

TAKING STUDENT TO WORK FOR A DAY

THIS INFORMATION SHOULD BE COMMUNICATED TO ALL SUPERVISING TEACHERS AND STUDENTS PARTICIPATING IN PROGRAMS WHERE STUDENTS ENTER WORKPLACES AS PART OF A SCHOOL CURRICULUM.

Annually, schools encourage parents to facilitate a better understanding of the world of work by their children through taking a student to work for a day. There are inherent risks with bringing any person into a workplace setting if adequate preparatory work is not done. Responsibility for the safety and health of students while at any workplace related to a school function, rests with three groups; the school, the student (parents) and the workplace.

School Responsibilities

In preparation for the event day, the school should have discussed (and verified comprehension) with the students the following issues related to safety and health:

- Are there activities at the workplace that would preclude the student from safely being present in the workplace?,
- □ Every workplace has hazards which can result in serious injury, illness or death,
- □ Employers have a legal responsibility to provide a safe workplace with appropriate safeguards, training and supervision to protect the workers and other persons who come into the workplace,
- Students have a responsibility to follow workplace rules, not operate equipment / processes unless trained and not place themselves or others at risk.

Student (Parental) Responsibilities

Prior to going into any workplace students and their parents should become familiar with:

- □ Are there activities at the workplace that would preclude the student from safely being present in the workplace?,
- □ What the workplace does and particularly the operations of the specific area the student will be in,
- □ The requirements for specific personal protective equipment or clothing
- □ All workplace rules and instructions must be strictly adhered to.

Workplace Management

The management of the workplace must consider the presence of a student in their workplace for an entire day the same way as they do a new employee or a long term visitor.

- □ Are there activities at the workplace that would preclude the student from safely being present in the workplace?,
- □ Students should be provided with a overview of the company policy and procedures, particularly those relating to safety and health,
- □ Any issued personal protective equipment must be properly fitted to the individual,
- Students must be supervised at all times and not permitted to operate any equipment or process unless trained to the satisfaction of the supervisor and then supervised,
- Specific instructions on entry into high hazard areas.
