

SET FINE CATEGORIES

Each offence is now assigned a letter (A to J) to indicate the fine category.

Each fine category equals a specific amount (see chart below) that the officer can enter as the “Amount Due” on the offence notice form. The Amount Due for each category includes fine, costs, and applicable surcharges.

*** SOME SPECIFIC CALCULATIONS MAY BE REQUIRED**

For some offences there may be specific instructions for calculating the Amount Due. Calculate as instructed and enter total in Amount Due area on the offence notice.

**** NO SET FINE or TO BE DETERMINED**

If you see “no set fine” (in the Offence Notice Regulation Schedule A) or “to be determined” (in the Brown Book):

- Do not enter anything in the amount due area
- Do not write NSF or No Set Fine
- Check mark the box to indicate “to be determined by a justice”.

PREFACE

The Offence Notices Regulation authorizes abbreviated wording and the amount due for charges issued on a common offence notice.

Schedule A to the Offence Notices Regulation sets out the authorized abbreviated wording and the Amount Due coding for numerous individual statute and regulatory offences.

An electronic version, or “hard copy”, of the complete Offence Notices Regulation Schedule A will be made available to all enforcement agencies and court centres.

NOTE: even when a set fine is authorized by the Offence Notices Regulation, it is at the discretion of the issuing officer to either:

- Enter the authorized set fine in the Amount Due area on the ticket,
- Or tick the box indicating “to be determined by a justice”.

BROWN BOOK CONTAINS “COMMON” OFFENCES ONLY

The Brown Book is a **partial reprint** of the Offence Notices Regulation, containing offences that are commonly issued by a variety of enforcement agencies for easy reference purposes.

REFERENCE NOTES

CHOICE OF WORD OR PHRASE IN DESCRIPTION OF OFFENCE

A “bullet” (i.e. “●”) is used in the abbreviated wordings of the English version of the Brown Book to identify when there is a choice as to which word or phrase the officer will use when describing the offence.

OFFENCES NOT LISTED IN BROWN BOOK OR SCHEDULE A

For provincial statute or regulatory offences not covered in either the Brown Book or Schedule A, officers may still issue a charge on an offence notice, but they must:

- Use the formal wording to describe the offence, and
- Tick the box indicating “to be determined by a justice”.

In these situations, many officers prefer to lay the charge on the formal long-white information and have the accused make a formal court appearance.

“C”, “D”, OR “I” DEFINITION

In some cases, the appropriate set fine depends on whether the accused is a Corporation, Dealer, or Individual. These situations are identified by a “C” for corporation, a “D” for dealer, or an “I” for individual, just in front of the set fine.

of this Act, or any provision of section 249, 252, 253, 254, 255, 259 or 335 of the Criminal Code has been committed, whether it has been committed or not, and who, on reasonable and probable grounds, believes that any person has committed such a violation, may arrest that person without warrant whether he is guilty or not.

WILDLIFE ACT

POWERS OF ARREST

70(2) An officer, upon witnessing the commission of an offence under this Act or the regulations, may without process arrest the person committing the offence and bring him before a court of competent jurisdiction to be dealt with according to law.

LIQUOR CONTROL ACT

ARREST WITHOUT WARRANT

139(1) Any constable or inspector who finds any person committing, or who on reasonable and probable grounds believes that any person is committing, an offence against this Act may arrest the person without warrant.

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2004

- Use the "04" version of the offence notice (ticket numbers beginning with "04")
- Destroy all earlier versions of the offence notice (ticket numbers beginning with "03", "01", "99", etc.)
- Enter the authorized set fine in "Amount Due" area from 2004 Offence Notices Regulation or Brown Book;
Or tick the box to indicate "to be determined by a Justice".
- No more breakdown of fine, costs, and surcharge on offence notice
- No more writing in "NSF" or "No Set Fine" on offence notice

For more specific details and explanations, please review the "Head's Up" information package that was distributed to enforcement agencies and court centres in December, 2003. Or you may contact Court Services (204) 945-0504 to obtain a copy.

APPEARANCE DATES

First Appearance Date - a minimum of 21 days (3 weeks) from the date of issue.

Last Appearance Date - 10 to 14 days from the first appearance date.

RETURNABLE COURT CENTRE

All Offence Notices are pre-printed with the court address of 373 Broadway in Winnipeg, R3C 4S4. However the accused may choose to respond to either 373 Broadway or any **regional** Manitoba Court Centre. (Access to ticket details are available at regional court centres on automated CON system by first appearance date). In addition there are other options and instructions for the accused on the back of the summons.

DELIVER NEW OFFENCE NOTICES TO 373 BROADWAY ASAP

To allow sufficient time for processing and data-entry of offence notices, please deliver newly-issued tickets to 373 Broadway in Winnipeg at least 5 to 10 days **BEFORE FIRST APPEARANCE DATE**.

DEFINITION OF A MOTOR VEHICLE

Tick "motor vehicle" box if offence involves: car, truck, semi, trailer attached to a motor vehicle, motorcycle, moped, recreation vehicle.

DEFINITION OF HUSBANDRY

Tick “husbandry” box if offence involves: tractor, combine, swather, front-end loader, crane, grader, fork-life, or other motorized farm or heavy equipment.

**APPENDIX “E”
CHILD CAR SEAT SAFETY CHECK**

HTA 186(9) No person shall operate, or permit the operation of, a motor vehicle on a highway unless every passenger in the vehicle who has not yet attained the age of 5 years and who is under 50 pounds in weight is properly secured in a restraining device of a kind prescribed in the regulations and the device is properly secured to the motor vehicle. FINE CATEGORY “F”.

EXEMPTIONS:

The requirement does not apply when:

- The motor vehicle is registered in a jurisdiction that does not require the use of child restraints;
- The vehicle is rented for a period of less than 21 days;
- The vehicle is a taxi cab that is transporting for hire a passenger;
- The driver can present a medical certificate signed by a doctor which indicates that the child is unable to wear a child restraint system for medical reasons;
- To the satisfaction of a peace officer, the person is of such size, build or possesses other physical characteristics that the child could not be restrained in a child restraint system;
- A child is being transported casually or occasionally by a person who is not the parent and the vehicle is not equipped with a child restraint system;
- The motor vehicle is not required to be equipped with safety belts under the CMVSS (e.g. buses, vehicles manufactured before 1971).

Before using the check list on the back – request the child’s age, weight and height, then refer to the schedule below to determine the type of child restraint that should be used:

<p>Infant Seat Up to 9 kg (20 lbs.) Up to 66 cm (26 in.) REAR Facing</p>	<p>Toddler Seat 9 - 18 kg (20 - 40 lbs.) 66 – 102 cm (26 - 40 in.) FRONT Facing</p>	<p>Booster Seat 18 – 27 kg (40 – 60 lbs.) 102 cm plus (40 in. plus) FRONT Facing</p>	<p>Seat Belt Age 5, 22 kg (50 lbs.) FRONT Facing</p>
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NOTE: children must be 1 year of age or older to be transported in an integrated car seat. Integrated seats are built into the vehicle by the vehicle manufacturer.

LAW ENFORCEMENT CHILD CAR SEAT SAFETY CHECKLIST

Restraint used is appropriate for age, weight and height profile

Restraint is in correct position (front or rear facing): rear-facing for infants under the age of one, and front-facing for infants one year and older. **NOTE: This is a recommendation only; it is not law.**

Infant seat is not located in front of an active passenger air bag

Infant seat: carrying handle is in the down position

Car seat: is secured snugly with either the lap belt, lap/shoulder assembly, or latch system

Harness strap comes near child's shoulders, slightly above or below as required by manufacturer

Chest clip is at the underarm level

Forward-facing toddler seat is secured with a tether strap and an anchor bolt, and one of the following: a seat belt or latch system. **NOTE: the tether strap should be secured to an anchor bolt.**

Anchor bolt is drilled into the metal frame of the vehicle

Tether strap is doubled back through the adjuster slide to prevent slippage. **NOTE:** not required for airline type buckles

Head and neck are supported to prevent whiplash

For seatbelt assemblies with emergency locking retractors: free sliding latch plate has a locking clip

Harness strap is snug – one finger fits snugly between the harness strap and the child's chest

Harness strap is doubled back through the adjuster slides or they are attached to a metal harness bracket to prevent slippage

Booster seat: shoulder strap of seat belt assembly passes over the chest and shoulder of a child

Seat is CMVSS approved
