PARK PATROL OFFICER (Resource Officer 1)

This job appeals to those who enjoy outdoor pursuits and who also are looking for a career in conservation or law enforcement. You must be versatile, flexible, and enjoy the challenge of working within a diverse natural environment. You will be responsible for patrolling your assigned park to provide information to visitors and to ensure regulatory compliance - protecting the resource from people, people from the resource, and people from people. You will use and maintain a variety of equipment, ranging from all terrain vehicles and watercraft to enforcement tools. We will provide comprehensive training and develop your potential to pursue your chosen career.

Eligibility List to be established to fill any positions which become vacant in the 2007 seasonal hiring.

Location: Various Provincial Parks throughout Manitoba – Start date May 14, 2007

Length of Employment: Seasonal - Approximately 17 weeks (may vary slightly depending on location)

Salary: \$15.13 per hour *under review* (Plus \$.95 /hr Weekend Premium and \$10.80 Night Shift Premium). Bunkhouse accommodation is provided free of charge at all locations (except Bird's Hill Provincial Park).

As of May 2007, applicants must have completed year one of a diploma program or year two of an undergraduate degree:

- in the studies of Conservation, Ecology, Environment, or Law, or
- an equivalent combination of education, training and experience

Additional Requirements:

- a valid Class 5 (minimum) driver's licence (enclose photocopy). A Manitoba Class 4 licence will be required upon hiring
- Canadian Firearm Safety Course (course report copy) and valid Standard First Aid & CPR certificates (Enclose photocopy)
- physical ability to perform the position duties. Completion of a physical ability test (POPAT or PARE) is an asset
- strong verbal and written communication skills
- strong decision making ability; ability to work effectively under adverse environmental conditions, stressful circumstances, and hostile encounters
- Must not have been convicted of a criminal offence for which a pardon has not been granted.
