In 2004, KPMG ranked Winnipeg, Manitoba among the lowest of 121 cities in 11 leading industrialized countries for the business costs associated with R&D, Software and Corporate Service operations.

If you're looking to improve your company revenue, Manitoba is the place to be. In 2003, total revenue for the software and computer services industry increased by 58 per cent to \$645 million (Cdn); 15 times the national average of four per cent.

Manitoba is home to more than 1,017 companies in this sector. Nearly 75 per cent provide computer systems design and related services.

Software developers have been on the fast track here, with 125 per cent growth in operating revenues and 100 per cent growth in the number of software enterprises across the province between 2001 and 2003.

- KPMG ranks Winnipeg third among 121 industrialized cities for business costs associated with software development.*
- With salaries at only 94.8 per cent of the national average, Winnipeg has the most competitive IT salaries of seven major Canadian markets (*Robert Half Technology Survey, 2005*).
- You'll pay less for statutory and other benefits. At 29 per cent of salary and wages, Canada compares well with the 32 per cent paid in the US, due in large part to lower medical premiums.
- Canada's income tax incentives for research and development are among the most generous in the world and Manitoba companies reap even greater rewards. In 2005, the combined federal and provincial tax credits for a non-manufacturing firm in Manitoba reduced a \$100 R&D investment to an after-tax cost of just over \$40.
- Our quality office and industrial space is abundant and among the lowest cost in the country.
- We have the lowest published electricity rates in North America and one of the most reliable power delivery systems on the continent.

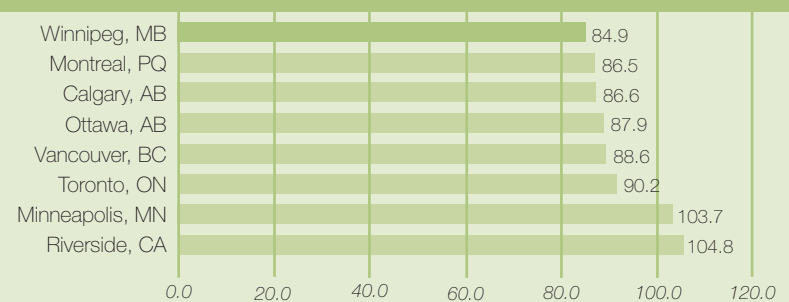
