

Further to the Yukon Utilities Board's Memorandum dated July 7, 2006. Yukon Energy's overall concerns with the proposed schedule in Board Order 2006-5 are outlined in its July 4, 2006 letter to the Board, a copy of which is attached.

In specific response to the YUB's July 7<sup>th</sup> request for input on the schedule, Yukon Energy believes a schedule consistent with the schedule used in the 1992 Resource Plan review would be most appropriate. Yukon Energy understands that such a schedule can only be accommodated if the October 31, 2006 reporting date is extended. Accordingly, as outlined in our July 4<sup>th</sup> letter. Yukon Energy would support a request to the Yukon Government for an extension of the YUB's reporting deadline to December 15, 2006

We look forward to discussing this matter further at the Technical Workshop set for July 25, 2006.

Re: Operations Application for Review of its 20 Year Resource Plan: 2006-2025

In reviewing the proposed schedule outlined in Board Order 2006-5 we have identified a number of concerns flowing from the overall time allowed to the Board especially when compared to a similar process used in reviewing Yukon Energy Corporation/YECL's Resource Plan in 1992.

Given the length of time since the YUB last reviewed Yukon Energy's Resource Plan Yukon Energy believes that it is likely interested stakeholders will want to review in some detail the issues raised in the submission. For this reason we believe that the one week timeframe for responding to information requests (both by Yukon Energy and by intervenors) is too short. We do, however, understand that if more time is provided for responding to information requests the hearing will have to be moved to a later date and therefore the Board's report could not be completed by the October 31 date required by the Minister's directive.

Accordingly, Yukon Energy would support a request for an extension to December 15, 2006 of the October 31, 2006 reporting date set out in the Minister's June 5, 2006 letter. We believe such an extension would accommodate the timing needs of all participants in this important process without undue harm to timing needs for the proposed major projects.
