The Red River Floodway Act was proclaimed in June, 2005. It provides compensation for Manitobans who have been affected by artificial flooding caused by the opening of the floodway to manage spring run-off. While the act requires the government to operate the floodway during spring flooding, some individual property can be damaged in the process and cause some economic losses. The act also requires the provincial government to prepare a report on floodway operation and its effects by June 30 of each year the floodway is used to manage river levels.

The two regulations we would like to get your input on are:

- the regulation on compensation for damages caused by artificial spring flooding
- 2. the regulation outlining the information that is to be included in the *Floodway Operations Report*

A *Background Paper* on the floodway is enclosed to give you more detailed information on the concepts and ideas that will be contained in the regulations. Also enclosed is a sheet of frequently asked questions and answers about the act.
