INDUSTRIAL PRODUCT PRICE INDEX NOVEMBER 2000
Statistics Canada 62-011-XPB

In Canada November 2000, the industrial product price index (1992=100) increased +0.6% to 130.1 over October 2000, and increased +5.2% over November 1999.

RAW MATERIALS PRICE INDEX NOVEMBER 2000

In Canada November 2000, the raw materials price index (1992=100) increased +2.1% to 153.8 over October 2000, and increased +18.9% over November 1999.

The raw materials price index excluding mineral fuels declined -0.5% to 122.8 over October 2000, and increased +3.4% over November 1999.

CRUDE OIL AND NATURAL GAS OCTOBER 2000

In Canada October 2000, production of crude oil increased +3.0% to 10.7 million cubic metres over October 1999. Year-to-date production increased +5.2% to 106.1 million cubic metres over Jan-Oct 1999.

In Canada October 2000, production of natural gas increased +1.8% to 14.2 billion cubic metres over October 1999. Year-to-date production increased +2.3% to 137.5 billion cubic metres over Jan-Oct 1999.

In Canada December 2000 labour force increased +0.1% to 16.2 million, employment increased +0.2% to 15.1 million, unemployment declined -0.8% to 1.1 million, and the unemployment rate declined -0.1% to 6.8% over November 2000.

In Nova Scotia December 2000 labour force increased +0.7% to 467,400, employment increased +1.3% to 425,600, unemployment declined -4.8% to 41,800 and the unemployment rate declined -0.6 percentage points to 8.9% over November 2000.

In Canada December 2000 labour force increased +2.2% to 16.0 million, employment increased +2.2% to 15.0 million, unemployment increased +2.1% to 1.0 million, and the unemployment rate declined -0.1 percentage points to 6.4% over December 1999.

In Nova Scotia December 2000 labour force increased +2.3 to 461,600, employment increased +3.0% to 422,500, unemployment declined -4.6% to 39,200 and the unemployment rate declined -0.6 percentage points to 8.5% over December 1999.

NATIONAL TOURISM INDICATORS 3RD QUARTER 2000

In Canada 3rd quarter 2000, tourism expenditures (unadjusted) increased +6.0% to \$19.5 billion over 3rd quarter 1999. Spending by foreign tourists in Canada increased +4.1% to \$7.0 billion, while spending by Canadian tourists in Canada increased +7.1% to \$12.6 billion.

Employment generated by tourism activity (unadjusted) increased +5.3% to 571,500 persons over 3rd quarter 1999.

BUILDING PERMITS NOVEMBER 2000

In Nova Scotia the value of residential building permits increased +13.2%, but the value of non-residential building permits declined -60.2%.

In Canada November 2000, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.5% to \$3.2 billion over October 2000. Year to date value increased +7.1% to \$34.5 billion over Jan-Nov 1999.

In Nova Scotia November 2000, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -25.4% to \$57.5 million over October 2000. Year to date value increased +0.5% to \$850.0 million over Jan-Nov 1999.

Higher prices for building materials and labour contributed to a +1.0% increase in new housing price index in Halifax in November 2000.

In Canada November 2000, the new housing price index (1992=100) increased +0.4% to 104.3 over October 2000, and increased +2.5% over November 1999.

In Halifax November 2000, the new housing price index (1992=100) increased +1.0% to 116.7 over October 2000, and increased +2.9% over November 1999.

NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES NOVEMBER 2000

In Canada November 2000, unit sales (seasonally adjusted) of new motor vehicles increased +3.4% to 127,292 units over October 2000, and declined -3.3% over November 1999.

In Nova Scotia November 2000, unit sales (seasonally adjusted) of new motor vehicles increased +0.9% to 3,495 units over October 2000, and declined -5.8% over November 1999.

LABOUR FORCE UPDATE - YEAR-END REVIEW 2000

In the last year, and over the last four years Nova Scotia has performed above the national average in growth in labour force participation, and reduction in the unemployment rate.

In Nova Scotia 2000, participation rate (actual) has increased +0.7 percentage points to 61.7% over 1999, and increased +1.8 percentage points since 1997. The unemployment rate declined -0.5 percentage points to 9.1 over 1999, and declined -3.0 percentage points since 1997.

In Canada 2000, participation rate (actual) has increased +0.3 percentage points to 65.9% over 1999, and increased +1.0 percentage points since 1997. The unemployment rate declined -0.8 percentage points to 6.8% over 1999, and declined -2.3 percentage points since 1997.

SERVICES INDICATORS 3RD QUARTER 2000

In Canada 3rd quarter 2000, services sector employment increased +1.3% or by 139,000 full-time jobs over the 2nd quarter 2000. Over the previous year 302,900 jobs (91% full-time) have been created.

Computer and related services GDP (annualized at factor cost) increased +4.3% to \$13.5 billion over the previous quarter and +14.2% over the 3rd quarter 1999. Employment increased +4.4% to 239,000 over the 2nd quarter and +11.6% over the 3rd quarter 1999.

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX DECEMBER 2000

In Canada December 2000, core CPI (consumer price index excluding food and energy) declined -0.3% to 112.7 over November 2000, and increased +2.0% over December 1999.

(Note that the Bank of Canada's target for core CPI is between 1% and 3%.)

In Canada December 2000, the consumer price index (1992=100), not seasonally adjusted, increased +0.1% to 115.1 over November 2000, and increased +3.2% over December 1999.

In Nova Scotia December 2000, the consumer price index (1992=100), not seasonally adjusted, declined -0.2% to 116.0 over November 2000, and increased +3.6% over December 1999.

WHOLESALE TRADE NOVEMBER 2000

In Canada November 2000, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.7% to \$31.7 billion over October 2000, and increased +2.1% over November 1999. Inventories increased +0.7% to \$43.4 over October 2000, and increased +5.4% over November 1999.

In Nova Scotia November 2000, wholesale merchants' sales declined -0.9% to \$577 million over October 2000, and increased +7.0% over November 1999.

In Canada November 2000, merchandise export trade (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.8% to \$35.5 billion over October 2000, and increased +12.2% over November 1999. Year-to-date exports increased +15.4% to \$379.4 billion over Jan-Nov 1999.

In Canada November 2000, merchandise import trade (seasonally adjusted) increased +2.2% to \$31.1 billion over October 2000, and increased +10.1% over November 1999. Year-to-date imports increased +11.5% to \$331.8 billion over Jan-Nov 1999.

In Nova Scotia January-October 2000, merchandise export trade increased +25.4% to \$4.1 billion over Jan-Oct 1999. Merchandise imports increased +24.5% to \$4.6 billion over Jan-Oct 1999.

MONTHLY SURVEY OF MANUFACTURING NOVEMBER 2000

In Canada November 2000, manufacturer's shipments (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.3% to \$45.7 billion over October 2000, and increased +7.5% over November 1999. Inventories increased +1.2% to \$61.7 billion over October 2000, and increased +11.7% over November 1999. Unfilled orders declined -0.1% to \$55.3 billion over October 2000, and increased +2.3% over November 1999. New orders declined -0.1% to \$45.6 billion over October 2000, and increased +7.9% over November 1999. The inventories to shipments ratio increased to 1.35 from 1.34 in October 2000.

In Nova Scotia November 2000, manufacturer's shipments increased +8.2% to \$729 million over October 2000.

RETAIL TRADE NOVEMBER 2000

In Canada November 2000, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.4% to \$23.4 billion over October 2000, and increased +6.1% over November 1999. Unadjusted retail sales increased +7.1% to \$23.8 billion over November 1999.

In Nova Scotia November 2000, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +1.8% to \$716 million over October 2000, and increased +3.4% over November 1999. Unadjusted retail sales increased +3.6% to \$735 million over November 1999.

In Canada November 2000, natural gas sales increased +12.1% to 6.6 billion cubic metres over November 1999. Year-to-date sales increased +8.0% to 59.1 billion cubic metres over Jan-Nov 1999.

In Nova Scotia November 2000, natural gas sales were reported as 391 million cubic metres, and year-to-date sales as 3.2 billion cubic metres.

COMPOSITE INDEX DECEMBER 2000

In Canada December 2000, the composite leading indicator (1992=100) declined -0.4% to 166.6 over November 2000.

This is the first Canadian decline since 1995. The U.S. Composite leading indicator has been declining since May 2000.

Component indices are equally split between increases and declines.

Five of ten indices were positive.

Business and personal services employment increased +0.4% to 2.5 million.
The money supply (M1 1992\$) increased +0.1% to \$93.3 billion.
New orders, durables (1992\$) increased +0.6% to \$23.6 billion.
Furniture and appliances sales (1992\$) increased +0.6% to \$1.5 billion.
Other durable goods sales (1992\$) increased +0.2% to \$7.1 billion

Five of ten indices were negative.

The housing index (1992=100) declined -1.3% to 99.8.
The TSE 300 stock price index (1975=1000) declined -2.9% to 9,804.
The US composite leading indicator (1992=100) declined -0.2 % to 108.0.
The average workweek (manufacturing) declined -0.8% to 38.4 hours.
The shipments to inventories of finished goods ratio declined to 1.91 from 1.92 in November.

CANADA'S INTERNATIONAL TRANSACTIONS IN SECURITIES NOVEMBER 2000

In Canada November 2000, net foreign investment in Canadian securities was an outflow of -\$706 million. Year-to-date net foreign investment in Canadian securities was an inflow of +\$35.2 billion.

In Canada November 2000, net Canadian investment in foreign securities was an inflow of +\$2.6 billion. Year-to-date net Canadian investment in foreign securities was an outflow of -\$45.9 billion.

Note: Outflow indicates an outflow of money from Canada - either Canadians investing abroad, or foreigners withdrawing assets. Inflow indicates an inflow of money into Canada - either Canadians withdrawing assets from abroad or foreigners investing in Canada.

EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE NOVEMBER 2000

In Canada November 2000, the number of beneficiaries (unadjusted) receiving regular benefits declined -7.4% to 419,380 over November 1999.

In Nova Scotia November 2000, the number of beneficiaries (unadjusted) receiving regular benefits

increased +0.3% to 27,700 over November 1999.

MONTHLY SURVEY OF LARGE RETAILERS NOVEMBER 2000

In Canada November 2000, sales the group of large retailers (unadjusted) increased +7.9% to \$7.1 billion over November 1999.

BUILDING PERMITS DECEMBER 2000

Four of ten provinces recorded increases in the value of building permits, with Nova Scotia ranking third highest, in December 2000.

In Canada December 2000, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) increased +2.3% to \$3.2 billion over November 2000. Year-to-date value increased +5.4% to \$37.7 billion over Jan-Dec 1999.

In Nova Scotia December 2000, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) increased +10.8% to \$62.9 million over November 2000. Year-to-date value increased +0.6% to \$912.2 million over Jan-Dec 1999. Over the year, increases in the value of residential building permits (+8.5%) were offset by declines in the value of non-residential building permits (-8.2%).

HELP-WANTED INDEX JANUARY 2001

In Canada January 2001, the help-wanted index (1996=100), seasonally adjusted and smoothed, declined -2.2% to 177 over December 2000, and increased +4.7% over January 2000.

In Nova Scotia January 2001, the help-wanted index (1996=100), declined -1.8% to 162 over December 2000, and declined -3.6% over January 2000.

In Nova Scotia 2000, total natural gas production was 3.6 billion cubic metres. In this start-up year, average production, over the year, was 9.9 million cubic metres per day. In the last quarter, average daily production was about 12.5 million cubic metres.

For the period Jan-Nov the export value (F.O.B. St. Stephens, N.B.) of Nova Scotia natural gas is currently being reported as \$661.6 million. It is estimated that the final export value for 2000 will be about \$750 million.

Statistics Canada also reports total marketable production, priced (Henry-Hub) at the well-head as \$796 million for natural gas, and \$115 million for natural gas by-products. Total 2000 value is estimated to be about \$911 million.

In Nova Scotia January 2001 labour force declined -1.3% to 461,400, employment declined -2.2% to 416,400, unemployment increased +7.7% to 45,000 and the unemployment rate increased +0.9 percentage points to 9.8% over December 2000.

In Canada January 2001 labour force increased +2.1% to 15.9 million, employment increased +2.0% to 14.7 million, unemployment increased +4.3% to 1.2 million, and the unemployment rate increased +0.2 percentage points to 7.5% over January 2000.

In Nova Scotia January 2001 labour force remained unchanged at 449.5, employment declined -0.5% to 400,800, unemployment increased +4.5% to 48,700 and the unemployment rate increased +0.4 percentage points to 10.8% over January 2000.

In Canada December 2000, the new housing price index (1992=100) increased +0.1% to 104.4 over November 2000, and increased +2.4% over December 1999.

In Halifax December, the new housing price index (1992=100) remained unchanged at 116.7, and increased +2.9% over December 1999.

BIOTECHNOLOGY USE AND DEVELOPMENT SURVEY

In Canada 1999, there were 361 biotechnology firms. Revenues increased +25% to \$1.9 billion over 1998 (Ontario = \$635 million; Quebec = \$554 million). Research and development expenditures increased +16% to \$822 million over 1998 (Ontario = \$222 million; Quebec = \$337 million; British Columbia = \$137 million).

In Canada 4th quarter 2000, the machinery and equipment price index (1986=100) increased +1.7% to 135.6 over the previous quarter and increased +2.5% over the 4th quarter 1999.

Increases by industry generally ranged from 1.4% to 3.7%, except for agriculture where the index increased +0.4% over the same period last year.

PRODUCTIVITY GROWTH IN CANADA 1961-99
Statistics Canada Cat. No. 15-204.xie

In Canada 1961-99, labour productivity increased an average of +2.0% per year, and multifactor productivity increased about +1.2% per year.

Labour productivity has been the engine of growth in the services-producing sectors since 1961. Capital has been the engine of growth in the goods-producing sector, until the 1990's when multifactor productivity became predominant.

In general, productivity growth has been passed on to consumers in the form of lower prices, versus higher wages for workers.

As a percentage of GDP investment in machinery and equipment has remained relatively constant, but total investment has declined (lower investment, as a percentage of GDP, in construction).

In Canada 4th quarter 2000, the apartment building construction price index (1992=100) increased +0.8% to 120.6 over the 3rd quarter 2000, and increased +5.5% over the 4th quarter 1999.

In Halifax 4th quarter 2000, the apartment building construction price index (1992=100) increased +0.2% to 111.8 over the 3rd quarter 2000, and increased +2.9% over the 4th quarter 1999.

In Canada January 2001, the consumer price index (1992=100) declined -0.3% to 114.7 over December 2000, and increased +3.0% over January 2000.

In Nova Scotia January 2001, the consumer price index (1992=100) declined -0.6% to 115.3 over December 2000, and increased +2.9% over January 2000.

In Canada January 2001, core CPI (consumer price index excluding food and energy) declined -0.2% to 112.5 over December 2000, and increased +2.0% over January 2000.

(Note that the Bank of Canada's target for core CPI is between 1% and 3%.)

In Canada December 2000, sales of new motor vehicles (seasonally adjusted) increased +2.5% to 131,151 units over November 2000, and declined -8.9% over December 1999. WORKPLACE AND EMPLOYEE SURVEY 1999

Establishments implementing computer technology are bearing the costs of training, equipment and software.

Over 50% of employees in workplaces that invest in computer technology receive formal or informal computer-related training. The propensity to training, however, does not spill over in to non-computer related areas in these workplaces.

Training rates increase relative to the per capita investment increase in computer technology. Where 19% of employees received training where per capita investment was less than \$700, 32% received training in workplaces where per capita investment was greater than \$2,500.

Layoff rates tend to be lower (3.4% vs 5.1%) in workplaces that invest in computer technology. Employment growth was about the same (4.4% vs 4.1%) between computer technology implementors and non-implementors.

Only 7% of employees reported learning computer applications at university or through self-paid formal training. 44% of employees were trained on-the-job, and 23% received formal company-paid training. 45% of employees reported being self-taught on computer applications.

RETIREMENT SAVINGS THROUGH EMPLOYER PENSION PLANS AND REGISTERED RETIREMENT SAVINGS PLANS, 1999

In Canada, 72% or 9.3 million taxfilers aged 25 to 64 saved for retirement in at least one year during the period 1993 to 1999 through either a registered retirement savings plan (RRSP) or through an employer sponsored registered pension plan (RPP).

During the 1993-1999 period, 61% of Canadian taxfilers contributed to RRSP's at least once while 45% participated in an RPP.

Income levels are the most important factor in saving for retirement. As income levels rise, the probability of retirement savings increased. Only 15% of taxfilers who earned less than \$20,000 saved for retirement. Of those who earned between \$20,000-\$39,000 the proportion increased to 63%. The proportion increases to 92% for those with incomes of \$60,000 or more.

In Nova Scotia, only 62.5% of taxfilers aged 25-64 saved for retirement at least once during the 1993-1999 period.

The proportion of taxfilers saving for retirement was lowest in Atlantic Canada (54.7% Newfoundland; 58.1%; New Brunswick; 60.3% PEI and 62.5% Nova Scotia). Statistics Canada has indicated that higher unemployment and lower incomes in the region are significant factors that may explain why the region has lower rates for retirement savings.

In Canada, total public and private investment is expected to reach \$189.6 billion in 2001; an increase of 6.3% over 2000. Revised investment intentions for 2001 released today are 4.5% higher than the 2001 investment intentions released in February.

Offsetting these increases were declines in manufacturing (8.6% to reach \$19.6 billion) and real estate and rental and leasing (down 8.3% to \$7.1 billion).

In Nova Scotia, total public and private investment is expected to reach \$4.3 billion in 2001; an increase of 2.4% over 2000. Revised investment intentions for 2001 released today are 3.5% higher than the 2001 investment intentions released in February.

The national crime rate in Canada, as reported by police agencies, fell by 1.0% in 2000. This was the crime rate's ninth consecutive decline.

Although property crime declined by 4.5%, it remains the most common offense at 4,070.5 incidents per 100,000 persons. Almost 53% of property crime was theft under \$5,000.00. Violent crime increased by 2.8% to 981.7 incidents per 100,000 persons and other criminal code offenses (mischief, arson, prostitution, counterfeiting, etc.) increased by 3.7% to 2,602.9 incidents per 100,000 persons.

Regionally, Saskatchewan had the highest crime rate of 12,730 incidents per 100,000 while Newfoundland had the lowest crime rate at 5,711 per 100,000 persons.

In Nova Scotia, the total crime rate stood at 7,571 offenses per 100,000 persons. On a year over year basis, the crime rate in Nova Scotia declined by 9.1% in 2000. Violent crime was down by 1.6% and property crime fell by 11.6%.

In terms of Census Metropolitan Areas, Halifax had the 6th highest rate of crime in 2000 behind Regina, Saskatoon, Vancouver, Victoria, and Winnipeg. Overall, the crime rate in Halifax decreased by 3.7% including a 6.7% decrease in property crime. Violent crime, however, increased by 12%.

RETAIL SALES, May 2001

In Canada, seasonally adjusted retail sales increased by 0.2% in May 2001 over April 2001. Total retail sales in Canada during May 2001 were \$24.3 billion. May's increase is largely attributable to price effects including higher prices for gasoline, cigarettes, and fresh fruit. On a constant dollar basis, retail sales in May 2001 declined by 0.3%.

Three of seven sectors, "Other retail sales", food, and drug stores saw 1.5%, 1.2% and 1.0% increases respectively. The automotive and furniture sectors were unchanged. Clothing and general merchandise stores experienced declines of 3.2% and 0.4%, respectively.

Seasonally adjusted national retail sales were up 5.6% over May 2000.

In Nova Scotia, seasonally adjusted retail sales increased by 1.8% over April 2001. Total retail sales in Nova Scotia stood at \$722 million in May 2001.

On a year-over-year basis, Nova Scotia's retail sales were up 5.4%.

NATURAL GAS SALES, May 2001

In Canada, during May 2001, sales of natural gas declined 8.2% from May 2000. Total natural gas sales in May 2001 stood at 4,527 million cubic metres.

The decline in the sales of natural gas is due to warmer than normal weather during the month of May. Residential sales were down by 25.5%. Sales to the industrial sector were down 3.3% because of lower demand by electric utilities and the chemical industry.

UNIVERSITY FINANCES, 1999/2000

In Canada, during the 1999-00 academic year, universities' revenues were \$14.9 billion; an increase of 15.7% over 1998-99.

Funding from the three levels of government was up \$1.1 billion; an increase of 15.1% over 1998-99. Students paid an additional \$256 million in tuition and related fees and bequests and donations were up \$156 million.

Despite of the significant increase in government funding, the proportion of government funding to total revenue was 55%; unchanged in 1999-00 over 1998-99. Student fees accounted for 19% of revenues; down from 20% in 1998-99.

Nationally, universities spent \$14.2 billion in 1999-00; an increase of 11.7% over 1998-99. Salaries and benefits accounted for 58% of total expenditures; an increase of 5.0% over 1998-99. Expenditures on scholarships and bursaries increased 23.9% in 1999-00 over 1998-99.

In Nova Scotia, universities revenues' were \$642.3 million in 1999-00. Government funding made up 43.4% of total revenues in 1999-00 and was the lowest in Canada. Revenues from the three levels of government, however, were up 9.4% over 1998-99. Student fees accounted for 25.5% of revenues and were the highest in Canada. Bequests and donations made up of 7.8% of total revenues.

In terms of expenditures, Nova Scotia spent a higher than average share of its expenditures (3.0%) on buildings and maintenance.

In Canada, May 2001, Gross Domestic Product at factor cost was \$798,821 million (1992 prices, annualized rate); an increase of 0.3% over the previous month. May's GDP growth rate is the strongest in seven months.

Service producing industries rose 0.4% in May 2001 due, in part, to one time events in the public sector. Education services and government services GDP rose 1.6% and 1.3% respectively, as 12,700 Toronto teaching support staff and 18,500 public servants in Newfoundland returned to work after strikes in April. Government services were also boosted by the hiring of 37,000 canvassers for the 2001 Census.

Finance and insurance services and transportation and storage were also up 1.3% and 1.0%.

GDP in the goods producing industries was unchanged in May 2001. Within the goods producing sector, manufacturing rose 0.9% while forestry and logging, and mining fell 2.0% and 1.9%.

On a year over year basis, Canada's Gross Domestic Product was up 1.7% over May 2000.

QUARTERLY BUSINESS CONDITIONS SURVEY: MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES, July 2001

In July 2001, Canadian manufacturers remained apprehensive about the prospects in the next three months but were less pessimistic than they had been in the previous quarter.

Only 18% of manufacturers believe that their production will increase in the next three months while 28% thought production would decline. About 54% saw production as unchanged.

Seven percent of manufacturers think that orders will increase in the next quarter. Half of manufacturers believe orders will be unchanged while 43% think they will decline.

Although most manufacturers (68%) believe that their level of finished product inventory is about right, 30% believe that their inventories are too high.

Almost three quarters of manufacturers believe employment in the sector will be unchanged. Only 10% of manufacturers expected to increase employment in the next quarter while 17% expect employment to decline.

INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE BY MODE OF TRANSPORTATION

International merchandise trade goods enter or leave Nova Scotia by air, rail, road, water or other (e.g. pipeline) modes of transportation.

In Nova Scotia 1989 to 2000, almost 84% of all merchandise trade imports, measured by value, were transported by water. The percentage of goods transported by road averaged 8.1%, by air 6.0% by rail 1.8% and 0.5% were transported by other means.

In 2000, imports by water transport mode have increased to 88.3% from 75.4% in 1989. Road transportation has declined to 3.6% from 11.3% in 1989; rail transport has declined to 1.4% from 4.0% in 1989; air transport has declined to 6.4% from 7.9% in 1989.

In Nova Scotia 1989 to 2000, almost 45% of all merchandise trade exports, measured by value, were transported by road. The percentage of goods transported by water averaged 32.5%, by rail 15.7%, by air 4.9% and 2.3% were transported by other means.

In 2000, exports by road transport mode has increased to 45.2% from 36.1% in 1989. Water transportation has declined to 20.0% from 46.5% in 1989; rail transport and air transport have remained unchanged at about 15% and 3.5% respectively. Other transport mode increased to 16.6% in 2000 with the start of natural gas exports to the United States.

INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE JULY 2001 Statistics Canada Cat. No. 65-001-XPB

In Canada July 2001, the international merchandise balance of trade surplus declined to \$5.4 billion over June 2001. The year-to-date balance of trade surplus increased to \$45 billion from \$32 billion Jan-Jul 2000.

FIXED ASSETS 2001

In Canada 2001, it is estimated that by year end the total value of the fixed assets used to produce goods and services will be valued at about \$2.4 trillion (\$1997).

The value of fixed assets have increased +75% over the last 20 years. Machinery and equipment assets have increased +140% to \$778.3 billion in the same period.

The value of fixed assets (\$1997) in Public Administration is valued at \$407.5 billion; in utilities \$344.6 billion; in manufacturing \$308.5 billion; in mining and gas extraction \$247.7 billion; and in information and cultural industries \$201.1 billion.

INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY AND THE PERFORMANCE OF MANUFACTURING FIRMS.

With current releases of provincial income and expenditure accounts and estimates of GDP by industry, please note the following:

Real GDP has been rebased from 1992 prices to 1997 prices.

The concept of GDP at factor cost has been replaced by , GDP at basic prices (includes indirect taxes on factors of production).

Business and government expenditures on software, which were treated as current expenses, have become capital expenditures. This has had the effect of raising the level of provincial GDP from 1981 to the present.

The 1980 SIC has been replaced with the 1997 NAICS.

BUSINESS CONDITIONS SURVEY: MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES, OCTOBER 2001

Canadian manufacturers are increasingly concerned about the pace of production and prospects for employment.

In Canada October 2001, manufacturers (58%) expect that during the next three months the volume of production will remain about the same as the last three months and an additional 8% believe that volume will increase. 34% expect volume to decline.

Orders received by 49% of manufacturers are expected to be about the same as the last quarter, with 5% are expecting increases and 46% declines.

48% consider the present backlog of unfilled orders as about normal, 4%, higher than normal and 48% lower than normal.

Most respondents (79%) believe the finished product inventory to be about right while 1% consider levels to be too low, and 20% believe they are too high.

67% believe that employment during the next three months will change little, 9% expect an increase and 24% a decrease.

Most manufacturers (80%) do not foresee any production difficulties. A small number (7%) think that they may experience a skilled labour shortage, 2% an unskilled labour shortage. 3% expect a working capital shortage and 2% a raw material shortage.

The US composite leading indicator (1992=100) remained unchanged at 107.7.

MULTIFACTOR PRODUCTIVITY 2001

In Canada 2000, multifactor productivity for the business sector increased +1.0% over 1999.
Output increased +5.2% and inputs increased 4.2% in 2000.

*Multifactor productivity growth-the growth of output minus the growth of the combined inputs-is designed to measure the joint influences on economic growth of technological change, efficiency improvements, returns to scale and other factors. Multifactor productivity, therefore, differs from the labour productivity (growth of output minus growth of hours worked) .

Excluding the eight most volatile components* CPI declined -0.3% to 117.8 over October 2001, and increased +1.7% over November 2000.

In Nova Scotia November 2001, the consumer price index (1992=100) declined -0.3% to 116.1 over October 2001, and declined -0.1% over November 2000. Core CPI (consumer price index excluding food and energy) increased +0.1% to 115.5 over October 2001, and increased +2.2% over November 2000.
