France. He is the author or co-author of several articles and books about policy, evaluation, economics and justice.
