


# DailyStats 2004

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#### LONGITUDINAL ADMINISTRATIVE DATABASE

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 89-612-XIE, 12-585-XIE

Data for 2001 have been added to the Longitudinal Administrative Databank (LAD). This databank now spans 20 years, from 1982 to 2001, and contains information about individuals and census families.

The LAD now contains information from the Longitudinal Immigration Database. It covers almost half a million immigrants landed between 1980 and 2000 and provides information on their key characteristics at landing.

#### **FARM PRODUCT PRICE INDEX OCTOBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 21-007-XIB

In Canada October 2003, the farm product price index (1997=100) increased +2.1% to 92.6 over September 2003 and declined -13.5% over October 2002. The FPPI crops increased +3.8% to 90.1 over September 2003 and declined -18.7% over October 2002. The FPPI livestock declined -0.2% to 96.1 over September 2003 and declined -4.4% over October 2002.

#### **RAW MATERIALS PRICE INDEX, NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 62-011-XPB

In Canada, November 2003, the raw materials price index (1997=100) increased +1.5% to 110.3 over October 2003, and declined -3.2% over November 2002.

The raw materials price index excluding mineral fuels increased +1.2% to 90.2 over October 2003, and declined -5.5% over November 2002.

The mineral fuels price index (1997=100) increased +1.6% to 153.6 over October 2003 and declined -0.1% over November 2002.

### **INDUSTRIAL PRODUCT PRICE INDEX NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada 62-011-XPB

In Canada, November 2003, the industrial product price index (1997=100) declined -0.4% to 104.4 over October 2003, and declined -4.0% over November 2002.



# **NATURAL GAS SALES OCTOBER 2003**

Statistics Canada CANSIM 129-0001 - 129-0004

In Canada October 2003, natural gas sales declined -4.9% to 5.7 billion cubic metres over October 2002. Year to date sales increased +1.6% to 56.9 billion cubic metres over Jan-Oct 2002.

#### **QUARTERLY RETAIL COMMODITY SURVEY 3RD QUARTER 2003**

Statistics Canada CANSIM 080-0010

In Canada 3rd quarter 2003, commodity sales increased +3.6% to \$81.7 billion over the 3rd quarter 2002. The largest percentage gain was in health care and personal products sales which increased +6.7% to \$6.1 billion over the 3rd quarter 2002.

#### **GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES ON CULTURE 2001/02**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 87F0001XDB

In Canada 2001/2002, government expenditures on culture increased +7.6% to \$6.8 billion over 2000/2001. Federal government spending increased +8.9% to \$3.2 billion; provincial government spending increased +2.6% to \$2.2 billion, and municipal government spending increased +9.3% to \$1.8 billion.

In Canada 2001/20002, federal government per capita expenditures increased \$7 to \$103, provincial government expenditures increased +\$1 to \$69 per capita, and municipal government expenditures increased +\$4 to \$58 per capita.

In Nova Scotia 2001/2002, federal government expenditures increased to \$106 per capita, provincial government expenditures increased to \$63 per capita and municipal government expenditures increased to \$42 per capita.



#### **LABOUR FORCE SURVEY DECEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 71-001-PPB

Seasonally Adjusted

In Nova Scotia December 2003 labour force declined -0.3% to 482,800, employment increased +0.9% to 439,500, unemployment declined -1.1% to 43,300 and the unemployment rate declined -1.1 percentage points to 9.0% over November 2003.

In Canada December 2003 labour force increased 0.2% to 17.2 million, employment increased +0.3% to 15.9 million, unemployment declined -1.8% to 1.3 million, and the unemployment rate declined -0.1 percentage points to 7.4% over November 2003.

In Nova Scotia December 2003 labour force increased +1.2% to 477,900, employment increased +1.6% to 438,600, unemployment declined -3.7% to 39,300 and the unemployment rate declined -0.4 percentage points to 8.2% over December 2002.

In Canada December 2003 labour force increased +1.7% to 17.0 million, employment increased +1.8% to 15.8 million, unemployment declined -0.6% to 1.2 million, and the unemployment rate declined -0.1 percentage points to 7.0% over December 2002.



#### DOMESTIC SALES OF REFINED PETROLEUM PRODUCTS NOVEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada CANSIM 134-0004

In Canada November 2003, sales of refined petroleum products increased +2.0% to 8.1 million cubic metres over October 2002. Year to date production increased +4.3% to 89.9 million cubic metres over Jan-Nov 2002.

#### **NEW HOUSING PRICE INDEX NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. 62-007-XPB, CANSIM: table 327-0005

In Canada November 2003, the new housing price index (1997=100) increased 0.7% to 119.2 over October 2003, and increased 5.0% over November 2002.

In Halifax November 2003, the new housing price index (1997=100) remained unchanged at 119.7 over October 2003 and increased 3.3% over November 2002.

#### **BUILDING PERMITS NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 64-001-XIE

In Canada November 2003, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -3.9% to \$4.1 billion over October 2003. The year to date value of building permits increased +8.2% to \$46.8 billion over January-November 2002.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) increased +26.8% to \$93.1 million over October 2003. The year to date value of building permits increased +16.9% to \$935.3 million over January-November 2002.

In Halifax November 2003, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) increased +66.4% to \$58.2 million over October 2003. The year to date value of building permits increased +22.9% to \$531.5 million over January-November 2002.



# FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE MARCH 31, 2003

Financial Management System CANSIM 385-0010, 385-0014, 385-0017, 385-0019

In Canada March 31, 2003, federal government net debt declined \$8.2 billion to \$526.5 billion over 2002. The net debt expressed as a percentage of GDP declined 4.1 percentage points to 43.5%. Net debt per capita declined to \$16,691 from \$17,107 in 2002.

NOTE: The Financial Management System (FMS) is used to produce the government financial statistics presented in this release. FMS standardizes individual government accounts to provide consistent and comparable statistics. As a result, FMS statistics may differ from the figures published in individual government financial statements. A reconciliation statement of FMS to Public Accounts is available from Statistics Canada.

#### CULTURE SECTOR LABOUR FORCE

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 87-004-XIE

In Canada 1991 to 2002, total employment in the culture sector increased +31% to 577,000. In the period, self employment increased +57% to 148,000. In 2002 share of total employment was to 3.7%.

In Canada 1991 to 2002 total employment in culture occupations increased +64% to 172,000.

In Canada 1996 to 1999, earnings (1999\$) in culture occupations increased +13.9% to \$28,291.

# **DIAMONDS 1998 - 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 11-621-MIE

In 2003, it is expected that Canada will rank third (just ahead of South Africa) in world diamond production (15% of total production) of rough diamonds. In the period 1998 to 2002, \$2.8 billion (13.8 million carats) worth of diamonds have been mined. In 2002, production increased +53% to \$800 million over 2001.

In the period 1998 to 2001 employment increased from 90 to 700. Salaries averaged \$61,639 per year. Currently about 2,200 are employed in diamond mining related jobs with those in diamond mining operations earning an average of \$64,336 per annum.



#### **EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE, COVERAGE 2002**

Statistics Canada Survey 4428

In Canada 2002, about 55% (680,000) of the unemployed (1.228 million) were potentially eligible for employment insuramnce benefits. Of these, about 84% (571,000) had accumulated sufficient hours to file a claim. (In other words, 42.3% of the unemployed received or will receive employment insurance benefits.)

#### INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE NOVEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 65-001-XIB

In Canada November 2003, the international merchandise trade surplus was \$4.3 billion. The year to date surplus was \$54.4 billion.

In Canada November 2003, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) declined -1.1% to \$32.1 billion over October 2003 and declined -6.7% over November 2002. Year-to-date exports declined -3.2% to \$367.8 billion over Jan-Nov 2002.

In Canada November 2003, international merchandise trade imports increased +1.7% to 27.8 billion over October 2003, and declined -7.6% over November 2002. Year-to-date imports declined -3.8% to \$313.4 billion over Jan-Nov 2002.

Nova Scotia October 2003

In Nova Scotia October 2003, the international merchandise trade deficit was -\$146.0 million. The year to date deficit was -\$257.7 million.

In Nova Scotia October 2003, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) declined -9.7% to \$417.6 million over September 2003 and declined -4.6% over October 2002. Year-to-date exports increased +6.2% to \$4.7 billion over Jan-Oct 2002.

In Nova Scotia October 2003, international merchandise trade imports increased +2.2% to \$563.6 million over September 2003, and increased +19.1% over October 2002. Year-to-date imports increased +15.9% to \$5.0 billion over Jan-Oct 2002.

NOTE: Nova Scotia imports for September 2003 have been revised from \$1.2 billion to \$551.2 million.



# INVESTMENT IN NON-RESIDENTIAL BUILDING CONSTRUCTION 4TH QUARTER 2003

Statistics Canada CANSIM 026-0016

In Canada 4th quarter 2003, investment in non-residential building construction declined -0.3% to \$6.6 billion over the 3rd quarter 2003.

In Nova Scotia 4th quarter 2003, investment in non-residential building construction increased +2.6% to \$147 million over the 3rd quarter 2003.

In Canadian census metropolitan areas (CMA's), non-residential construction declined -0.1% to \$4.8 billion over 3rd quarter 2003.

In Halifax 4th quarter 2003, investment in non-residential building construction increased +1.4% to \$70 million over 3rd quarter 2003.

#### **NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 63-007-XIB

In Nova Scotia November 2003, new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -3.2% to 3,893 over October 2003, and declined -2.2% over November 2002. Unadjusted unit sales declined -1.1% to 3,127 over November 2002.

In Canada November 2003, new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -3.2% to 131,085 over October 2003, and declined -7.3% over November 2002. Unadjusted unit sales declined -9.5% to 115,133 over November 2002.



# **CANADIAN POTATO PRODUCTION 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 22-008-XIE

In Canada 2003, total potato production increased +13.5% to 5.3 million metric tonnes over 2002. In 2002, the farm value of potato production was \$978 million. (2003 value not available)

In Nova Scotia 2003, total potato production declined -7.7% to 50,700 metric tonnes over 2003. In 2002, the farm value of potato production was \$11.7 million. (2003 value not available)



# **TELECOMMUNICATIONS 3RD QUARTER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 56-002-XIE

In Canada 3rd quarter 2003, operating profits in the telecommunications service industry increased +24.5% over the 3rd quarter 2002. Capital expenditures declined -9.5% to \$1.2 billion.

In Canada 3rd quarter 2003, operating profits in the wireless segment of the telecommunications service industry increased +68.9% to \$543 million over the 3rd quarter 2002. Year-to-date capital expenditures declined -36% to \$802 million.

In Canada 3rd quarter 2003, operating profits in the wireline segment of the telecommunications service industry increased +8.3% to \$1.1 billion over the 3rd quarter 2002. Year-to-date capital expenditures declined -21.5% to \$2.3 billion.

#### CANADA'S INTERNATIONAL TRANSACTIONS IN SECURITIES, NOVEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 67-002-XPB

In Canada November 2003, net foreign investment in Canadian securities was an inflow of +\$5.6 billion. Year to date net foreign investment in Canada was an inflow of +\$15.3 billion.

In Canada November 2003, net Canadian investment in foreign securities was an outflow of -\$1.3 billion. Year to date net Canadian investment in foreign securities was an outflow of -\$9.2 billion.

Note: Outflow indicates an outflow of money from Canada - either Canadians investing abroad, or foreigners withdrawing assets. Inflow indicates an inflow of money into Canada - either Canadians withdrawing assets from abroad or foreigners investing in Canada.



# **COMPOSITE INDEX, DECEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 11-010-XPB CANSIM Table 377-0003

In Canada December 2003, the composite leading indicator (1992=100) increased +0.8% to 188.9 over November 2003.

Seven of ten indices were positive. (no chge from Nov)

Business and personal services employment increased +0.2 to 2.6 million. S & P/TSX stock price index (1975=1,000) increased +2.8% to 7,757. The US composite leading indicator increased +0.4% to 112.7. Average workweek (hours) increased +0.3% to 39.0 hours. New orders, durables (\$1992) increased +0.6% to \$20.2 billion. The shipments/inventories of finished goods ratio increased to 1.72. Furniture and appliances sales (\$1992) invreased +0.5% to \$1.9 billion.

Three of ten indices were negative. (up 2 from Nov)

The housing index (1992=100) declined -1.5% to 141.1. Money supply, M1 (\$millions, 1992) declined -0.7% to 116,586. Other durable goods sales (\$1992) declined -0.3% to \$7.8 billion.



#### LARGE RETAILERS NOVEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada CANSIM 080-0009

In Canada November 2003, sales for the group of large retailers (unadjusted) increased +2.6% to \$8.3 billion over November 2002.

#### TRAVEL BETWEEN CANADA AND OTHER COUNTRIES NOVEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 66-001-PIE

In Canada November 2003, Canadian trips abroad (seasonally adjusted) increased +3.9% to 3.5 million trips over October 2003. Unadjusted trips increased +10.5% to 3.0 million trips over November 2002.

In Canada November 2003, travel to Canada (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.4% to 3.4 million trips over October 2003. Unadjusted trips declined -11.9% to 2.4 million trips over November 2002.

#### MONTHLY SURVEY OF MANUFACTURING NOVEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 31-001-XIB

In Nova Scotia November 2003, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) increased +5.5% to \$745 million over October 2003.

In Canada November 2003, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.5% to \$42.2 billion over October 2003, and declined -2.7% over November 2002.

Inventories remained unchanged at \$59.9 billion over October 2003, and declined -4.9% over November 2002.

Unfilled orders declined -0.8% to \$37.2 billion over October 2003, and declined -19.3% over November 2002.

New orders increased +1.0% to \$41.9 billion over October 2003, and declined -2.6% over November 2002.

The inventory-to-shipments ratio increased to 1.42 from 1.41 in October 2003, and declined from 1.45 in November 2002.



#### **CONSUMER PRICE INDEX DECEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 62-001-XIB

In Canada December 2003, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.1% to 122.8 over November 2003, and increased +2.0% over December 2002.

The CPI excluding food and energy declined -0.2% to 121.2 over November 2003, and increased +1.6% over December 2002. CPI excluding the eight most volatile components, declined -0.2% to 123.5 over November 2003, and increased +2.2% over December 2002.

In Nova Scotia December 2003, the consumer price index (1992=100) declined -0.2% to 123.5 over November 2003, and increased +1.5% over December 2002.

In Halifax December 2003, the consumer price index (1992=100) declined -0.2% to 122.7 over November 2003, and increased +1.6% over December 2002.

\*Excluded from the All-items CPI are the following eight volatile components, as defined by the Bank of Canada: fruit, fruit preparations and nuts; vegetables and vegetable preparations; mortgage interest cost; natural gas; fuel oil and other fuel; gasoline; inter-city transportation; and tobacco products and smokers' supplies. The Bank of Canada further adjusts this series to obtain their measure of core inflation, which also excludes the effect of changes in indirect taxes. # **LABOUR MARKET REVIEW 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 75-001-XIE

In Canada 2003, employment increased +2.2% (334,000) to 15.7 million over 2002. The employment rate increased to an all time high of 62.4% of the working population.

Employment in the goods-producing sector increased +1.1% (43,600) to 4.0 million. Employment in the services-producing sector increased +2.5% (290,600) to 11.8 million.

In Nova Scotia 2003, employment increased +1.6% (7,000) over 2002. The employment rate increased to 57.3%, a record high.

# WORKERS' KNOWLEDGE OF RETIREMENT PLANS

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 75-001-XIE

n Canada 2001, the percentage of employees with registered pension plans declined to 40% (5.5 million employees) of all employees from 45% ten years earlier. About 4% of employees in the private (390,000 employees) thought they had a retirement plan, but did not.

In Canada 2001, 51.1% of workers reported participation in at least one retirement plan. In Atlantic Canada, 54.4% of workers reported participation in at least one retirement plan.



# WHOLESALE TRADE NOVEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 63-008-XIB

In Nova Scotia November 2003, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -2.3% to \$629 million over October 2003, and declined -1.3% over November 2002.

In Canada November 2003, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.1% to \$36.5 billion over October 2003, and increased +1.5% over November 2002.

In Canada November 2003, wholesale merchants sales of computers, packaged software and other electronic machinery increased +1.3% to \$2.9 billion over October 2003, and increased +6.0% over November 2002.



# **NATURAL GAS SALES NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada CANSIM 129-0001 - 129-0004

In Canada November 2003, natural gas sales increased +2.9% to 6.9 billion cubic metres over November 2002. Year to date sales increased +1.8% to 63.8 billion cubic metres over Jan-Nov 2002.

#### **EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE, NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada

In Canada November 2003, the number of beneficiaries receiving regular benefits (seasonally adjusted) declined -1.4% to 571,310 over October 2003, and increased +3.8% over November 2002.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, the number of beneficiaries receiving regular benefits (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.8% to 29,880 over October 2003, and declined -3.7% over November 2002.

#### **RETAIL TRADE NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 63-005-XIB

In Canada November 2003, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.3% to \$26.3 billion over October 2003, and increased +1.9% over November 2002. Unadjusted retail sales declined -0.7% to \$26.1 billion over November 2002.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.7% to \$765 million over October 2003, and increased +0.7% over November 2002. Unadjusted sales declined -2.6% to \$774 million over November 2002.



# **EMPLOYMENT, EARNINGS AND HOURS NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 72-002-XIB

In Canada November 2003, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.3% to \$693.37 over October 2003, and increased +0.9% over November 2002. Employment remained unchanged at 13.3 million over October 2003.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.2% to \$598.39 over October 2003, and increased +0.8% over November 2002. Employment declined -1.0% to 379,500 over October 2003.

#### **RAW MATERIALS PRICE INDEX, DECEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 62-011-XPB

In Canada, December 2003, the raw materials price index (1997=100) increased +2.4% to 113.0 over November 2003, and declined -5.1% over December 2002.

The raw materials price index excluding mineral fuels increased +1.9% to 92.0 over November 2003, and declined -3.9% over December 2002

The mineral fuels price index (1997=100) increased +3.2% to 158.3 over November 2003 and declined -6.7% over December 2002.

#### **INDUSTRIAL PRODUCT PRICE INDEX DECEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada 62-011-XPB

In Canada, December 2003, the industrial product price index (1997=100) increased +0.3% to 104.6 over November 2003, and declined -3.4% over December 2002.



# **CRUDE OIL AND NATURAL GAS NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada CANSIM 126-0001, 131-0001

In Canada November 2003, crude oil production increased +4.0% to 12.1 million cubic metres over October 2002. Year-to-date production increased +5.2% to 131.4 million cubic metres over Jan-Nov 2002.

In Canada November 2003, natural gas production declined -4.9% to 13.7 billion cubic metres over October 2002. Year-to-date production declined -3.6% to 151.2 billion cubic metres over Jan-Nov 2002.

#### GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT BY INDUSTRY NOVEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 15-001-XPB

In Canada November 2003, GDP at basic prices, 1997 chained dollars (seasonally adjusted) remained unchanged at \$1.02 trillion (annualized) over October 2003, and increased +1.5% over November 2002.

GDP growth in goods-producing industries remained unchanged at \$319.0 billion (annualized) over October 2003, and increased +1.0% over November 2002.

GDP growth in the services-producing industries remained unchanged at \$700.6 billion (annualized) over October 2003, and increased +1.7% over November 2002.

In the Information and communications technology sector GDP growth increased +0.2% to \$56.5 billion (annualized) over October 2003, and increased +0.9% over November 2002.

In the Energy sector GDP growth increased +1.8% to \$59.2 billion annualized over October 2003, and increased +0.7% over November 2002.

# **FARM PRODUCT PRICE INDEX NOVEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 21-007-XIB

In Canada November 2003, the farm product price index (1997=100) remained unchanged at 93.1 over October 2003 and declined -13.3% over November 2002. The FPPI crops declimed -1.1% to 90.4 over October 2003 and declined -19.3% over November 2002. The FPPI livestock increased +0.9% to 96.5 over October 2003 and declined -4.4% over November 2002.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, the farm product price index (1997=100) declined -3.2% to 98.1 over October 2003 and declined -1.6% over November 2002. The FPPI crops declined -4.6% to 95.8 over October 2003 and declined -1.7% over November 2002. The FPPI livestock declined -1.7% to 97.6 over October 2003 and declined -1.6% over November 2002.

# **AIRCRAFT MOVEMENTS DECEMBER 2003**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 51F0001PIE

In Canada December 2003, the number of aircraft movements in the 42 airports with NAV CANADA towers declined -1.3% to 297,297 over December 2002.

At Halifax International December 2003, the number of aircraft movements increased +6.4% to 6,629 over December 2002.



## DOMESTIC SALES OF REFINED PETROLEUM PRODUCTS DECEMBER 2003

Statistics Canada CANSIM 134-0004

In Canada December 2003, sales of refined petroleum products increased +7.8% to 8.5 million cubic metres over November 2002. Year to date production increased +4.7% to 98.5 million cubic metres over Jan-Dec 2002.

### BUSINESS CONDITIONS SURVEY: MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES, (CANADA) JANUARY 2004

Some concern with low levels of unfilled orders.

In Canada July 2003, manufacturers (55%) expect that during the next three months the volume of production will remain about the same as the last three months and an additional 30% believe that volume will be higher. 15% expect volume to be lower.

Orders received by 66% of manufacturers are expected to be about the same as the last quarter, with 24% expecting increases and 10% declines.

67% consider the present backlog of unfilled orders as about normal, 10%, higher than normal and 23% lower than normal.

Most respondents (85%) believe the finished product inventory to be about right while 7% consider levels to be too low, and 8% believe they are too high.

68% believe that employment during the next three months will change little, 15% expect an increase and 17% a decrease.

Most manufacturers (84%) do not foresee any production difficulties, 5% think that they may experience a skilled labour shortage, 3% a raw materials shortage, 3% a working capital shortage, and 2% expect an unskilled labour shortage.

### BUSINESS CONDITIONS SURVEY: (NOVA SCOTIA) MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES, JANUARY 2004

In Nova Scotia January 2004, manufacturers (46%) expect that during the next three months the volume of production will remain about the same as the last three months and an additional 31% believe that volume will increase. 23% expect volume to decline.

Orders received by 64% of manufacturers are expected to be about right, with 16% expecting increases and 20% declines.

60% consider the present backlog of unfilled orders about the same as the last quarter, 8% higher than normal and 32% lower than normal.

Most respondents (86%) believe the finished product inventory to be about right while 4% consider levels to be too low, and 10% believe they are too high.

69% believe that employment during the next three months will change little, 22% expect an increase and 9% a decrease.

Most manufacturers (83%) do not foresee any production difficulties, 5% think that they may experience a skilled labour shortage, 2% a raw materials shortage, 3% a working capital shortage, and 1% expect an unskilled labour shortage.



# **GRAIN STOCKS December 31, 2003**

In Canada as of December 31, 2003, total wheat stocks increased +28% to 17.6 million tonnes over the same date one year earlier. Other major grain stocks that increased include Barley +57% to 8.3 million tonnes; Canola +28% to 4.1 million tonnes; Oats +41% to 2.2 million tonnes. Grain stocks that declined include soybeans -21% to 1.3 million tonnes; flax -2% to .4 million tonnes.

### **BUILDING PERMITS DECEMBER 2003**

In Canada December 2003, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) increased +12.8% to \$4.6 billion over November 2003. The year to date value of bulding permits increased +7.5% to \$50.8 billion over January-December 2002.

In Nova Scotia December 2003, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -19.7% to \$75.9 million over November 2003. The year to date value of building permits increased +16.3% to \$1.02 billion over January-December 2002.

In Halifax December 2003, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -39.8% to \$35.4 million over November 2003. The year to date value of building permits increased +21.8% to \$571.3 million over January-December 2002.

In Nova Scotia January 2004 labour force increased +0.5% to 485,000, employment declined -0.3% to 438,100, unemployment increased +8.3% to 46,900 and the unemployment rate increased +0.7 percentage points to 9.7% over December 2003.

In Canada January 2004 labour force increased 0.1% to 17.2 million, employment increased +0.1% to 15.9 million, unemployment remained unchanged at 1.3 million, and the unemployment rate remained unchanged at to 7.4% over December 2003.

In Nova Scotia January 2004 labour force increased +1.4% to 472,200, employment increased +0.9% to 421,600, unemployment increased +5.4% to 50,600 and the unemployment rate increased +0.4 percentage points to 10.7% over January 2003.

In Canada January 2004 labour force increased +1.8% to 16.9 million, employment increased +2.0% to 15.6 million, unemployment declined -0.1% to 1.3 million, and the unemployment rate declined -0.2 percentage points to 7.9% over January 2003.

In Canada 4th quarter 2003 the number of businesses with employees increased +0.2% to 1,016,301 over the 3rd quarter 2003, and increased +1.1% over the 4th quarter 2002.

In Nova Scotia 4th quarter 2003 the number of businesses with employees increased by 6 businesses to 29,741 over the 3rd quarter 2003, and increased by 31 businesses (+0.1%) over the 4th quarter 2002.

### **NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES DECEMBER 2003**

In Nova Scotia December 2003, new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -3.2% to 3,761 over November 2003, and declined -12.0% over December 2002. Unadjusted unit sales declined -13.2% to 3,312 over December 2002. In Nova Scotia 2003, new motor vehicle unit sales declined -2.4% to 46,360 over 2002.

In Canada December 2003, new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -9.5% to 117,373 over November 2003, and declined -21.8% over December 2002. Unadjusted unit sales declined -21.2% to 112,870 over December 2002. In Canada 2003, new motor vehicle unit sales declined -6.2% to 865,475 over 2002.



## MONTHLY SURVEY OF MANUFACTURING DECEMBER 2003

In Nova Scotia December 2003, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) declined -1.6% to \$735 million over November 2003.

In Canada December 2003, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) increased +1.0% to \$42.7 billion over November 2003, and declined -0.7% over December 2002.

Inventories declined -0.3% to \$59.8 billion over November 2003, and declined -5.3% over December 2002.

Unfilled orders declined -0.8% to \$36.7 billion over November 2003, and declined -18.1% over December 2002.

New orders increased +1.6% to \$42.4 billion over November 2003, and increased +1.7% over December 2002.

The inventory-to-shipments ratio declined to 1.40 from 1.42 in November 2003, and declined from 1.47 in December 2002.

### INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE DECEMBER 2003

In Canada December 2003, the international merchandise trade surplus was \$5.4 billion. The year to date surplus was \$59.8 billion.

In Canada December 2003, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) increased +3.5% to \$33.4 billion over November 2003 and declined -3.1% over December 2002. Year-to-date exports declined -3.2% to \$401.2 billion over Jan-Dec 2002.

In Canada December 2003, international merchandise trade imports increased +0.7% to 28.0 billion over November 2003, and declined -8.4% over December 2002. Year-to-date imports declined -4.2% to \$341.4 billion over Jan-Dec 2002.

Nova Scotia November 2003

In Nova Scotia November 2003, the international merchandise trade surplus was +\$10.4 million. The year to date deficit was -\$292.8 million.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) declined -2.1% to \$413.0 million over October 2003 and increased +1.2% over November 2002. Year-to-date exports increased +4.9% to \$5.1 billion over Jan-Nov 2002.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, international merchandise trade imports declined -28.9% to \$402.7 million over October 2003, and increased +2.6% over November 2002. Year-to-date imports increased +14.9% to \$5.4 billion over Jan-Nov 2002.

## LIVESTOCK ESTIMATES JANUARY 1, 2004

In Canada January 1, 2004, the national herd of cattle increased +8.7% to 14.7 million head. The number of hogs declined -0.4% to 14.6 million head, and the number of sheep increased +2.2% to 1.0 million head.

In Atlantic Canada January 1, 2004, the region's herd of cattle increased +2.4% to 296,000 head. The number of hogs declined -2.1% to 366,000 head, and the number of sheep increased +3.0% to 34,000 head.

In Canada December 2003, net Canadian investment in foreign securities was an outflow of -\$2.7 billion. Year to date net Canadian investment in foreign securities was an outflow of -\$12.5 billion.

S & P/TSX stock price index (1975=1,000) increased +2.6% to 7,959. The US composite leading indicator increased +0.3% to 113.1. Average workweek (hours) increased +0.3% to 39.1 hours. New orders, durables (\$1992) increased +0.5% to \$20.3 billion. The shipments/inventories of finished goods ratio increased to 1.73. Furniture and appliances sales (\$1992) invreased +0.6% to \$2.0 billion.

Three of ten indices were negative. (no change from Dec)

The housing index (1992=100) declined -2.5% to 137.5. Money supply, M1 (\$millions, 1992) declined -0.3% to 116,756. Other durable goods sales (\$1992) declined -0.6% to \$7.7 billion.

One of ten indicators was unchanged

Business and personal services employment remained unchaged at 2.6 million.


In Canada January 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.1% to 122.9 over December 2003, and increased +1.2% over January 2003.

The CPI excluding food and energy declined -0.1% to 121.1 over December 2003, and increased +1.6% over January 2003. CPI excluding the eight most volatile components, remained unchanged at 123.5 over December 2003, and increased +1.5% over January 2003.

In Nova Scotia January 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.1% to 123.6 over December 2003, and increased +0.4% over January 2003.

In Halifax January 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.1% to 122.8 over December 2003, and increased +0.7% over January 2003.

\*Excluded from the All-items CPI are the following eight volatile components, as defined by the Bank of Canada: fruit, fruit preparations and nuts; vegetables and vegetable preparations; mortgage interest cost; natural gas; fuel oil and other fuel; gasoline; inter-city transportation; and tobacco products and smokers' supplies. The Bank of Canada further adjusts this series to obtain their measure of core inflation, which also excludes the effect of changes in indirect taxes. # **EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE, DECEMBER 2003**

In Canada December 2003, the number of beneficiaries receiving regular benefits (seasonally adjusted) declined -1.4% to 559,890 over November 2003, and increased +2.4% over December 2002.

In Nova Scotia December 2003, the number of beneficiaries receiving regular benefits (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.7% to 29,650 over November 2003, and declined -3.1% over December 2002.

### FARM CASH RECEIPTS 2003

### **ANNUAL**

In Canada 2003, farm cash receipts declined -5.0% to \$34.2 billion over 2002. Livestock cash receipts declined -11.1% to \$16.2 billion, crop cash receipts declined -8.4% to \$13.2 billion, and payments cash receipts (net income stablisation, crop insurance, etc.) increased +41.6% to \$4.9 billion.

In Nova Scotia 2003, farm cash receipts increased +2.8% to \$416 million over 2002. Livestock cash receipts declined -2.2% to \$256.5 million, crop cash receipts increased +8.6% to \$143.0 million, and payments cash receipts (net income stablisation, crop insurance, etc.) increased +47.8% to \$16.8 million.

## 4TH QUARTER

In Canada Oct-Dec 2003, farm cash receipts declined -8.5% to \$9.5 billion over Oct-Dec 2002. Livestock cash receipts declined -14.0% to \$4.1 billion, crop cash receipts declined -15.5% to \$3.6 billion, and payments cash receipts (net income stablisation, crop insurance, etc.) increased +30.8% to \$1.8 billion.

In Nova Scotia Oct-Dec 2003, farm cash receipts increased +1.8% to \$116 million over Oct-Dec 2002. Livestock cash receipts declined -4.0% to \$57.1 million, crop cash receipts declined -0.3% to \$49.0 million, and payments cash receipts (net income stablisation, crop insurance, etc.) increased +91.9% to \$9.6 million.

## CHARACTERISTICS OF INTERNATIONAL TRAVELLERS 3RD QUARTER 2003

In the 3rd quarter 2003, international traveller trips to Canada declined -13.5% to 7.3 million over the 3rd quarter 2002. Total expenditures declined -19.5% to \$4.9 billion.

In the 3rd quarter 2003, Canadian trips abroad declined -1.7% to 5.4 million trips over the 3rd quarter 2002. Total expenditures increased +0.2% to \$3.7 billion.



# FINANCIAL STATISTICS FOR ENTERPRISES 4TH QUARTER 2003

In Canada 4th quarter 2003, corporate after-tax profits (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.1% to \$26.1 billion over the 3rd quarter 2003. Operating revenue increased +1.0% to \$598.9 billion and operating profit increased +3.3% to \$42.9 billion over the 3rd quarter 2003.

In Canada 2003, corporate after-tax profits (seasonally adjusted) increased +37.0% to \$105.8 billion over 2002. Operating revenue increased +4.0% to \$2.4 trillion and operating profit increased +15.1% to \$168.3 billion over 2002.

## INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL ACCOUNT 4TH QUARTER 2003

In Canada 4th quarter 2003, the international travel account posted a deficit of \$1.4 billion. Total receipts increased +6.6% to \$3.7 billion, and total payments increased +8.3% to \$5.1 billion over the 3rd quarter 2003.

In Canada 2003, the international travel account posted a deficit of \$4.3 billion. Total receipts declined -12.8% to \$14.6 billion, and total payments increased +1.7% to \$18.9 billion over the 2002.

## PUBLIC AND PRIVATE INVESTMENT 2004

In Nova Scotia 2004, public and private capital spending intentions increased +0.8% to \$5.5 billion over 2003. In 2003, actual public and private investment declined -5.5% to \$5.4 billion over 2002.

In Canada 2004, public and private capital spending intentions increased +3.1% to \$223.8 billion over 2003. In 2003, actual public and private investment increased +3.8% to \$217.2 billion over 2002.



## **EMPLOYMENT, EARNINGS AND HOURS DECEMBER 2003**

In Canada December 2003, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) increased +1.1% to \$699.19 over November 2003, and increased +1.6% over December 2002. Employment increased +0.6% to 13.5 million over November 2003.

In Nova Scotia December 2003, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) increased +1.0% to \$602.95 over November 2003, and increased +1.3% over December 2002. Employment declined -0.3% to 385,600 over November 2003.

### WHOLESALE TRADE DECEMBER 2003

In Nova Scotia December 2003, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -5.5% to \$593 million over November 2003, and declined -5.2% over December 2002. In 2003, sales increased +3.3% to \$7.5 billion over 2002.

In Canada December 2003, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.8% to \$36.9 billion over November 2003, and increased +2.2% over December 2002. In 2003, sales increased +3.6% to \$433.8 billion over 2002.

In Canada December 2003, wholesale merchants sales of computers, packaged software and other electronic machinery increased +0.6% to \$2.0 billion over November 2003, and declined -6.5% over December 2002.

In Nova Scotia December 2003, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.2% to \$765 million over November 2003, and declined -1.0% over December 2002. Unadjusted sales declined -1.5% to \$701 million over December 2002.

The goods surplus declined to \$15.1 billion, the services deficit increased to -\$2.9 billion and the investment income deficit increased to -\$5.7 billion.

# ANNUAL

In Canada 2003, the current account surplus (seasonally adjusted) increased to \$25.8 billion from a \$23.4 billion surplus in 2002. The goods surplus increased to \$60.2 billion, the services deficit increased to -\$11.5 billion and the investment income deficit declined to -\$23.5 billion.

In Canada 4th quarter 2003, residential construction investment increased +11.6% to \$16.0 billion over 4th quarter 2002. In 2003 residential construction investment increased +11.5% to \$61.4 billion over 2002.

In Nova Scotia 4th quarter 2003, residential construction investment increased +5.4% to \$378.8 million over 4th quarter 2002. In 2003 residential construction investment increased +11.7% to \$1.6 billion over 2002.

### **GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT BY INDUSTRY DECEMBER 2003**

In Canada December 2003, GDP at basic prices, 1997 chained dollars (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.5% to \$1.03 trillion (annualized) over November 2003, and increased +1.9% over December 2002.

GDP growth in goods-producing industries increased +0.9% \$324.7 billion (annualized) over November 2003, and increased +1.5% over December 2002.

GDP growth in the services-producing industries increased +0.3% to \$703.0 billion (annualized) over November 2003, and increased +2.1% over December 2002.

In the Information and communications technology sector GDP growth increased +0.1% to \$57.1 billion (annualized) over November 2003, and increased +2.4% over December 2002.

In the Energy sector GDP growth increased +0.9% to \$60.2 billion annualized over November 2003, and increased +0.5% over December 2002.

## CANADIAN ECONOMIC ACCOUNTS 4TH QUARTER 2003

In Canada 4th quarter 2003, real gross domestic product (\$1997 chained) increased +0.9% to \$1.1 trillion over 3rd quarter 2003. Consumer spending remained unchanged at \$626.0 billion; exports (goods & services) increased +3.2% to \$442.8 billion.

In Canada 4th quarter 2003 (\$current), corporate profits increased +3.5% to \$149.6 billion; personal income increased +0.9% to \$623.4 billion.

In Canada 4th quarter 2003, real gross domestic product (\$chained 1997) increased +3.8% on an annualized basis (growth rate compounded annually) and increased +1.6% on a year-over-year basis (compared to the same quarter in the previous year)

In Canada 2003, real gross domestic product (chained \$1997) increased +1.7% over 2002.



# CRUDE OIL AND NATURAL GAS JANUARY 2004

Statistics Canada CANSIM 126-0001, 131-0001

In Canada January 2004, crude oil production increased +6.1% to 12.6 million cubic metres over January 2003. This increase was a result of a 52.3% jump in crude bitumen production from the Athabasca Oil Sands project in Alberta.

Crude oil exports, which accounted for 65.1% of total production, increased by 13.2% over Janury 2003.

In Canada January 2004, natural gas production declined -1.4% to 15.2 billion cubic metres over January 2003. Domestic Sales and exports of natural gas rose 5.5% and 1.6% respectively over the same period. The increase in domestic Sales was attributed to colder-than-normal weather conditions in most regions of the country.



# **RAW MATERIALS PRICE INDEX, JANUARY 2004**

In Canada, January 2004, the raw materials price index (1997=100) increased +2.4% to 115.9 over December 2003, and declined -7.4% over January 2003.

The Forestry and logging sector capacity utilization rate increased +3.4 percentage points to 91.2 over the 3rd quarter 2003. In 2003 the industrial capacity utilization rate (annual average) increased +6.8 percentage points to 90.7 over 2002.

The Manufacturing sector capacity utilization rate increased +2.1 percentage points to 84.0 over the 3rd quarter 2003. In 2003 the industrial capacity utilization rate (annual average) declined -0.4 percentage points to 82.9 over 2002.

The Mining, Oil and Gas extration sector capacity utilization rate increased +1.6 percentage points to 72.2 over the 3rd quarter 2003. In 2003 the industrial capacity utilization rate (annual average) increased +1.1 percentage points to 70.2 over 2002.

The Construction sector capacity utilization rate increased +0.7 percentage points to 86.7 over the 3rd quarter. In 2003 the industrial capacity utilization rate (annual average) declined -0.8 percentage points to 86.2 over 2002.

In Canada December 2003, the international merchandise trade surplus was \$5.4 billion. The year to date surplus was \$59.8 billion.

In Canada December 2003, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) increased +3.5% to \$33.4 billion over November 2003 and declined -3.1% over December 2002. Year-to-date exports declined -3.2% to \$401.2 billion over Jan-Dec 2002.

In Canada December 2003, international merchandise trade imports increased +0.7% to 28.0 billion over November 2003, and declined -8.4% over December 2002. Year-to-date imports declined -4.2% to \$341.4 billion over Jan-Dec 2002.

## Nova Scotia November 2003

In Nova Scotia November 2003, the international merchandise trade surplus was +\$10.4 million. The year to date deficit was -\$292.8 million.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) declined -2.1% to \$413.0 million over October 2003 and increased +1.2% over November 2002. Year-to-date exports increased +4.9% to \$5.1 billion over Jan-Nov 2002.

In Nova Scotia November 2003, international merchandise trade imports declined -28.9% to \$402.7 million over October 2003, and increased +2.6% over November 2002. Year-to-date imports increased +14.9% to \$5.4 billion over Jan-Nov 2002.

Inventories increased +0.5% to \$58.6 billion over December 2003, and declined -4.1% over January 2003.

Unfilled orders increased +2.6% to \$35.8 billion over December 2003, and declined -12.1% over January 2003.

New orders increased +2.5% to \$46.4 billion over December 2003, and increased +3.2% over January 2003.

The inventory-to-shipments ratio increased to 1.29 from 1.28 in December 2003, and declined from 1.30 in January 2003.

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### Note to readers

With the January 2004 release, estimates of shipments, inventories and orders have been revised back to January 1999. Although the historical month-to-month movements were preserved, there were adjustments made to the levels of the Monthly Survey of Manufacturing (MSM).

These adjustments were due to several factors: the use of new and revised data; updates to the industrial classification (NAICS); the updating of the seasonal adjustment factors; and most significantly, the benchmarking of the MSM to the 2000 and 2001 Annual Survey of Manufactures levels.

The average level of adjustment for shipments from reference year 1999 to 2003 was +5.5%.

In Canada January 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.2% to 123.2 over January 2004, and increased +0.7% over February 2003.

The CPI excluding food and energy increaded +0.1% to 121.2 over January 2004, and increased +1.1% over February 2003. CPI excluding the eight most volatile components, increased +0.2 to 123.7 over January 2004, and increased +1.1% over February 2003.

In Nova Scotia February 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100)increased +0.5% to 124.2 over January 2004, and declined -0.1% over February 2003.

In Halifax February 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.3% to 123.2 over January 2004, and increased +0.2% over February 2003.

# STUDENT READING PERFORMANCE IN MINORITY LANGUAGE SCHOOLS

STUDENT READING PERFORMANCE IN MINORITY LANGUAGE SCHOOLS Statistics Canada Cat. No. 81-003-XIE, Vol. 9, No. 4

The results of two studies that examined the reading abilities of 15-year-olds in French and English school systems as well as students in French-immersion programs was reported in the March 2004 issue of the "Education Quarterly Review".

The first study showed that students in French school systems in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Ontario and Manitoba had significantly lower reading performance than those students in English school systems. In Quebec there was little difference in the reading performance between French and English school systems.

The second study compared reading performance between students in French-immersion programs and those in non-immersion programs. Students in French-immersion programs had higher reading scores than students in non-immersion programs in all provinces except Manitoba. The study showed no difference in Manitoba.

The report analysis some underlying factors that may be contributing to the results.

Furniture and appliances sales (\$1992) increased +0.9% to \$2.0 billion.

Three of ten indices were negative. (one less than January)

The housing index (1992=100) declined -1.6% to 135.4. Average workweek (hours) decreased -0.5% to 38.4 hours. Other durable goods sales (\$1992) declined -1.7% to \$7.6 billion.

One of ten indicators was unchanged

Business and personal services employment remained unchaged at 2.6 million.

Total assets increased +16.7 billion to \$915.9 billion over the 3rd quarter 2003.

Total liabilities increased +4.1 billion to \$1,121.8 billion over the 3rd quarter 2003.

Canada's direct investment abroad increased 2.8% over 3rd quarter to \$398.2 billion while foreign direct investment in Canada declined 0.3% to \$357.7 billion in the same period.

Household net worth (seasonally adjusted) grew 1.1% in the 4th quarter compared to 0.8% growth in the previous quarter. Household debt (consumer credit and mortgages) stood at \$102.9 for every \$100 of disposable income.

## PERMANENT LAYOFF RATES

The strongest monthly growth at the national level was seen in General Merchandise Stores (+5.3%), followed by Drug and Patent Medicine Stores (+3.0%) and Clothing Stores (+1.7%). A -1.2% decline occured in Furniture Store sales.

In Nova Scotia January 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.1% to \$766 million over December 2003, and increased +0.8% over January 2003. Unadjusted sales increased +1.0% to \$666 million over January 2003.

# FARMING OPERATING REVENUES & EXPENDITURES 2002( final)

Statistics Canada

In Canada the average operating revenues per farm increased 4.8% to \$202,660 and average operating expenses went up 4.9% to \$172,410 from 2001 to 2002. Consequently, average operating margins dropped 0.1 cents to 14.9 cents per dollar of revenue.

Among all farm types, poultry and eggs farms ranked first in average operating revenues (\$722,630) in 2002, followed closely by hog and pig farms (\$720,461) and greenhouse and nursery production (\$683,518).

On a revenue-class basis, farms with operating revenues of between \$100,000 and \$249,999 had the highest operating margins, estimated at 21.2 cents, a decrease of 0.4 cents from 2001. All revenue classes below \$250,000 reported a decrease in operating margins, while all revenue classes of \$250,000 and above reported an incraese in operating margins.

Grain and oilseed farms had the highest operating margins at 23.9 cents per dollar of revenue, up 1.1 cents from 2001. Dairy farms ranked second at 23.4 cents, down 0.8 cents from 2001. Hog and pig farms experienced the largest decrease in operating margins by -5.9 cents to 7.5 cents per dollar of operating revenue in 2002.

Farms with sales of \$500,000 and over accounted for 53.2% of farming revenues in 2002, compared with 38.7% in 1997.

Note: Operating margin is defined as one dollar minus operating expenses (before depreciation) per dollar of revenue. These estimates cover unincorporated farms with gross operating revenues of \$10,000 and over, and corporations with total farm sales of \$25,000 and over for which 50.0% or more of sales come from agricultural activities.

In Canada February 2004 sales of refined petroleum products increased +2.8% to 7.9 million cubic metres over February 2003. Year to date, January-February 2004 production increased +3.2% to 16.3 million cubic metres over January-February 2003.

In Canada January 2004, lumber production declined 6.9% over January 2003 to 6.4 million cubic metres. Year 2003 production decreased 1.6% over 2002 to 79.2 million.

## **LOCAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE December 31, 2001**

In Canada December 31, 2001 local government net debt (liabilities - assets) increased \$2.2 billion or 21.9% from December 31, 2000 to 12.2 billion. Financial assets = \$50.5 billion; liabilities = \$62.7 billion.

In Nova Scotia December 31, 2001 local government net debt (assets - liabilities)increased \$31 million from December 31, 2000 to \$357 million.

Note: The Financial Management System (FMS) provides a standardized presentation of government accounting for the federal, provincial and local governments in Canada. The individual governments' accounting systems are not directly comparable because the policies and structure of governments differ. The FMS adjusts data from governments' public accounts and other records to provide detailed data that permit inter-government comparisons as well as compatible national aggregates that are consistent over time. In other words, FMS statistics may not accord with the figures published in government financial statements.

## **CONSOLIDATED GOVERNMENT FINANCE MARCH 31, 2002**

Financial Management System (FMS) Basis

In Canada March 31, 2002 consolidated government net debt (liabilities - assets) declined to \$796.3 billion over March 31 2001, a decrease of 0.1%. Net debt as a percentage of GDP declined from 71.5% to 71.0% in 2002. Per capita net debt declined from \$25,785 to \$25,476 in 2002.

Newfoundland and Labrador registered the highest per capita net debt at \$18,867, while Nova Scotia's was \$12,466. ALberta, Yukon and the Northwest Territories did not register any net debt.

The individual governments' accounting systems are not directly comparable because the policies and structure of governments differ. The FMS adjusts data from governments' public accounts and other records to provide detailed data that permit intergovernment comparisons as well as compatible national aggregates that are consistent over time. In other words, FMS statistics may not accord with the figures published in government financial statements.

### **BUILDING PERMITS FEBRUARY 2004**

In Canada February 2004 the value of building permits increased 1.6% over January 2004 to \$4.4 billion. Year to date, January to February 2004 building permits of \$8.7 billion represented a 3.4% increase over January to February 2003.

In Nova Scotia February 2004 the value of building permits declined 12.8% over January 2004 to \$68.1 million. Building permits valued at \$146.3 million in January to February 2004 increased 10.9% over the January to February 2003 period.

In Halifax February 2004 the value of building permits declined 8.1% over January 2004 to \$31.5 million. Permits were valued at \$65.7 million during January to February 2004, down 13.0% from the same period in 2003.



# WHOLESALE TRADE FEBRUARY 2004

In Nova Scotia February 2004, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +3.4% to \$616 million over January 2004, and declined -2.6% over February 2003. Five of the ten provinces posted declines over January 2004.

In Canada February 2004, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) decreased -0.3% to \$35.7 billion over January 2004, and decreased -2.1% over February 2003.

In Canada February 2004, wholesale merchants sales of motor vehicle parts and accessories decreased -3.6% to \$5.9 billion over Janury 2004, and declined -17.5% over February 2003.

# INVESTMENT IN NON-RESIDENTIAL BUILDING CONSTRUCTION 1ST QUARTER 2004

In Canada 1st quarter 2004, investment in non-residential building construction declined -0.3% to \$6.7 billion over the 4th quarter 2003. Despite the decline this is still a record high amount for the first quarter of any year. Investment was higher in the institutional sector as governments spent a record \$2.5 billion, mostly on health care facilities. Investment in industrial construction remained flat at \$1.2 billion while investment in the commercial sector stood at \$3.0 billion, a decline of 1.5% over the previous quarter.

In Nova Scotia investment in non-residential building construction declined -14.2% to \$127 million over the 4th quarter 2003. Six of the provinces/territories saw an increase over the previous quarter. The largest growth, in absolute dollars, took place in Ontario with a gain of 1.3% to \$3.1 billion while Quebec had the largest decline at \$1.4 billion or -3.3%.

In Canadian census metropolitan areas (CMA's), non-residential construction declined -0.6% to \$4.8 billion over 4th quarter 2003. Seventeen of the twenty-eight CMA's had a drop in investment over the previous quarter. Halifax investment in non-residential building construction decreased -13.6% to \$61 million over 4th quarter 2003.

### **NEW HOUSING PRICE INDEX FEBRUARY 2004**

In Canada February 2004, the new housing price index (1997=100) increased 0.4% to 120.4 over January 2004, and increased 4.9% over February 2003.

In Halifax February 2004, the new housing price index (1997=100) remained unchanged at 121.1 over January 2004 and increased 3.5% over February 2003.

### **TELECOMMUNICATIONS 4TH QUARTER 2003**

In Canada Jan-Dec 2003, operating profits increased +23.0% to \$5.7 billion over Jan-Dec 2002. Operating revenues were unchanged at \$32.6 billion. Capital expenditures declined -14.9% to \$4.8 billion.



## INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE FEBRUARY 2004

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 65-001-XIB

In Canada February 2004, the international merchandise trade surplus was \$5.7 billion. The year to date surplus was \$10.7 billion.

In Canada February 2004, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) increased +7.0% to \$34.1 billion over January 2004 and declined -2.2% over February 2003. Year-to-date exports declined -5.6% to \$65.9 billion over Jan-Feb 2003.

In Canada February 2004, international merchandise trade imports increased +6.1% to 28.4 billion over January 2004, and declined -5.1% over February 2003. Year-to-date imports declined -7.7% to \$55.2 billion over Jan-Feb 2003.

Nova Scotia February 2004 (not seasonally adjusted)

In Nova Scotia february 2004, the international merchandise trade deficit was -\$183.5 million. The year to date deficit was -\$159.4 million.

In Nova Scotia February 2004, international merchandise trade exports increased +7.4% to \$414.3 million over January 2004 and increased +4.6% over February 2003. Year-to-date exports decreased +6.4% to \$5.1 billion over Jan-Feb 2003.

In Nova Scotia February 2004, international merchandise trade imports increased +65.4% to \$597.8 million over January 2004, and increased +8.6% over February 2003. Year-to-date imports increased +7.2% to \$959.3 million over Jan-Feb 2003.



## MONTHLY SURVEY OF MANUFACTURING FEBRUARY 2004

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 31-001-XIB

In Nova Scotia February 2004, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) decreased -3.3% to \$691 million over January 2004. Six provinces had higher shipments in February

In Canada February 2004, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.8% to \$45.8 billion over January 2004, and declined -1.4% over February 2003. This is the highest level since last September.

Inventories decreased -0.8% to \$58.0 billion over January 2004, and declined -5.6% over February 2003. This is the ninth decrease in the last ten months.

Unfilled orders increased +0.6% to \$36.1 billion over January 2004, and declined -10.9% over February 2003. The increase was mainly the result of new contracts in the aerospace industry and reverses a negative trend that has been apparent since mid-2001.

New orders declined -0.8% to \$46.0 billion over January 2004, and decreased -0.5% over February 2003.

The inventory-to-shipments ratio decreased to 1.27 from 1.29 in January 2004, and declined from 1.32 in February 2003. This is the lowest level for the ratio in over four years.

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### Note to readers

With the January 2004 release, estimates of shipments, inventories and orders have been revised back to January 1999. Although the historical month-to-month movements were preserved, there were adjustments made to the levels of the Monthly Survey of Manufacturing (MSM).

These adjustments were due to several factors: the use of new and revised data; updates to the industrial classification (NAICS); the updating of the seasonal adjustment factors; and most significantly, the benchmarking of the MSM to the 2000 and 2001 Annual Survey of Manufactures levels.

The average level of adjustment for shipments from reference year 1999 to 2003 was +5.5%.



# **ELECTRONIC COMMERCE AND TECHNOLOGY 2003**

Statistics Canada

In Canada 2003, the percentage of private sector firms that use the internet increased to 78.2% from 75.7% in 2002. The percentage with web sites increased to 34.0% from 31.5%. The percentage that purchase over the internet increased to 37.2% from 31.7% and the percentage that sell over the internet decreased to 7.1% from 7.5% (\$18.6 billion = 0.8% total operating revenue).

In Canada 2003, in information and cultural industries 93.5% of firms use the internet; 61.4% have a web site; 56.5% purchase over the internet; and 22.3% sell over the internet (\$1.4 billion = 1.8% of total operating revenue).

In Canada 2002, the number of stillbirths (gestational age 28 weeks+) dropped +6.3% to 1,028 over 2001. Stillbirths per 1,000 births decreased to 3.1 from 3.3 in 2001.

In Nova Scotia February 2004, new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) declined -16.3% to 3,341 over February 2003, and decreased -4.8% over January 2004. Unadjusted unit sales declined -17.2% to 2,257 over February 2003.

In Canada February 2004, new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) decreased -12.1% to 128,043 over February 2003, and increased +7.7% over January 2004. Unadjusted unit sales declined -10.1% to 94,778 over February 2003.

In Canada March 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.3% to 123.6 over February 2004, and increased +0.7% over March 2003.

The CPI excluding food and energy increased +0.3% to 121.6 over February 2004, and increased +1.2% over March 2003. CPI excluding the eight most volatile components, increased +0.3 to 124.1 over February 2004, and increased +1.3% over March 2003.

In Nova Scotia March 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100)increased +0.6% to 125.0 over February 2004, and declined -0.1% over March 2003.

In Halifax March 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.6% to 124.0 over February 2004, and increased +0.2% over March 2003.



# **QUARTERLY RETAIL COMMODITY SURVEY 4TH QUARTER 2003 AND 2003**

In Canada 4th quarter 2003, commodity sales increased +1.5% to \$84.0 billion over the 4th quarter 2002. The largest percentage gain was in health care and personal products sales which increased +7.1% to \$6.7 billion over the 4th quarter 2002.

All retail stores sales increased 3.0% over 2002 to \$317.1 billion in 2003. The largest percentage gain was in automotive fuels, oils and additives sales, up +6.7% over 2002 to \$24.2 billion, as well as, health care and personal product sales which increased +6.4% over 2002 to \$24.6 billion in 2003.

## **COMPOSITE INDICATORS, MARCH 2004**

In Canada March 2004, the composite leading indicator (1992=100) increased +0.7% to 192.0 over January 2004.

Seven of ten indices were positive. (up 1 from Feb). The housing component swung from negative to positive territory in March. Manufacturing and the US leading indicator continued to drive overall growth for the third straight month.

S & P/TSX stock price index (1975=1,000) increased +2.0% to 8,395. The US composite leading indicator increased +0.4% to 113.9. Money Supply, M1(\$ millions, 1992) increased +0.9% to 119,579. New orders, durables (\$1992) increased +2.9% to \$21.5 billion. The shipments/inventories of finished goods ratio increased +0.03% to 1.77. Furniture and appliances sales (\$1992) increased +0.7% to \$2.0 billion. The housing index (1992=100)rose +1.1% to 137.2.

Three of ten indices were negative.

Average workweek (hours) decreased -0.3% to 38.6 hours. Other durable goods sales(\$1992)decreased -1.7% to \$7.5 billion. Business and personal services employment declined 0.2% to 2.6 million.



# **NATURAL GAS FEBRUARY 2004**

In Canada February 2004, natural gas sales decreased -2.0% to 8.3 billion cubic metres over February 2003. This decrease was a result of warmer than normal weather conditions across the country.

The residential sector showed a drop of 2.5%, while the commercial sector had a larger decline of -5.5%. The industrial sector (including direct sales) showed a slight increase in sales of 0.2%.



## LARGE RETAILERS FEBRUARY 2004

In Canada February 2004, sales for the group of large retailers (seasonally adjusted) decreased -0.6% to \$7.5 billion over January 2004.

The group of large retailers represents about 28% of total annual retail sales.

## PRINCIPAL FIELD CROPS SEEDING INTENTIONS MARCH 31, 2004

In Canada March 31, 2004, the seeding intentions of wheat (total) is expected to decrease -2.1% to 25.7 million acres over 2003. Spring wheat planting is expected to decrease -1.8% to 18.2 million acres) and durum wheat -1.8% to 6.0 million acres.

Seeding intentions are expected to increase for soybeans (+16.3% to 3.0 million acres), canola (+9.0% to 12.8 million acres), flaxseed (+4.6% to 1.9 million acres) and field peas (+4.2% to 3.4 million acres).

Seeding intentions are expected to decline for oats (-10.1% to 5.0 million acres), barley (-6.2% to 11.7 million acres) and summerfallow (-2.5% to 8.7 million acres).



## **FARM PRODUCT PRICE INDEX FEBRUARY 2004**

In Canada February 2004, the farm product price index (1997=100) rose 1.3% over January 2004 to 95.4 and declined 14.3% from February 2003. The FPPI crops declined -1.3% over January 2004 to 89.3 and declined -20.8% over February 2003. The FPPI livestock increased 2.7% over January 2004 to 99.9 and declined -9.2% over February 2003.

In Nova Scotia February 2004, the farm product price index (1997=100) declined -0.8% over January 2004 to 100.4 and was unchanged from February 2003. The FPPI crops declined -3.6% over January 2004 to 95.0 and declined -5.9% February 2003. The FPPI livestock fell 0.6% over January 2004 to 101.6 and declined -0.9% over February 2003.

In Nova Scotia February 2004, the number of beneficiaries receiving regular benefits (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.9% to 30,490 over January 2004, and increased +1.8% over February 2003.

### **RETAIL TRADE FEBRUARY 2004**

In Canada February 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +2.3% to \$27.0 billion over January 2004, and increased +1.9% over February 2003. Unadjusted retail sales increased +4.2% to \$22.1 billion over February 2003.

The strongest monthly growth at the national level was seen in Automotive Stores (+5.2%), followed by Clothing Stores (+2.4%) and Furniture Stores (+1.6%).

In Nova Scotia February 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) decreased -0.3% to \$760 million over January 2004, and decreased -1.5% over February 2003. Unadjusted sales decreased -0.9% to \$609 million over February 2003.

All provinces except Nova Scotia posted higher retail sales in February compared to a month earlier.



# PROVINCIAL GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT 2003

Nova Scotia at 0.9% trailed all the other provinces in GDP growth in 2003. Nrewfoundland and Labrador ranked number 1 at +6.5%.

In Canada 2003, gross domestic product (GDP) in chained \$1997, increased +1.7% to \$1.09 trillion over 2002.

In Nova Scotia 2003, gross domestic product (GDP) in chained \$1997, increased +0.9% to \$25.1 billion over 2002.



## **INDUSTRIAL PRODUCT PRICE INDEX MARCH 2004**

In Canada, March 2004, the industrial product price index (1997=100) increased +0.5% to 107.7 over February 2004, and declined -1.4% over March 2003.

### BUSINESS CONDITIONS SURVEY: (NOVA SCOTIA) MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES, APRIL 2004

In Nova Scotia April 2004, 42% of manufacturers expect that during the next three months the volume of production will remain about the same as the last three months, an additional 34% believe that volume will increase, and 23% expect volume to decline.

Orders received by 58% of manufacturers are expected to be about right, while 23% expecting increases and 19% declines.

87% consider the present backlog of unfilled orders about the same as in the last quarter, 8% higher than normal and 5% lower than normal.

Most respondents (75%) believe the finished product inventory to be about right, while 7% consider levels to be too low, and 18% believe they are too high.

62% believe that employment during the next three months will change little, 23% expect an increase and 16% a decrease.

Most manufacturers (70%) do not foresee any production difficulties, 11% think that they may experience a skilled labour shortage, 8% a raw materials shortage, 6% a working capital shortage, and 2% expect an unskilled labour shortage.

In Canada 2002, total operating revenue of performing arts companies increased +5.1% to \$1.0 billion over 2001. Total operating expenses increased +3.7% to \$959 million. Operating profit increased +25% to \$6.5 million.

In Canada 2002, total operating revenue of spectator sports increased +14.2% to \$2.1 billion over 2001. Total operating expenses increased +9.6% to \$2.2 billion. Reported Operating loss was -\$3.8 million.

In Canada 2002, total operating revenue of other ammusement and recreation industries increased +10.0% to \$5.5 billion over 2001. Total operating expenses increased +11.5% to \$5.1 billion. Reported Operating profit was \$6.3 million.

Compared to 1st quarter 2004, investment in non-residential building construction in Canada rose 0.5% to \$6.7 billion. While industrial component decreased 2.6% to \$1.0 billion, the institutional sector invested \$2.4 billion (up 1.4% from 1st quarter mainly as a result of the construction of health care facilities)and commercial building investment rose 0.9% to \$3.3 billion.

In Nova Scotia investment in non-residential building construction increased 23.1% from 1st quarter 2004 to 2nd quarter 2004. By components, industrial rose 33.5% to \$15.8 million, institutional increased 48.2% to \$65.8 million and commercial increased 8.0% to \$88.4 million.

Investment in non-residential building construction in Halifax increased 19.3% from 1st quarter 2004 to 2nd quarter 2004 reaching \$76.0 million

In Canada 2002, the number of divorces declined -1.4% to 70,155 over 2001. The divorce rate by 30th wedding anniversary per 100 marriages declined to 37.6 from 37.9 in 2001.

In Nova Scotia 2002, the number of divorces declined -3.1% to 1,990 over 2001. The divorce rate by 30th wedding anniversary per 100 marriages increased to 30.4 from 28.9 in 2001.

In Canada April 2004 labour force increased +1.3% to 17.0 million, employment increased +1.7% to 15.7 million, unemployment declined -3.4% to 1.3 million, and the unemployment rate declined -0.4 percentage points to 7.6% over April 2003.



# **NEW HOUSING PRICE INDEX MARCH 2004**

In Canada March 2004, the new housing price index (1997=100) increased +0.3% to 120.8 over February 2004, and increased +5.1% over March 2003.

In Halifax March 2004, the new housing price index (1997=100) remained unchanged at 121.1 over February 2004 and increased +3.3% over March 2003.



# INTERNATIONAL MERCHANDISE TRADE MARCH 2004

In Canada March 2004, the international merchandise trade surplus was \$6.2 billion. The year to date surplus was \$17.2 billion.

In Canada March 2004, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) increased +1.7% to \$34.9 billion over February 2004 and declined -2.6% over March 2003. Year-to-date exports declined -4.3% to \$101.1 billion over Jan-Mar 2003.

In Canada March 2004, international merchandise trade imports increased +0.9% to 28.7 billion over February 2004, and declined -4.3% over March 2003. Year-to-date imports declined -6.5% to \$83.9 billion over Jan-Mar 2003.

Nova Scotia February 2004

In Nova Scotia February 2004, the international merchandise trade deficit was -\$176.0 million. The year to date deficit was -\$132.5 million.

In Nova Scotia February 2004, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) increased +4.1% to \$421.8 million over January 2004 and increased +4.5% over February 2003. Year-to-date exports declined -5.3% to \$826.9 million over Jan-Feb 2003.

In Nova Scotia February 2004, international merchandise trade imports increased +65.3% to \$597.8 million over January 2004, and increased +8.6% over February 2003. Year-to-date imports increased +7.1% to \$959.3 million over Jan-Feb 2003.



# **NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES MARCH 2004**

In Nova Scotia March 2004 new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) rose +2.8% over March 2003 to 3,826, and increased 15.9% over February 2004. Unadjusted unit sales increased 5.7% over March 2003 to 4,231.

In Canada March 2004 new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) decreased -4.4% over March 2003 to 133,407, and increased +4.1% over February 2004. Unadjusted unit sales increased 0.5% over March 2003 to 149,624.



## FILM AND VIDEO DISTRIBUTION 2002/2003

In Canada 2002/2003, profit of film, video and audio-visual distribution increased to \$769.5 million (13.4 of total revenue).

In Canada 2002/2003, the total revenue of film, video and audio-visual distribution increased +8.0% over 2001/2003 to \$3.3 billion. Total expenses increased +4.8% over 2001/2002 to \$2.8 billion.

#### MONTHLY SURVEY OF MANUFACTURING MARCH 2004

In Nova Scotia March 2004, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) increased 8.5% over February 2004 to \$754 million. All provinces and territories reported healthy gains in shipments in March.

In Canada March 2004, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) increased +3.4% over February 2004 to \$47.7 billion, and rose 1.9% over March 2003. In Canada, 19 of 21 manufacturing industries, accounting for 98% of total shipments, reported increases in March. Shipments of motor vehicles, up 8.2% to \$5.8 billion, outpaced all other industries.

Inventories increased 0.3% to \$58.8 billion over February 2004, a 6-month high, and declined -4.5% over March 2003.

Unfilled orders increased +0.2% over February 2004 to \$36.5 billion--the third monthly rise in a row and the longest string of consecutive increases since 1999--and declined -8.4% over February 2003.

Improving demand at home and abroad contributed to new orders increasing 2.4% over February 2004 to \$47.8 billion--the highest level since November 2000--and increased 3.6% over March 2003.

The inventory-to-shipments ratio decreased to 1.23 from 1.27 in February 2004, and declined from 1.32 in March 2003. This is the lowest level for the ratio in over four years.

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Note to readers

With the January 2004 release, estimates of shipments, inventories and orders have been revised back to January 1999. Although the historical month-to-month movements were preserved, there were adjustments made to the levels of the Monthly Survey of Manufacturing (MSM).

These adjustments were due to several factors: the use of new and revised data; updates to the industrial classification (NAICS); the updating of the seasonal adjustment factors; and most significantly, the benchmarking of the MSM to the 2000 and 2001 Annual Survey of Manufactures levels.

The average level of adjustment for shipments from reference year 1999 to 2003 was +5.5%.



# **ALCOHOL AND DRUG USE 1998/99**

In 1998/99 the National longitudinal survey of children and youth reported that 17% of household population aged 12 had had at least one drink of alcohol. By age 15 the percentage had increased to 66%.

In 1998/99 the National longitudinal survey of children and youth reported that 3% of household population aged 12 had smoked marijuana. By age 15 the percentage had increased to 38%.

# FOREIGN DIRECT INVESTMENT 2003

In 2003, Canadian direct foreign investment abroad declined -7.1% to \$399.1 billion over 2002. Foreign direct investment in Canada increased +2.5% to \$357.5 billion over 2002.

In 2002, Canadian direct foreign investment in the United States declined -16.3% to \$164.9 billion (41% of Can.DI) over 2001. U.S. foreign direct investment in Canada increased +2.3% to \$228.4 billion (64% of For.DI) over 2002.

In Halifax April 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.1% to 122.9 over March 2003, and increased +1.0% over April 2003.

In Canada 2003, the Chinese trade trade deficit increased 12 times to \$13.8 billion over 1995. In the period 1995 to 2003 exports to China increased +37.4% to \$\$4.8 billion and imports increased 300% to \$18.6 billion.

In Nova Scotia 2003, the Chinese trade trade deficit increased 1.7 times to \$47.9 million over 1995. In the period 1995 to 2003 exports to China increased +40.2% to \$64.5 million and imports increased 526% to \$112.3 million.

In Canada 2003, share of international imports had increased to 6% of total imports (compared to 2% in 1995).



## **ICT IN SCHOOLS 2003/04**

In Canada 2003/2004 the proportion of schools with internet connected computer was 97.7%. The proportion using dial-up access was 8.8%, and the proportion with "always on access" was 85.8% (High Speed = 31.6%, Optical fibre = 22.8%, Cable modem = 15.3%, T1 line = 11.6%, fixed wireless = 7.6%, satelite = 4.9%). The median student to computer ratio was 5.0.

In Nova Scotia the median student to computer ratio was 4.9.

In Canada April 2004, the new housing price index (1997=100) increased +0.7% to 121.7 over March 2004, and increased +5.6% over April 2003

## INDUSTRIAL CAPACITY UTILIZATION RATES 1ST QUARTER 2004

In Canada 1st quarter 2004, the industrial capacity utilization rate (ratio of actual to potential output) increased +0.6 percentage points to 83.5 over the 4th quarter 2003, and increased +0.8 percentage points over 1st quarter 2003.

The Forestry and logging sector capacity utilization rate increased +1.1 percentage points to 91.8 over the 4th quarter 2003, and declined -3.0 percentage points over 1st quarter 2003.

The Manufacturing sector capacity utilization rate increased +2.1 percentage points to 84.0 over the 3rd quarter 2003. In 2003 the industrial capacity utilization rate (annual average) declined -0.4 percentage points to 82.9 over 2002.

The Mining, Oil and Gas extraction sector capacity utilization rate declined -0.3 percentage points to 71.6 over the 4th quarter 2003, and increased +2.5 percentage points over the 1st quarter 2003.

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The Computer and electronic products sector capacity utilization rate increased +1.1 percentage points to 75.6 over the 4th quarter 2003 and +9.0 percentage points over the 1st quarter 2003.

Unit labour costs (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.2% over the 4th quarter 2003, and increased +0.8% over the 1st quarter 2003.

In Canada April 2004, the international merchandise trade surplus was \$7.6 billion. The year to date surplus was \$24.7 billion.

In Canada April 2004, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) increased +4.4% to \$36.6 billion over March 2004 and increased +10.1% over April 2003. Year-to-date exports declined -0.6% to \$138.3 billion over Jan-Apr 2003.

In Canada April 2004, international merchandise trade imports increased +0.7% to 29.1 billion over March 2004, and increased +0.9% over April 2003. Year-to-date imports declined -4.4% to \$113.5 billion over Jan-Apr 2003.

Nova Scotia March 2004

In Nova Scotia March 2004, the international merchandise trade deficit was -\$103.2 million. The year to date deficit was -\$233.3 million.

In Nova Scotia March 2004, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) increased +10.9% to \$469.7 million over February 2004 and declined -16.1% over March 2003. Year-to-date exports declined -9.3% to \$1.3 billion over Jan-Mar 2003.

In Nova Scotia March 2004, international merchandise trade imports declined -4.2% to \$572.9 million over February 2004, and declined -10.4% over March 2003. Year-to-date imports declined -0.1% to \$1.5 billion over Jan-Mar 2003.

## **NEW MOTOR VEHICLE SALES APRIL 2004**

In Nova Scotia April 2004 new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) rose +0.2% over March 2004 to 3,858, and increased 2.9% over April 2003. Unadjusted unit sales increased 4.9% over April 2003 to 5,061.

In Canada April 2004 new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +2.6% over March 2004 to 137,719, and increased +2.7% over April 2003. Unadjusted unit sales increased 4.8% over April 2003 to 160,246.

In Nova Scotia 2003, the number of smokers declined to 19.7% of the population (157,500) from 27.3% (208,200) in 1994.

In Canada 2003, the number of smokers declined to 17.8% of the population (4.7 million) from 24.3% (5.8 million) in 1994.

## MONTHLY SURVEY OF MANUFACTURING APRIL 2004

In Nova Scotia April 2004, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) increased 2.2% to \$778 million over March 2004.

In Canada April 2004, manufacturers' shipments (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.5% to \$48.5 billion over March 2004, and rose 7.0% over April 2003.

Inventories increased 1.0% to \$59.4 billion over March 2004, a 6-month high, and declined -3.8% over March 2003.

Unfilled orders increased +2.6% over March 2004 to \$37.3 billion and declined -4.0% over April 2003.

New orders increased +2.4% over March 2004 to \$49.4 billion and increased +11.6%% over April 2003.

The inventory-to-shipments ratio increased to 1.23 from 1.22 in March 2004, and declined from 1.36 in April 2003.

Consumer spending on cable television, computers, electronic toys and cellular phones increased to 3.6% from 1.5%. Spending on health care has increased to \$1400 from \$900. Spending on transportation has increased +7% to \$7000, over 1981.

### THE SOARING LOONIE 2003

In Canada November 18, 2003, the loonie increased +21.7% to 77.13 cents US over the same date in 2002 (63.39 cents US).

International merchandise trade imports (balance of payments - seasonally adjusted) in Canada during May 2004 increased 7.8% over April 2004 to \$31.2 billion and rose 10.3% over May 2003. Year-to-date imports declined 1.2% from January-May 2003 to \$145.6 billion over Jan-Apr 2003.

Nova Scotia May 2004

Province of origin, custom basis data (unadjusted) show Nova Scotia domestic exports reached \$511.2 million in May 2004, an increase of 12.0% over May 2003. Total Nova Scotia domestic exports during January-May 2004 were \$2,232.1 million, down 2.7% from the January-May 2003 period.

Domestic imports to Nova Scotia (province of clearance-unadjusted) were \$600.3 million in May 2004, up 35.7% over May 2003. During January-May 2004, domestic imports to Nova Scotia totalled \$2,652.3 million, an increase of 3.5% over January-May 2003.

## 2nd Quarter

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In Canada Apr-Jun 2004, farm cash receipts increased +14.0% to \$8.8 billion over Apr-Jun 2003. Livestock cash receipts declined -1.8% to \$4.0 billion, crop cash receipts increased +22.4% to \$3.7 billion, and payments cash receipts (net income stablisation, crop insurance, etc.) increased 71.0% to \$1.2 billion.

In Nova Scotia Apr-Jun 2004, farm cash receipts increased +5.5% to \$96 million over Apr-Jun 2003.

### 1st half 2004

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In Canada Jan-Jun 2004, farm cash receipts increased +6.3% to \$17.9 billion over Jan-Jun 2003. Livestock cash receipts declined -5.6% to \$8.2 billion, crop cash receipts increased +21.7% to \$7.4 billion, and payments cash receipts (net income stablisation, crop insurance, etc.) increased +10.8% to \$2.3 billion.

In Nova Scotia Jan-Jun 2004, farm cash receipts increased +8.5% to \$204 million over Jan-Jun 2003.

In Nova Scotia 2000, school board expenditures increased +0.2% to \$810.7 million over 1999. Expenditures per full-time student increased +0.3% to \$5,659 over 1999.



## **FAMILY FARM INCOME 2001**

In Canada 2001, average total income of farm families (148,560 families) increased +9.7% to \$72,674 over 2000. Net farm-operating income was \$20,185

The highest average total income was on poultry and egg farms (1,780 families), where net farm-operating income was \$44,866 and total income averaged \$92,991.

The lowest average income was on other vegetable (except potato) fams (1970 families) where net farm-operating income was \$16,415 and total income was \$59,030.

Oilseed and grain farming families (52,810 families) total income increased +13.5% to \$80,518. Total off-farm income = \$56,897; net farm-operating income = \$23,621.

In Canada 2003, the value of agriculture production increased +4.1% to \$46.6 billion over 2002. Total farm assets increased by +2.4% to \$230.9 billion; total farm liabilities increased +7.4% to \$43.9 billion.

In Nova Scotia 2003, the value of agriculture production increased +2.4% to \$487.1 million over 2002. Sales increased +1.4% to \$435 billion. Total farm assets increased by +1.9% to \$2.2 billion; total farm liabilities increased +8.3% to \$524.8 million.

In Canada May 2004, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -9.5% to \$4.1 billion over April 2004. The year to date value of bulding permits increased +6.4% to \$21.7 billion over January-May 2003.

In Nova Scotia May 2004, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -9.1% to \$108.1 million over April 2004. The year to date value of building permits increased +10.4% to \$452.9 million over January-May 2003.

In Halifax May 2004, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -15.0% to \$68.06 million over April 2004. The year to date value of building permits increased +17.4% to \$259.7% million over January-May 2003.

In Nova Scotia 2003, household internet use from any location increased +5.0 percentage points to 63.1% over 2002. Internet use from home increased +6.8 percentage points to 52.7%; from work increased +4.4 percentage points to 35.0%; from school increased +1.5 percentage points to 26.0%.

In Canada May 2004 new motor vehicle unit sales (seasonally adjusted) declined 3.2% over April 2004 to 133,294, and decreased 6.9% over May 2003. Unadjusted unit sales fell 10.4% over May 2003 to 166,143.

In Nova Scotia the June 2004 the consumer price index (1992=100) increased 0.4% to 126.5 over May 2004 and increased 2.3% over June 2003. The CPI, excluding food and energy, rose 0.3% over May 2004 to 123.1 and increased +0.6% over June 2003.

# **CRIME STATISTICS IN CANADA, 2003**

The rate of total criminal code offences increased +5.5% in Canada and +10.5% in Nova Scotia between 2002 and 2003. All provinces experienced increase in total criminal code offences, with the double-digit increases in three provinces: Saskatchewan (+12.%), Manitoba (+10.7%) and Nova Scotia (+10.5%).

While the rate of voilent crimes dropped by -0.7% in Canada it rose 7.3% in Nova Scotia between 2002 and 2003. The rate of property crime increased in both Canada (+3.7%) and Nova Scotia (+8.1%).

In Halifax, the rate of total criminal offences increased +5.1% between 2002 and 2003. There were 900 break-ins, 440 motor vehicle thefts, 141 roberies and 0.8 homicide per 100,000 population in Halifax in 2003.

In Nova Scotia July 2004, 43% of manufacturers expect that during the next three months the volume of production will remain about the same as the last three months, an additional 37% believe that volume will increase, and 20% expect volume to decline.

Orders received by 53% of manufacturers are expected to be about right, while 35% expecting increases and 13% declines.

79% consider the present backlog of unfilled orders about the same as in the last quarter, 5% higher than normal and 16% lower than normal.

Most respondents (81%) believe the finished product inventory to be about right, while 5% consider levels to be too low, and 14% believe they are too high.

64% believe that employment during the next three months will change little, 17% expect an increase and 19% a decrease.



## **EMPLOYER PENSION PLANS 2002**

In Canada 2002, the return on investment (ROI) of trusteed pension plans declined to +1.7% from a high of +12.6% posted in 2000.

# INDUSTRIAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT 2004

In Canada 2004, research and development expenditure intentions are expected to increase +1.6% to \$12.5 billion over 2003.

In Canada 2003, the number of smokers stood at 5.3 million (21% of population aged 15+) over 2002. Smoking rates for teens (aged 15-19) declined to 18% from 22% in 2002; for young adults (aged 20-24) the smoking rate = 30%.

The survey also reports that 53% of current smokers had used marijuana more than once in their lifetime.

In Canada June 2004, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) increased +27.1% to \$5.3 billion over May 2004. The year to date value of bulding permits increased +9.4% to \$27.0 billion over January-June 2003.

In Nova Scotia June 2004, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -2.7% to \$106.1 million over May 2004. The year to date value of building permits increased +9.8% to \$560.0 million over January-June 2003.

In Halifax June 2004, the value of building permits (seasonally adjusted) declined -33.3% to \$45.5 million over May 2004. The year to date value of building permits increased +5.2% to \$305.4% million over January-June 2003.



# PRIVATE SECURITY AND PUBLIC POLICING 2001

In Canada 2001, the rate per 100,000 population of security guards and private investigators declined -2% to 280 over 1996. The rate per 100,000 population of police officers increased +2% to 209.

The number of security guards and private investigations increased +2% to 84,000 (security guards = 73,535, pi's = 10,465) and the number of police officer increased +6% over 1996 (police officer = 63,000).

Wages of security guards declined -04% to \$27,474; private investigators increased +2% to \$58,596; police officers increased +6% to \$59,888.

# PROVINCIAL AND TERRITORIAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE MARCH 31, 2002

In Canada March 31, 2003, on a Financial Management System basis the provincial/territorial governments net debt increased +2.6% to \$255.9 billion over 2002. Per capita debt increased to \$8,112 from \$7,980. Net debt as a percentage of GDP declined to 21.1% from 22.2%.

In Nova Scotia March 31, 2003, on a Financial Management System basis the provincial/territorial government net debt increased +5.3% to \$11.9 billion over 2002. Per capita debt increased to \$12,714.

NOTE: The Financial Management System (FMS) is used to produce the government financial statistics presented in this release. FMS standardizes individual government accounts to provide consistent and comparable statistics. As a result, FMS statistics may differ from the figures published in individual government financial statements. Inventories increased 0.6% to \$60.5 billion over May 2004, and remained unchanged over June 2003.

In Canada June 2004, international merchandise trade exports (seasonally adjusted) increased +4.4% to \$39.0 billion over May 2004 and increased +20.1% over June 2003. Year-to-date exports increased +4.9% to \$214.4 billion over Jan-Jun 2003.

In Canada June 2004, international merchandise trade imports declined -3.7% to 30.4 billion over May 2004, and increased +9.3% over June 2003. Year-to-date imports increased +0.5% to \$176,2 billion over Jan-Jun 2003.

In Canada September 2004, the composite leading indicator (1992=100) increased +0.3% to 199.9 over August 2004.

Six of ten indices were positive. (down 1 from August)

Business and personal services employment increased +0.1% to 2.6 million. S & P/TSX stock price index (1975=1,000) increased +1.0% to 8,493. Money Supply, M1(\$ millions, 1992) increased +0.8% to 129,238. New orders, durables (\$1992) increased +0.7% to \$23.2 billion. The shipments/inventories of finished goods ratio increased to 1.90. Furniture and appliances sales (\$1992) increased +0.6% to \$2.1 billion.

Three of ten indices were negative. (up 2 from August)

The housing index (1992=100) declined -0.8% to 144.8. Average workweek (hours) declined -0.3% to 38.4 hours. Other durable goods sales (\$1992) declined -0.2% to \$7.6 billion.

One of ten indices remained unchanged

The US composite leading indicator remained unchanged at 115.4.

In Nova Scotia August 2004, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +8.9% to \$553 million over July 2004, and increased +3.2% over August 2003.

In Canada August 2004, wholesale merchants' sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.7% to \$38.3 billion over July 2004, and increased +15.8% over August 2003.

In Canada August 2004, wholesale merchants sales of computer and other electronic equipment increased +3.8% to \$2.8 billion over July 2004, and increased +17.1% over August 2003.



# RENEWING CANADA'S MANUFACTURING ECONOMY 1961 - 1999

Renewal process. In Canada 1973 to 1996, about two-thirds of manufacturing jobs were created since 1973. Seventy-five (75) percent of these new jobs were the result of new plants being established. Over 55% of the new jobs were created by new businesses.

Renewal rate (i.e. potential for long-term growth) for Canada in the period 1973 to 1996 was 63.5%; for the Maritimesw the rate was 53.5%.

#### **RETAIL TRADE AUGUST 2004**

Statistics Canada Cat. No. 63-005-XIB

In Canada August 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.8% to \$29.1 billion over July 2004, and increased +4.8% over August 2003. Unadjusted retail sales increased +2.2% to \$29.7 billion over August 2003.

In Nova Scotia August 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) remained unchanged at \$854 million over July 2004, and increased +1.6% over August 2003. Unadjusted sales declined -0.4% to \$881 million over August 2003.

### NOTE:

Starting with April release, data collected from the Monthly Retail Trade Survey are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2002), which is not comparable to the previously used Standard Industrial Classification (SIC 1980). Consequently, retail sales estimates have been revised from January 1991 to March 2004.

### **FARM PRODUCT PRICE INDEX AUGUST 2004**

In Canada August 2004, the farm product price index (1997=100) increased +0.8% to 100.5 over July 2004 and increased +5.2% over August 2003. The FPPI crops increased +3.2% to 99.7 over July 2004 and declined -2.9% over August 2003. The FPPI livestock declined -1.3% to 101.3 over July 2004 and increased +15.5% over August 2003.

In Nova Scotia August 2004, the farm product price index (1997=100) increased +7.7% to 102.4 over July 2004 and increased +1.5% over August 2003. The FPPI crops increased +23.3% to 101.6 over July 2004 and increased +1.7% over August 2003. The FPPI livestock declined -1.7% to 101.5 over July 2004 and increased +2.6% over August 2003.



# **CONSUMER PRICE INDEX SEPTEMBER 2004**

In Canada the September 2004 consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.1% to 124.9 over August 2004 and increased +1.8% over September 2003.

The CPI, excluding food and energy increased +0.3% to 122.3 over August 2004 and increased +1.2% over September 2003. CPI, excluding the eight most volatile components, increased +0.3% to 125.1 over August 2004 and increased +1.5% over September 2003.

In Nova Scotia September 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.2% to 126.8 over August 2004 and increased 2.2% over September 2003. The CPI, excluding food and energy, increased +0.1% to 123.4 over August 2004 and increased +0.7% over September 2003.

In Halifax the September 2004 consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.1% to 125.7 over August 2004 and increased +2.0% over September 2003.

In Canada 2002/03, the average daily cost of persons in provincial/territorial custody increased +3.2\$ to \$117.77 (\$1992/93 constant \$) over 2001/02. The adjusted average daily count of persons in provincial/territorial custody increased +2.2% to 19,004 (12.2% of total) over 2001/02.

In Canada 2002/03, the average daily cost of persons in provincial/territorial community supervision services increased +1.1% to \$4.10 (\$1992/93 constant \$) over 2001/02. The adjusted average daily count of persons in provincial community supervision services increased +1.2% to 116,545 (75% of total) over 2001/02.

In Canada August 2004, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.3% to \$697.94 over July 2004, and increased +1.8% over August 2003. Employment declined -0.1% to 13.5 million over July 2004.

In Nova Scotia August 2004, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.3% to \$618.12 over July 2004, and increased +3.4% over July 2003. Employment declined -0.1% to 380,000 over July 2004.



## **RAW MATERIAL PRICE INDEX SEPTEMBER 2004**

In Canada, September 2004, the raw material price index (1997=100) increased +0.3% to 134.2 over August 2004, and increased +25.0% over September 2003.

### **NOVA SCOTIA**

In Nova Scotia October 2004, 57% of manufacturers expect that during the next three months the volume of production will remain about the same as the last three months, an additional 29% believe that volume will increase, and 14% expect volume to decline.

Orders received by 38% of manufacturers are expected to be about right, while 50% expecting increases and 12% declines.

88% consider the present backlog of unfilled orders about the same as in the last quarter, 7% higher than normal and 5% lower than normal.

Most respondents (55%) believe the finished product inventory to be about right, while 4% consider levels to be too low, and 40% believe they are too high.

48% believe that employment during the next three months will change little, 30% expect an increase and 23% a decrease.

Most manufacturers (76%) do not foresee any production difficulties, 6% think that they may experience a skilled labour shortage, 6% a raw materials shortage, 2% a working capital shortage, and 2% expect an unskilled labour shortage.

### **CANADA**

In Canada October 2004, 69% of manufacturers expect that during the next three months the volume of production will remain about the same as the last three months, an additional 22% believe that volume will increase, and 9% expect volume to decline.

Orders received by 78% of manufacturers are expected to be about right, while 18% expecting increases and 4% declines.

61% consider the present backlog of unfilled orders to be about normal, 4% higher than normal and 17% lower than normal.

Most respondents (79%) believe the finished product inventory to be about right, while 4% consider levels to be too low, and 17% believe they are too high.

73% believe that employment during the next three months will change little, 18% expect an increase and 9% a decrease.

Most manufacturers (81%) do not foresee any production difficulties, 6% think that they may experience a skilled labour shortage, 5% a raw materials shortage, 3% expect an unskilled labour shortage and 2% a working capital shortage.



## CONTROL AND SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, March 31, 2003

In Canada fiscal year ending March 31, 2002, the sale of alcoholic beverages totalled \$15.4 billion, up 6.0% from the previous year. Beer accounted for \$7.8 billion, spirits \$3.8 billion and wine \$3.4 billion.

In Canada 2002, assets of foreign-controlled enterprises increased +4.3% to \$954 billion (or 21.7% of total assets) over 2001. Operating revenues declined -1.6% to \$704 billion (or 28.9% of total operating revenue). Operating profit declined -1.9% to \$50 billion.

In Canada September 2004, wholesale merchants sales of computer and other electronic equipment declined -8.4% to \$2.7 billion over August 2004, and increased +6.7% over September 2003.



## SURVEY OF SUPPLIERS OF BUSINESS FINANCING 2003

As of December 31, 2003 the Canadian business total debt outstanding declined -0.1% to \$361.1 billion over the same date on 2002. Total leases outstanding increased +1.5% to \$24.87 billion.

The share of debt held by domestic banks declined to 52.8% or \$192.0 billion. The share of debt held by finance companies increased to 12.0%, other banks increased to 11.8%, insurance companies remained unchanged at 10.7%, and credit unions/caisse populaires increased to 9.7%.

#### RETAIL TRADE SEPTEMBER 2004

In Canada September 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.2% to \$29.1 billion over August 2004, and increased +4.7% over September 2003. Unadjusted retail sales increased +6.6% to \$29.3 billion over September 2003.

In Nova Scotia September 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.7% to \$858 million over August 2004, and increased +5.1% over September 2003. Unadjusted sales increased +7.3% to \$852 million over September 2003.

#### NOTE:

Starting with April release, data collected from the Monthly Retail Trade Survey are classified according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS 2002), which is not comparable to the previously used Standard Industrial Classification (SIC 1980). Consequently, retail sales estimates have been revised from January 1991 to March 2004.

Money Supply, M1(\$ millions, 1992) increased +0.7% to 130,679. New orders, durables (\$1992) increased +0.1% to \$23.3 billion. The shipments/inventories of finished goods ratio increased to 1.91. Furniture and appliances sales (\$1992) increased +0.5% to \$2.1 billion. Other durable goods sales (\$1992) increased +0.1% to \$7.6 billion.

In Canada the October 2004 consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.2% to 125.2 over September 2004 and increased +2.3% over October 2003.

The CPI, excluding food and energy remained unchanged at 122.3 over September 2004 and increased +1.0% over October 2003. CPI, excluding the eight most volatile components, remained unchanged at 125.1 over September 2004 and increased +1.4% over October 2003.

In Nova Scotia October 2004, the consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.3% to 127.2 over September 2004 and increased 3.0% over October 2003.

In Halifax the October 2004 consumer price index (1992=100) increased +0.3% to 126.1 over September 2004 and increased +2.7% over October 2003.

In Nova Scotia 2003, net cash income (farm business cash flow) increased to \$39 million from \$37 million in 2002. Total net income increased to -\$10 million from -\$11 million in 2002.



# INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL ACCOUNT 3RD QUARTER 2004

In Canada 3rd quarter 2004, the international travel account posted a deficit of -\$930 million. Total receipts increased +0.6% to \$4.1 billion, and total payments declined -4.5% to \$5.0 billion over the 2nd quarter 2004.

In Halifax September 2004, federal government employment declined to 16,437 from 16,479 in 2003. This CMA has the 2nd highest proportion of federal government jobs = 8.3% of total employment (199,100).

In Nova Scotia September 2004, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.5% to \$619.14 over August 2004, and increased +3.2% over September 2003. Employment remained unchanged at 379,500over August 2004.

## **EMPLOYMENT INSURANCE, OCTOBER 2004**

In Canada October 2004, the number of beneficiaries receiving regular benefits (seasonally adjusted) decreased -2.2% to 522,430 over September 2004, and declined -9.6% over October 2003.

In Nova Scotia October 2004, the number of beneficiaries receiving regular benefits (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.6% to 30,100 over September 2004, and decreased -0.4% over October 2003.

## **COMPOSITE INDICATORS, NOVEMBER 2004**

In Canada November 2004, the composite leading indicator (1992=100) remained unchanged at 200.1 over October 2004.

Six of ten indices were positive. (down 1 from October)

Business and personal services employment increased +0.1% to 2.6 million. S & P/TSX stock price index (1975=1,000) increased +1.1% to 8,681. Money Supply, M1(\$ millions, 1992) increased +0.1% to 130,808. New orders, durables (\$1992) increased +0.3% to \$23.4 billion. Furniture and appliances sales (\$1992) increased +0.8% to \$2.1 billion. Other durable goods sales (\$1992) increased +0.2% to \$7.6 billion.

Three of ten indices were negative. (up 1 from October)

The housing index (1992=100) declined -0.8% to 141.1. The US composite leading indicator declined -0.3% to 115.0. Average workweek (hours) declined -0.3% to 38.2 hours.

One of ten indices remained unchanged

The shipments/inventories of finished goods ratio remained unchanged at 1.90.

# **RETAIL TRADE OCTOBER 2004**

In Canada October 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +1.4% to \$29.6 billion over September 2004, and increased +6.6% over October 2003. Unadjusted retail sales increased +4.8% to \$29.5 billion over October 2003.

In Nova Scotia October 2004, retail sales (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.5% to \$865 million over September 2004, and increased +3.6% over October 2003. Unadjusted sales increased +1.8% to \$860 million over October 2003.



## SOFTWARE DEVELOPMENT AND COMPUTER SERVICES 2003

#### Software Publishers

In Canada 2003, operating revenues in the software publishers industry [511210] increased +7.9% to \$5.8 billion over 2002. Operating expenses increased +8.9% to \$5.9 billion Profit margin (loss) was -2%. The number of active establishments increased +5.9% to 1,946.

In Nova Scotia 2003, operating revenues in the software publishers industry [511210] increased +3.1% to \$23.2 million over 2002. Operating expenses increased +13.1% to \$36.2 million. Profit margin (loss) was -56%. The number of active establishments declined -4.0% to 24.

#### Computer Systems Design

In Canada 2003, total revenues in the computer systems design and related services industry [541510] increased +2.8% to \$18.8 billion over 2002. Operating expenses increased +2.1% to \$17.7 bllion. Profit margin was +5.8%. The number of active establishments increased +3.9% to 45,377.

In Nova Scotia 2003, total revenues in the computer systems design and related services industry [541510] declined -11.7% to \$258.9 million over 2002. Operating expenses increased +3.8% to \$262.9 million. Profit margin (loss) was -5.4% The number of active establishments declined -7.3% to 454.

## **Data Processing Services**

In Canada 2003, total revenues in the data processing services industry [518217] increased +2.3% to \$2.7 billion over 2001. Operating expenses increased +4.1% to \$2.5 billion. Profit margin was +4.2%. The number of active establishments increased +23.5% % to 1,317.

Nova Scotia data processing services industry [518217] information is unavailable.

## **INTERNET SERVICE PROVIDERS 2003**

In Canada 2003, internet service provider operating revenues increased +8% to \$1.6 billion over 2002. The operating expenses declined -13% to \$1.3 billion. The operating profit margin percent was +15.8%.

#### EMPLOYMENT, EARNINGS AND HOURS OCTOBER 2004

In Canada October 2004, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) increased +0.2% to \$704.88 over September 2004, and increased +1.9% over October 2003. Employment declined -0.1% to 13.5 million over September 2004.

In Nova Scotia October 2004, average weekly earnings (seasonally adjusted) declined -0.4% to \$617.88 over September 2004, and increased +3.5% over October 2003. Employment declined -0.7% to 376,500 over September 2004.
