

Adult Learning and Literacy (ALL), a branch of the Department of Advanced Education and Literacy, administers and supports the development and delivery of adultfocused programming through adult learning centres and community-based literacy programs in Manitoba. This programming is designed to enable Manitobans to improve their ability to understand and employ printed information in daily living activities at work, at home, and in the community and to obtain high school credentials so they can access higher education and/or better employment opportunities.

ALL registers adult learning centres (ALCs) under the ALC Act and provides funding for both ALCs and literacy programs. In addition, ALL offers training and professional development workshops for new and experienced literacy practitioners and adult learning centre teachers.

ALL also administers the General Educational Development (GED) Testing Service, an international high school equivalency testing program for adults.

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ADULT LEARNING CENTRES

An adult learning centre is a community partnership, which provides opportunities for adult learners who are 19 years of age and older to enhance their academic qualifications, develop employment skills and engage in life long learning. The centres offer a variety of Grade 9 to Grade 12 high school credit courses. They enable learners to complete the Mature Student High School Diploma Program, obtain courses necessary as prerequisites for attending postsecondary institutions or become more competitive for new employment opportunities.

In addition to the Grade 9 to Grade 12 credit courses, adult learning centres may provide the following courses or services:

- PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT AND RECOGNITION (PLAR) PLAR is a process used to identify, document, assess and recognize skills and knowledge. Besides formal education, learning for adults may take place in many other situations, including: work experience and workplace training, hobbies, family, the military, volunteer activities, travel, and independent study. Through PLAR, individuals may receive credit for courses by providing evidence to substantiate that learning has occurred.
- DUAL CREDIT COURSES Dual credit courses qualify for credit at both the high school and postsecondary levels.
- NON-CREDIT (NC) ACADEMIC COURSES NC academic courses include learning such as literacy or adult basic education. Generally these do not count towards a Mature Student High School Diploma.
- NON-CREDIT (NC) VOCATIONAL COURSES NC vocational courses include customized or "fee for service" courses linked to business, industry or for general interest purposes such as resume writing, interviewing or career exploration.

ADULT LITERACY PROGRAMS

An adult literacy program provides adult learners with opportunities to develop the ability to understand and employ printed information in daily living activities at work, at home and in the community in order to reach personal goals and develop individual potential. The programming ranges from beginning level to more advanced reading, writing, document use, oral communication and numeracy skill upgrading.

Participants in adult literacy programs should be 18 years of age and older and out of school at least one year. Adult literacy programs are sponsored by community-based organizations.

The following services may be offered by an Adult Literacy Program:

CERTIFICATE IN LITERACY AND LEARNING (STAGES 1 – 3)

A learner-focused, portfolio-based curriculum framework designed to give recognition to learner achievement in upgrading reading, writing and speaking skills. A certificate may be awarded by the Department of Advanced Education and Literacy.

FAMILY LITERACY

Refers to the ways families use literacy skills to perform tasks and meet their needs within the home and community. It supports the literacy development of all family members.

➢ ONE-TO-ONE TUTORING

Programming that matches a learner and a volunteer, who provides one to one instruction.

EAL LITERACY

Programming that addresses English literacy development for those that require English as an Additional Language.

GENERAL EDUCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT (GED) SERVICES

The General Educational Development (GED) is an international high school equivalency testing program for adults. It consists of a series of five tests in the following areas:

- Language Arts, Reading
- Language Arts, Writing
- Mathematics
- Social Studies
- Science

The GED tests are designed to measure the skills that correspond to those of recent high school graduates. They involve the ability to understand and apply information; to evaluate, analyze, and draw conclusions; and to express ideas and opinions in writing. Adults who pass the five tests receive a Senior Years Equivalency diploma.

In some jurisdictions, GED test scores are accepted as being equivalent to secondary school graduation requirements for the purposes of employment, promotion, and licensing, as well as admission into apprenticeship programs. Some post-secondary institutions (such as community colleges and universities) may accept GED test scores for admissions purposes.

Adult Learning and Literacy **cannot** guarantee that a GED certificate will be accepted by employers or post-secondary institutions in every instance. If the GED certificate is to be used for community college, university entrance or for a job application, that institution or workplace should be contacted to find out if the GED is acceptable or meets their minimum requirements.

Test schedules, forms for registering to write the GED or requesting a duplicate copy of a GED transcript can be downloaded from our ALL website. Persons wanting additional information regarding the Manitoba GED Testing Service may contact the GED Administrator.

Program Description:

The Aboriginal Community Campus is a division of The Centre for Aboriginal Human Resource Development. The Campus offers educational programming year round, with a continuous intake schedule. The Campus provides programming for all levels of learners and has two main divisions; Upgrading and Academic Programs. In the Upgrading program individuals are assisted with upgrading their reading, writing and math skills to a Grade 10 level. Science, computers and community/ current events are also studied. Upgrading is presented to participants with an employment focus and this is identified in an action plan developed during their program. The Academic Program offers educational programming for participants to obtain their Mature Student Grade 12 Diploma. All courses offered are University entrance. Courses are offered on a monthly basis, allowing students to focus on two credits every two months. Eight credits are required to graduate.


Program Description:
