Manitoba Justice recognizes the need to offer information, assistance and support to victims of the most serious crimes.

- advise victims of their options, rights and responsibilities

Why should I register?

You must register with Manitoba Justice if you want to exercise your rights under The *Victims' Bill of Rights (VBR).* The VBR is a law that gives rights to victims of the most serious crimes.

You can access these rights as you deal with police, prosecutors, the courts and corrections agencies. However, you must register with Manitoba Justice through a **crime victim** services worker once criminal charges have been laid.

How do I register?

We cannot use your information for any other purpose without your consent, unless the law permits it or requires it. We cannot share your information outside Manitoba Justice without your consent, unless the law permits or requires this. If you have any questions or concerns about this collection of your personal information, contact a crime victim services worker.
