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It is 1933 in Winnipeg in the midst of the Great Depression. Beer Baroness Lady Port-Huntly (Isabella Rossellini) announces a global competition to determine the saddest music in the world, and musicians from across the globe pour into town to vie for the whopping \$25,000 prize. Sobbing Mexican Mariachis, dour Scottish Bagpipers, woeful West African drummers and numerous other grief-stricken ensembles give it their all. Not to be ruled out is the splashy entry from the United States of America, led by failed Broadway producer Chester Kent (Mark McKinney) and his muse Narcissa (Maria de Medeiros), who are embroiled in a family reunion as treacherous and twisted as the competition itself.

Playing it straight is about to get very complicated.

Alim is confused. His imaginary friend from childhood, the ghost of Cary Grant, keeps telling him to live a lie – just like in the movies – and so far it's worked! Alim is successfully pretending to be a straight, upper-class English lad, when he's actually a gay Ismali-Canadian. But when his conservative and shrewd Mom comes to town, the whole charade (so to speak) begins to unravel.





In Federico Hidalgo's debut feature A SILENT LOVE, Norman, a quiet, middle-aged college teacher from Montréal embarks on the adventure of his life. He proposes to Gladys, a young, vivacious Mexican woman he met through an Internet agency. Gladys accepts but demands that her widowed mother, Fernanda, live with them in Canada. Delighted and intrigued, Norman agrees and brings his new family north. Despite the newlyweds' best efforts, love eludes them. Gladys becomes impatient and restless, while Norman grows introverted and confused. And Fernanda, the anxious mother-in-law, is marriage counsellor for both. Silently, Norman falls in love with Fernanda, a charming woman only a few years younger than he is. When she senses his attraction and fears the worst, that the feeling might be mutual, she hastily returns to Mexico. Emotional showdowns ensue, and Norman, Gladys and Fernanda must find the courage to overcome great distance, foolish desire, and the obstinate fear of solitude.

After participating in the brutal killing of rioting blacks while in the line of duty, South African homicide/robbery captain, Andre Stander decides to defy the very system he was a part of and sets off on an audacious crime spree: robbing banks during his lunch hour then returning to the scene of the crime to lead the investigation. Finally caught by the same police force he works with, Stander is jailed and, subsequently, befriends Allan Heyl and Lee McCall. Following a daring jailbreak, the "Stander Gang" committs a large number of bank heists that grow increasingly bolder over time. In the eyes of the public, their blatant disregard for authority soon makes them South Africa's most popular anti-heroes. To the police, however, Stander and his gang are the most wanted men in the country.

THE CORPORATION questions the sanity of an institution with the legal status of a person, but one with no concern for "human" values. Revealing the Corporation's psychopathic personality, the film uses dramatic case studies to explore its impacts on our environment, our children, our health, our media, our democracy and even our genes – and what people are doing in response.

A timely, critical inquiry, THE CORPORATION invites players, pawns and pundits on a graphic and engaging quest to reveal the Corporation's inner workings, curious history, controversial impacts and possible futures.

Case studies, anecdotes and true confessions reveal behind-the-scenes tensions and influences in several corporate and anti-corporate dramas. Each story, each portrait, illuminates an aspect of the Corporation's complex character. It's a mix of irreverent, unsettling, metaphoric graphics, classic documentary elements, and appropriated corporate aesthetics, engages viewers while encouraging a critical distance from the outrageous normalcy of corporate culture.

Our Nationhood chronicles the determination and tenacity of the Listuguj Mi'gmaq to share in the natural resources of their traditional lands. The history of this struggle is long, stretching back to the 1752 Treaty for Peace and Friendship signed with the British. The filmmaker takes us through five centuries of Native life in what is now Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Newfoundland and Maine, to provide an indepth historical context for the story of the Listuguj Mi'gmaq people.

As Obomsawin documents the exhaustive negotiations that take place over July and August of 1998, she draws sobering parallels with the 1981 police raids of Listuguj, over fishing rights. On June 11, 17 years earlier, the police turned the reserve into a battlefield. People were beaten, children were separated from their families, and property was confiscated. Obomsawin interviews community members in 1998 and juxtaposes this with footage from her film *Incident at Restigouche*, documenting the 1981 violence.

Our Nationhood is an uncompromising and uplifting portrait of a people determined to affirm themselves on their own terms.
