## **Québécois Subject Headings**

The National Library of Canada (NLC) is resolving an exception to its use of French-language subject headings from Répertoire de vedettes-matière (RVM) from Université Laval. The exception was regarding RVM headings and cross-references using the words "québécois" or "québécoise." A close examination of the application of these headings confirmed that "québécois(e)" is used as a qualifer referring works by or about people from Quebec of the French-speaking expression and not other linguistic groups in the province.

Starting on 2002 Oct. 1, the National Library of Canada will use subject headings with the words "québécois" and "québécoise" in subject authority records and bibliographic records. Changes will be made to equivalence references between the English-language Canadian Subject Heading and the French-language RVM heading on AMICUS.

These are the changes which users might notice:

- 1. Cross-references will be added on AMICUS from the former headings.
- 2. Language equivalence references will be changed on affected CSH headings.
- 3. Some additional USE references will be added to CSH records.
- 4. Affected bibliographic records will be modified manually.

The attached example illustrates a typical change.

Note that NLC creates subject authority records for only the English-language headings used in CSH. Subject authority records for French-language headings are created by Université Laval and are available on the RVM database.
