Executive Summary

2001 Immigration Levels

- ◆ Manitoba received 4,560 immigrants in the year 2001. This represents 1.82% of the Canadian total of 249,920 during the same period.
- ◆ For two consecutive years, Canada has received more immigrants than its planned upper limit. In 2001, there was an additional 14,920 over the upper limit of 235,000.
- ◆ In the year 2001, Manitoba received 50% of new arrivals in the economic class (1,300 independents and 972 provincial nominees) and 24% in the family class (1,085 persons). Over 25% of Manitoba's arrivals were refugees (1,156 persons).
- ◆ The top city of destination for 3,660 newcomers was Winnipeg (80%). The top source country of new immigrants was the Philippines with 665 persons (15%).

2001 Provincial Nominee Levels

- ◆ In 2000, 515 applicants were nominated by Manitoba and 1,823 applied for federal immigration processing that year.
- ◆ In 2001, 758 principal applicants were nominated and 972 individuals arrived in Manitoba (307 principal applicants). Manitoba's share of the national Provincial Nominee Program total intake of 1,273 persons was 972 immigrants or 76%. (The decline of 11% from 2000 is partially attributed to increased competition from other provinces.)
- ◆ The top source country was Germany with 410 new arrivals (42%) followed closely by the Philippines with 203 arrivals (21%).
