Used to and Would ('d)

We use, **Used to** to talk about an action we did as a habit in the past but we don't now. (I used to smoke, but I quit.) **Would + verb** can also describe a habit in the past. (When I was in university, I would often study all night.)

Summers on the Farm

I used to spend the summer with my Uncle Joe on his farm. I'd get up at the crack of dawn and I'd milk cows, bring in the hay, and feed the chickens. I'd complain like hell about the work, but it really was a good experience.

Writing My Thesis

When I was completing my thesis, I used to write from 9:00 in the morning until 11:00 at night. I did that seven days a week for 4 months. I'd grab a cup of coffee, sit down at the computer and boot it up. I'd review my notes and my data, and I'd get busy typing. Sometimes, I'd forget to take a break. At the end of the day, everybody would leave and I'd still be writing. I was often the only person left in the building. When I finally left for the night, I'd often feel quite nervous.
