# **MEMORANDUM D19-9-2**

Ottawa, July 26, 1993

### **SUBJECT**

# REGULATIONS OF NARCOTICS AND CONTROLLED AND RESTRICTED DRUGS (NARCOTIC CONTROL ACT, FOOD AND DRUGS ACT)

This Department assists the Department of National Health and Welfare with the administration of the Narcotic Control Act and Regulations and the Food and Drugs Act and Regulations. This Memorandum outlines the requirements for the import and export of narcotics and controlled and restricted drugs; explains the permit and validation procedures; provides a chart indicating permit requirements; and contains an alphabetical list of drugs which fall under these categories.

### **GUIDELINES AND GENERAL INFORMATION**

- 1. Narcotics, controlled drugs and restricted drugs are enumerated in the Narcotic Control Act Schedule, the Food and Drugs Act, Part III Schedule G and the Food and Drugs Act, Part IV Schedule H respectively.
- 2. Appendix A to this Memorandum contains an alphabetical listing of such narcotics, controlled drugs and restricted drugs, including salts and derivatives, and indicates the Schedule where the goods appear.
- 3. Narcotics or controlled drugs shall be securely packed in a sealed package that cannot be opened without breaking the seal.
- 4. Narcotics and controlled and restricted drugs may only be imported or exported by a pharmaceutical manufacturer or distributor or other person licensed by the Minister of National Health and Welfare. The importer/owner or exporter must possess a valid permit, issued by the Bureau of Dangerous Drugs, for the shipment concerned.

# **Import and Export Permit Requirements**

5. The following chart indicates permit requirements for the narcotics and drugs listed in Appendix A to this Memorandum:

### **Permit Procedure**

- 6. A permit authorizing the importation or exportation of narcotics, controlled drugs and restricted drugs may only be applied to a single complete shipment. Permits for multiple or partial shipments will not be authorized. All goods authorized by the permit must enter Canada at the same time.
- 7. At the time of release, the importer/owner or exporter will present an import or export permit issued by the Bureau of Dangerous Drugs.
- 8. The importer/owner or exporter will indicate the following information on both copies of the permit:
  - (a) cargo control number;
  - (b) presentation date of documentation; and
  - (c) exact quantity of drugs being imported or exported.
- 9. Customs will verify that:
  - (a) the shipment quantity and description agree with Customs documentation;
  - (b) the permit is effective and has not yet expired;
  - (c) the cargo control number is on the permit;

- (d) the permit number is on the accounting document; and
- (e) the permit is properly authorized.
- 10. Customs will then validate the permit with the signature of the Customs Inspector, and the Customs date stamp.
- 11. Customs will then release the goods, and return the validated permit immediately to the Bureau of Dangerous Drugs (see paragraph 29 of this Memorandum).

#### **Amendment of Permits**

12. Notification of amendment or revalidation of permits will be given to the importer/owner or exporter in writing by the Chief, International Control and Licensing Division, Bureau of Dangerous Drugs.

### **Poppy Heads**

13. Poppy heads and pods require a narcotic import or export permit, as the case may be.

### **Exemption: Bird Feed**

- 14. Bird feed may contain hemp seed (Cannabis Sativa). Hemp seed is classified as a narcotic. However, the Narcotic Control Act has exempted bird feed containing non-viable (incapable of growth) hemp seed from import permit requirements.
- 15. Customs will contact the Bureau of Dangerous Drugs for assistance in determining the viability of suspect shipments.

### **Medical Practitioners (Medical Doctors, Dentists and Veterinarians)**

16. Narcotics or controlled drugs or both in the possession of medical practitioners may not be imported under any circumstances.

### **Importation of Emergency Drugs**

- 17. Exporters, who ship emergency drugs to physicians in private practice or hospitals in Canada, have been requested by the Health Protection Branch, Department of National Health and Welfare, to affix on all such shipments a label stating "Urgent Emergency Drug. Please telephone doctor (name of physician) on arrival".
- 18. Customs offices receiving such importations are to contact immediately the doctor whose name appears on the label, so as to expedite delivery of these emergency drugs. If the doctor is located in a hospital, the hospital pharmacy may be contacted as an alternate.

### **Civil Defence: Movement of Narcotics**

- 19. Under an agreement between the United States and Canada, narcotic medication will not be sent across the border during Civil Defence test exercises. However, during declared Civil Defence emergencies, such narcotic medication as may be required will be exchanged between properly accredited Civil Defence officials of the two governments without the necessity of conforming to the usual domestic and international requirements.
- 20. Medical support teams moving across the border to render assistance at the request of duly constituted and accredited Civil Defence officials shall be regarded as official government agents of their respective countries. As such, they will be permitted to carry such narcotic medication as is required to render assistance and accomplish the mission for which their help was requested.
- 21. Records of the consumption of all narcotic medication that has crossed the border will be maintained by the Civil Defence authorities.

### First Aid Kits: Aircraft and Ships

22. First aid kits containing small amounts of narcotics or controlled drugs or both, which are sealed and for emergency use only on aircraft or ships, shall not be subject to control procedures for Customs purposes under the Narcotic Control Act or the Food and Drugs Act.

#### **Identification of Goods**

23. Food and Drug Inspectors of the Bureau of Dangerous Drugs may be contacted for assistance in identification of goods. The addresses for these Inspectors are listed in Appendix B to this Memorandum.

### **Detention**

- 24. Customs may detain any narcotic, controlled or restricted drug pending examination by a Food and Drug Inspector. Where, as a result of a Food and Drug Inspector's examination or analysis of a specimen, it is found that the sale of the commodity in Canada would constitute a violation of the Food and Drugs Act and the Narcotic Control Act, therefore the goods may be refused importation into Canada.
- 25. Shipments of narcotics, or controlled or restricted drugs which are not accompanied by appropriate permits are to be detained, and officials of the Bureau of Dangerous Drugs are to be notified immediately.
- 26. Shipments of narcotics, or controlled or restricted drugs which are unclaimed are to be disposed of in accordance with established Customs procedures. This also applies to

shipments of narcotics arriving in Canada by mail (transmission of narcotics through international mail is prohibited).

27. Where narcotics or controlled or restricted drugs are smuggled into Canada or otherwise imported in a manner that warrants seizure action, the procedures outlined in Chapter 9 of the Customs Seizures Enforcement Manual are to be followed carefully by Customs Officers.

### **Penalty Information**

28. The Food and Drugs Act and the Narcotic Control Act provide penalties for failure to comply with that legislation.
