Guide for the Travelling Yukon Patient





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This *Guide for the Travelling Yukon* **Patient** provides phone numbers, websites and other information that will help you plan your medical travel before you leave home. (E-mail addresses have not always been included since they often change and are usually available on websites.) We recommend you also take the guide with you while you are travelling or in hospital. It provides checklists of things you may have forgotten and offers hints to help you have a more comfortable time.

It is also available on-line from the website of the Whitehorse General Hospital. Go to www.whitehorsehospital.ca and click on "Patient Information." GENERAL INFORMATION

Yukon Government Health Services Medical Travel Program

Medical travel benefits are available for Yukon residents registered with the Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan, with some exceptions (see "Federal Government Medical Travel Assistance" on page 2). Applications to the program must be certified by a Yukon physician or nurse practitioner and submitted to the Yukon Medical Travel Program for approval before your departure. All travel must originate in the Yukon. Travel benefits are given only when

diagnosis, follow-up or treatment are not available locally. Note that some treatments are not insured.

Outpatients may receive a \$30/day subsidy for accommodation, meals and transportation, beginning on the fourth day of receiving medical services, for up to 90 days. Approved escorts are also eligible for this assistance. Be sure to take the proper forms with you to be signed by attending health care practitioners at your appointments or in hospital. Note that you are reimbursed for these expenses after your trip, so you must be prepared

to pay for your accommodation, meals and transportation at the time you receive these services.

NOTE: If you are travelling outside the Yukon, and you have an accident or become ill, the Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan does NOT pay for ambulance or evacuations and covers only a basic rate for hospital stays. You should purchase private travel insurance or extended medical benefits for this coverage even when travelling within Canada.



Federal Government Medical Travel Assistance

Members of the Canadian Armed Forces, the RCMP, and federal government employees should contact their human resources supervisor to discuss medical travel benefits through their employment.

First Nations

Status First Nation and Inuit clients are covered for medical travel and approved escorts through Health Canada, Noninsured Health Benefits (NIHB). First Nation and Inuit clients should contact NIHB for detailed advice. For additional information, they may contact their social program directors. Refer to the "First Nations" section on page 27 for more information.

AIR TRAVEL TIPS

Before your departure:

- ➡ Have a plan for what you are going to do when you land. For example, know who will be meeting you and where you will be going when you leave the airport. Many hotels provide shuttle bus service from the airport. There may be a charge for this service, but it is usually less costly than taking a taxi.
- □ Book ahead with the airline if you will require a wheelchair or motorized cart to board or disembark from the airplane.
- Ask about the locations of buses, taxis, baggage, wheelchairs and motorized carts at your arrival airport.

- □ Know exactly where you are going when you leave the airport, and how you will get there. Write it down.
- ☐ Pack a carry-on bag with personal essentials such as sleepwear, medications and medical supplies—in case your checked baggage is delayed or lost.
- If you are diabetic and use insulin needles, obtain a letter from your physician stating your condition, or you may not get through security at the airport.
- ☐ Make sure you have photo identification for yourself and for any adults travelling with you; airlines now require photo ID before issuing boarding passes. If you do not have photo ID, such as a driver's

- licence, you may obtain photo ID at territorial agents and liquor stores.
- ☐ Discuss any anxiety or fears about the flight or your medical condition with a friend or some other trusted person.
- ☐ Take a pen, notepad and this guide so you can jot down reminders, important information, phone numbers, etc.
- ☐ Take a loonie (\$1 coin) so you can use a coin-operated baggage cart at your arrival airport. (Baggage carts in some airports are free.)
- ☐ Eat well to avoid fluctuations in your blood sugar levels. Note that a hot meal is no longer served on the Whitehorse-to-Vancouver flight.

- Avoid stimulants such as caffeine and depressants such as alcohol.
- Arrive at the airport at least two hours before your departure time.
- ☐ Mention your wheelchair or other needs to an airline employee when checking in.
- ☐ If you are able, walk around the terminal for exercise before boarding the plane.
- ☐ Go to the bathroom even if you don't feel like it.

On the plane:

 Drink juice or water whenever it is served, and avoid alcohol in order to prevent dehydration.

- ☐ Chew gum or suck candies if your ears hurt with the air pressure changes.
- ☐ Take something interesting to read.
- ☐ Think over your preparations and plans; write down what still needs to be done.
- □ Let a flight attendant know if you will need help or an aid such as a wheelchair to leave the aircraft.

When you land:

- Stay seated and wait for assistance from a flight attendant if necessary.
- ☐ Use the white courtesy phones in the air terminal for emergencies or for any other kind of help.

- ☐ Use the escalators, moving sidewalks and, if necessary, elevators to avoid tiring yourself. The elevators are often hard to locate. Ask an airport employee for directions.
- □ Use a baggage cart, usually located near the baggage carousel, or ask a porter for help getting your luggage to ground transportation depots. Note that airport porters will expect a tip.

Before you leave home:

- ✓ Gather information about the hospital you will be going to from your nurse, doctor and other people who are familiar with that hospital. Ask if the hospital can send you information about accommodation, ground travel, etc. Most hospitals have websites from which you can download and print information. You can also contact the hospital by email and telephone. E-mail addresses and telephone numbers are available on websites.
- Make arrangements to pay your expenses. You will have to pay up front for ground transportation, meals, accommodation, etc. (but not your flight). If you are eligible for travel assistance, keep all your receipts so you can be reimbursed.
- ☐ If you are a member of a First
 Nation and think you may need
 assistance not covered by Noninsured Health Benefits, let your
 First Nation administration know
 ahead of time where you are
 going and when.

- ☐ If you are diabetic and use insulin needles, or if you are taking any other type of medication, obtain a letter from your physician stating your condition.
- □ Decide whether or not you want the hospital to give out information about you. Request a "do not announce" if you wish to be left alone, but be aware this could mean no visitors, flowers or mail.
- Give family and friends the hospital and ward phone numbers if you want them to be able to contact you.



- Discuss the following items with your nurse or doctor. Take a pen and notepad with you so you can write the answers down.
 - ✓ Your diagnosis and treatment plan
 - Whether you will be an in-patient, out-patient or both
 - Reason for tests and treatments, and risks involved
 - Amount of time you can expect to be away
 - Any decisions you may have to make about the treatment
 - Confirmation letters you may need for appointments
 - ____ Discharge requirements, if any

Follow-up care both in the city and at home

What to take to the hospital

- Documents:
 - ____ Yukon Health Care Insurance Plan card
 - Record of any extended medical coverage or private insurance
 - Personal identification with photo
 - ____ X-rays, health records or prescriptions
 - Your physician's name and phone number
 - Any written personal directives for your care in case you are incapacitated

- Written records of appointment times, phone numbers, addresses, etc.
- Written records of any disabilities or allergies you have, food preferences and other special needs
- Travel vouchers
- Flight ticket or proof of electronic ticket
- Consent forms needed for a minor's treatment or transport
- Forms for reimbursement of expenses
- ___ This guide

Medicines:

- Prescription, non-prescription and herbal medications that you are using, in their original containers
- Medical supplies such as insulin needles

Clothing:

- Appropriate clothing for the weather
- ____ If you are medevaced, remember your heavy jacket or parka, shoes and boots
- ____ If you are an in-patient, don't bring a lot of extra clothing to the hospital

- ☐ Personal items (for in-patients):
 - Pyjamas or nightgown, bathrobe, slippers
 - Toothbrush, toothpaste, hairbrush, shampoo, hand lotion, tissues, makeup
 - Eyeglasses
 - ___ Feminine hygiene products
 - Books or magazines
 - Writing paper and pen

NOTE: Do not bring valuables such as jewellery, large sums of money, extra credit cards, cellular phones, radios or laptop

computers to the hospital. Leave them at home or with someone who can care for them for you while you are in the hospital.

Escorts

Whether or not you are eligible to have someone go with you as an escort depends on the medical assistance program you are eligible for. Factors taken into account include your physical condition, age and knowledge of English. Approved escorts may be given subsidized travel.

All children under 19 (18 if covered by NIHB) require an escort. If a child is critically ill, both parents may escort the child, but you



must ask about your spouse accompanying you. Note that Health Canada's NIHB policy is that only one person may escort.

If you are medevaced, the nurse or doctor accompanying you will ensure that you are safely transferred to the hospital.

Your escort is expected to be with you at all reasonable times to assist you with travel and appointments while you are traveling, for the full time you are away.

Hospital services

Hospital websites offer a wealth of information. See "Phone numbers and websites" below for a list of hospital website addresses. If you do not have Internet

access, you can obtain information by calling the hospital's main telephone number (also listed below).

The hospital where you're going should be able to give you the following information by mail, fax or e-mail. If you are not able to get this information ahead of time, you can obtain it from the central information desk in the main entry area of the hospital.

- ☐ Information about the hospital
- Information about various diseases and treatments and support services available to patients and their families

- ☐ A list of hotel and medical lodge accommodations near the hospital
- Public transit information to and from the hospital
- ☐ Maps of the hospital and surrounding area

Most major hospitals provide the following services:

- □ Social workers, available by phone or in person
- ☐ Contacts with, and referral to, other services inside and outside the hospital
- ☐ First Nation liaison workers or social workers familiar with other cultures

- ☐ Interdenominational pastoral service and chapels
- ☐ Volunteers who will personally assist patients and their families
- ☐ Interpreters in most common languages
- ☐ Access to a telephone and television
- ☐ Gift and flower shop
- Cafeteria
- ☐ In children's hospitals, parent supports such as counsellors, in-hospital accommodation for parents, limited child care for siblings, and a school for longterm patients

NOTE: Hospital social workers can help you find accommodation, support services, etc., but they are not involved with social assistance or child protection. You must contact the Yukon Department of Health and Social Services for these services.

Discharge

When you are discharged from the hospital, you will be expected to pay anything you owe them, whether you are being subsidized or not. Be sure to have your credit or debit card or chequebook with you. Be sure to obtain receipts for anything you pay for.

You should bring a discharge plan back home with you which details further treatment and any prescribed drugs. Be sure to share this with your physician and nurse

practitioner so they can be of help to you in the future.

In-patient tips

- ▼ Find out what Yukon Health Insurance actually covers in the provinces.
- ☐ Find out what your extended health insurance will cover, and keep in mind that you will have to pay for services first.
- Keep all receipts for reimbursement.
- Be aware that you may have to pay for supplies such as crutches, casts, etc.
- ☐ Find out before you leave home if a relative will be able to stay in hospital with you.

- Go to the admitting desk upon arrival at the hospital.
- ☐ Discuss any special dietary needs with the hospital dietician. Within limits, you can eat your own food.
- ☐ Inquire about private or semiprivate rooms; they are sometimes available at a cost.
- ☐ Be aware that smoking is not allowed except in designated areas.

Outpatient tips

☐ Ask the hospital to mail or fax you a list of nearby accommodation with the latest rates. Be sure it

- includes phone numbers and e-mail and website addresses.
- Ask the hospital to mail or fax you hospital and area maps.
- Ask about in-hospital accommodation before you leave home.
- Always ask for medical rates at hotels (may need a letter from your doctor or hospital).
- Ask about airport pickup by your accommodation.
- Ask social workers about assistance with housing expenses.



If your child will be staying in the hospital:

- ✓ Have all necessary documents handy.
- Bring brothers and sisters only if necessary.
- Bring comfort items such as special blankets, soothers.
- Bring things to occupy your child: familiar toys, books, special snacks.
- Label your child's belongings.
- Leave valuables at home.

To prepare and support your child:

- ☐ Discuss honestly in advance what will happen to make your child well.
- ☐ Use a doll or puppets to illustrate treatments.
- Stay with your child and hold him or her as much as possible.
- Decorate cribs or beds.
- ☐ Be honest about when you are coming and going.
- Leave the child with something of yours: pictures, clothing, drawings, tape recordings of your voice.

Ask for advice and ideas from social workers. First Nation child care workers, parent advisors and hospital volunteers.

first nations Health Canada, through its Noninsured Health Benefits (NIHB) program, provides assistance for medical transportation to eligible First Nation and Inuit clients. All medical transportation must be approved in advance through NIHB. If approved in advance, NIHB will also assist in the provision of an escort for medical, legal or interpretive reasons. Meals and accommodation for eligible clients and their escorts may also be provided.

> Travel benefits are given only when diagnosis, follow-up or treatment are not available locally.

We advise you to inform your First Nation (social program director, community health worker or social assistance administrator) before you leave the community for medical care, in the event that you need help with expenses not covered by NIHB.

The Whitehorse General Hospital, through its First Nations Health Program, provides assistance and support to First Nation patients and families while in hospital. A liaison worker will contact you. Interpreters, a First Nations dietician, a Healing Room, and traditional medicine are available.

Most hospitals in Vancouver, Edmonton and Calgary have First Nation liaison workers on staff or volunteers who may help you with advice, spiritual and healing practices, food preferences and personal problems. You do not have to be registered with Indian and Northern Affairs Canada to receive these services. Simply ask a nurse or social worker to have someone contact you. The cities also have native friendship centres or other First Nation organizations with specialized counsellors and support programs.
