JOBS gives you the information you need to find a job

- Search thousands of current job listings from across Canada, in the federal and provincial governments and the private sector, through links to job sites, specialty job sites and placement agencies.
- Find valuable information on job search techniques, such as how to market vourself, locating unadvertised jobs and wage subsidy programs.
- Explore other ways of working, such as self-employment, telework, international work or volunteer work.

WORKERS helps you manage your work life

- Find out all you need to know about workers' rights, workplace legislation, and workplace issues such as health, safety and workplace wellness.
- Get information about pensions, insurance and other support programs available to workers.
- See what's current in workplace innovation and research.

TRAINING/LEARNING gives you information on how to gain the skills you need

- Explore a range of training/learning options — from distance learning, to apprenticeship, to university programs.
- Get information on how to finance your learning, such as scholarship, bursary, loan and grant programs.
- Check out the database of training institutions across Canada to find the one that's right for you.
