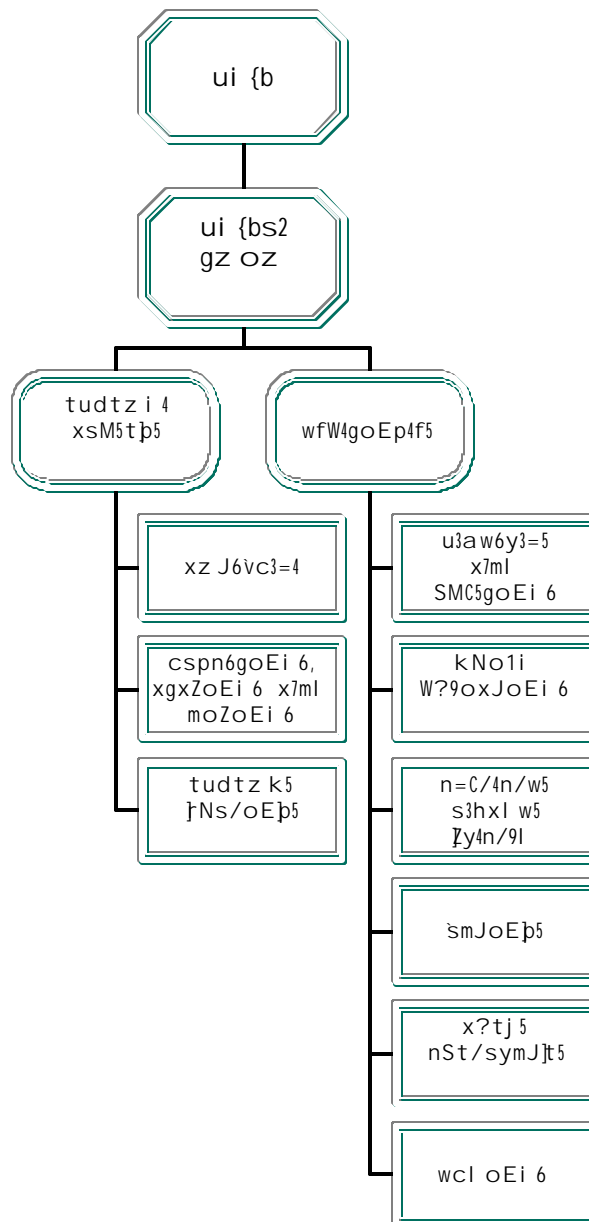

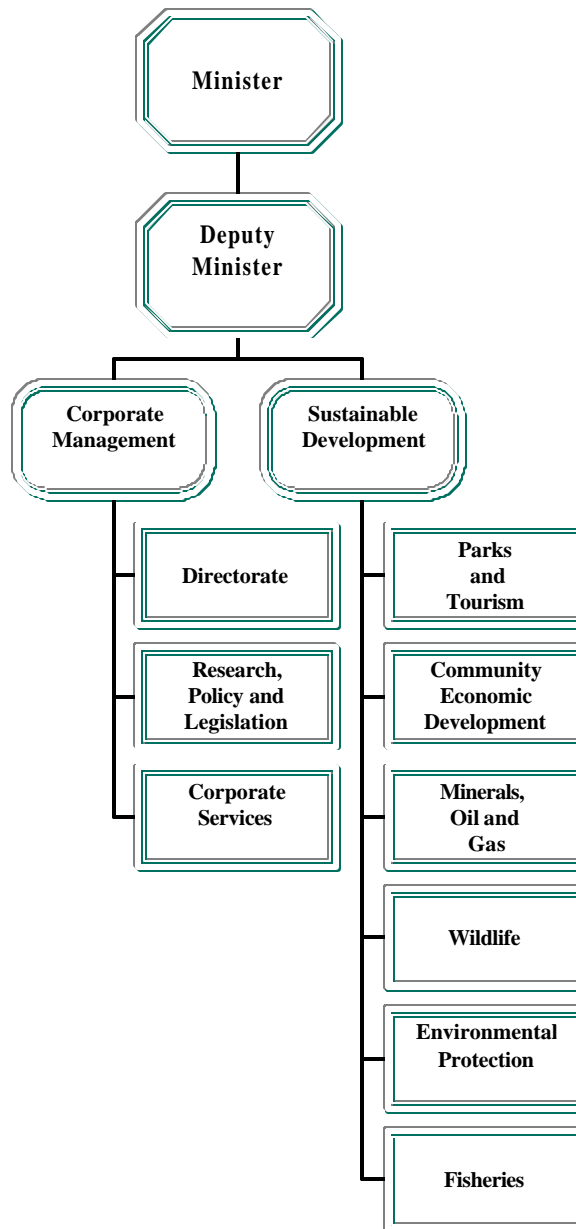

- ◆ Development of a new Nunavut Wildlife Act.

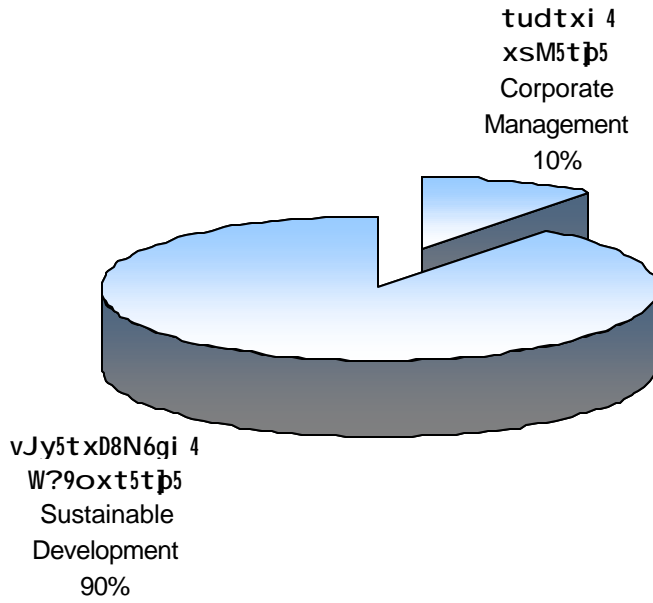
### **Improving the Quality of our Programs and Services**
