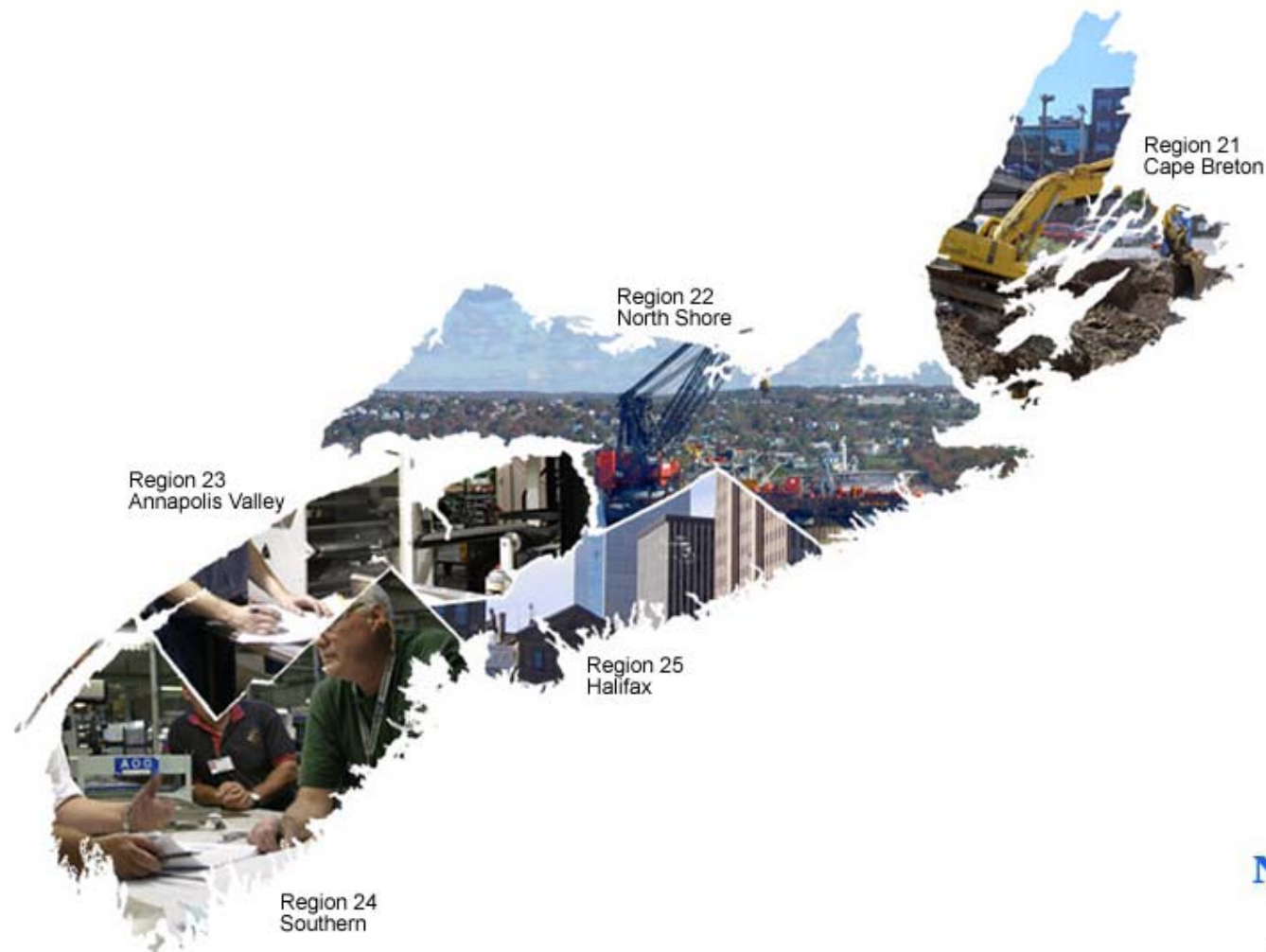

## Introduction

The *Labour Force Data, Historical, 1996 to 2005*, has been compiled using the Labour Force Survey series from Statistics Canada's CANSIM<sup>1</sup> database. Statistics Canada also disseminates historical labour force data in their annual LFS CD-ROM product—see *2005 Labour Force Historical Review*, Catalogue No. 71F0004XCB<sup>2</sup>. While the Economics & Statistics Division's Labour Force Data, Historical includes key labour force indicators 1996 to 2005, the Statistics Canada CANSIM and CD series of LFS estimates, contains thousands of cross-classified data series, with most of the data spanning 1976 to 2005. In addition to the tables included on the following pages, the Statistics Canada CANSIM and CD products can also be referenced on a much wider range of monthly and annual labour force data (see subject areas below).

### ***About the Labour Force Survey (LFS)***

---

The Labour Force Survey (LFS) is a household survey carried out monthly by Statistics Canada. Begun in 1945, the objectives of the LFS have been to divide the working-age population into three mutually exclusive classifications: 1) employed, 2) unemployed, and 3) not in the labour force; and to provide descriptive and explanatory data on each of these categories. Data from the survey provides information on major labour trends such as shifts in employment across industrial sectors, hours worked, labour force participation and unemployment rates.

The LFS survey uses a sample of individuals who are representative of the civilian, non-institutionalized population 15 years of age or older in Canada's ten provinces. Residents of the Territories, persons living on Indian Reserves, full-time members of the Canadian Armed Forces and residents of institutions are not included in the survey's coverage. There are currently 3,005 Nova Scotia households in the current sample and 53,648 households in total across Canada.

*Definitions*—the key definitions used in the LFS follow. For a more detailed dictionary of concepts and definitions refer to Statistics Canada, *Guide to the Labour Force Survey*, Catalogue No. 71-543-GIE.

*Population:* The target population covered by the survey corresponds to all persons aged 15 years and over residing in the provinces of Canada, with the exception of the following: 1) persons living on Indian Reserves, 2) full-time members of the regular Armed Forces, and 3) persons living in institutions.

*Labour Force:* The civilian non-institutional population 15 years of age and over that, during the survey reference week, was employed or unemployed and actively looking for work. Prior to 1966, persons aged 14 and over were covered by the survey.

*Employment:* Employed persons are those persons who, during the reference week, did any work for pay or profit, or had a job and were absent from work.

*Full-time Employment:* Refers to those persons who usually work 30 hours or more per week at their main or only job.

*Part-time Employment:* Refers to those persons who usually work less than 30 hours per week at their main or only job.

*Unemployment:* Unemployed persons are those persons who, during reference week, were available for work and were either on temporary layoff, had looked for work in the past four weeks, or had a job to start within the next four weeks.

*Not in the Labour Force:* Persons not in the labour force are those who, during the reference week, were unwilling or unable to offer or supply labour services under conditions existing in their labour markets, that is, they were neither employed nor unemployed.

*Unemployment Rate:* The number of unemployed persons expressed as a percentage of the labour force. The unemployment rate for a particular group (age, sex, marital status, etc.) is the number unemployed in that group expressed as a percentage of the labour force for that group.

*Participation Rate:* The total labour force expressed as a percentage of the population aged 15 years and over. The participation rate for a particular group (for example, women aged 25 years and over) is the labour force in that group expressed as a percentage of the population for that group.

*Employment Rate:* The number of employed persons expressed as a percentage of the population 15 years of age and over. The employment rate for a particular group (age, sex, marital status, province, etc.) is the

number employed in that group expressed as a percentage of the population for that group.

### ***Statistics Canada Labour Force Survey (LFS) Revisions***

---

On Wednesday, January 25, 2006, revisions were released affecting all Labour Force Survey estimates from January 1987 to December 2005. Reasons for this revision:

- The revision will enable the use of improved population benchmarks in the LFS estimation process. These improved benchmarks will provide better information on the number of non-permanent residents.
- There will be changes to the data for the public and private sectors from 1987 to 1999. Previously, the data on the public and private sectors for this period was based on an old definition of the public sector. The revised data will better reflect the current public sector definition; thus, resulting in a longer time series for analysis.
- The geographic coding of several small Census Agglomerations (CA) have been updated historically from 1996 urban centre boundaries to 2001 CA boundaries. This affects data from January 1987 to December 2004.

*Perspectives on Labour and Income* is available on Statistics Canada’s web site ([www.statcan.ca](http://www.statcan.ca)) on a monthly basis (Catalogue No. 75-001-XIE) and as a print publication on a quarterly basis (Catalogue No. 75-001-XPE). The publication brings together and analyses a wide range of timely labour and income issues.

### Annual:

*Labour Force Historical Review* on CD-ROM (Catalogue No. 71F0004XCB) is released in February each year. The product contains thousands of cross-classified data series for a wider range of labour force data and spans from 1976 to current year.

*The Guide to the Labour Force Survey* (Catalogue No. 71-543GIE) contains a dictionary of concepts and definitions and covers topics such as survey methodology, data collection, data processing and data quality. It also contains information on products and services, sub-provincial geography descriptions, as well as, the survey questionnaire. This publication is free on the Statistics Canada Internet site.

## Overview – Nova Scotia Labour Force and Employment in 2005

Employment in Nova Scotia averaged 443,100 in 2005, a gain of 900 over 2004 (0.2 per cent) and 66,200 or 17.6 per cent above the 1996 figure. Between 1996 and 2005, there has been a 19.7 per cent increase in full-time jobs and a 9.1 per cent gain in part-time positions. During this period, full-time and part-time female employment rose 27.1 per cent and 11.9 per cent respectively, while male full-time and part-time employment increased 14.5 per cent and 3.2 per cent respectively. In 2005, while 88.8 per cent of men employed were full-time and 11.2 per cent part-time, 73.2 per cent of employed women worked full-time and 26.8 per cent worked part-time.

Employment in Canada stood at 16,169,700 in 2005, up 1.4 per cent over the previous year and 20.5 per cent over 1996. Newfoundland and Labrador was the only province across Canada to display an employment decline from 2004 and 2005 (200 fewer people employed). The employment growth in the remaining Atlantic Provinces included New Brunswick (+400) and Prince Edward Island (+1,300 persons).

In 2005, Nova Scotia's number of unemployed persons decreased by 2,000 from the previous year. The annual unemployment rate was 8.4 per cent in 2005, as compared to 8.8 per cent in 2004 and 12.4 per cent in 1996. Canada's unemployment rate in 2005 was 6.8 per cent, down 0.4 percentage points from 2004, and it stood at 9.6 per cent in 1996. From 2004 to 2005, the unemployment rate decreased in all provinces.

Employment in the goods-producing sector of the province, which represented 20.6 per cent of total employment in 2005, decreased 2.7 per cent over the previous year. Within the goods producing sector in 2005, percentage increases over 2004 in employment were noted in the following industries: agriculture (7.4 per cent); forestry and logging with support activities (10.8 per cent); fishing, hunting and trapping (3.9 per cent); and mining and oil and gas extraction (16.0 per cent), while declines were noted in utilities (4.0 per cent), construction (1.8 per cent); and manufacturing (7.6 per cent). The change, in terms of actual employment numbers, was minimal in all goods industries.

There was a 1.0 per cent growth in employment in Nova Scotia's service sector during the same period. Percentage increases in employment in the service sector industries from 2004 to 2005 were in health care and social assistance (4.5 per cent); trade (4.1 per cent); other services (2.0 per cent); accommodation and food services (1.6 per cent); and public administration (0.7 per cent). The most significant percentage decline in employment within the service sector industries was information, culture and recreation (4.8 per cent). In terms of actual employment numbers, change was minimal in all service sector industries with the exception of trade (3,100 more persons employed) and health care and social assistance (2,400 more persons employed).

The Halifax<sup>1</sup> unemployment rate in 2005 decreased 0.2 percentage points over 2004 to 5.8 per cent and represented a 2.4 percentage point decline over 1996. The Halifax employment rate (ratio of number of persons employed as a percentage of population 15 years of age and over) was 65.6 per cent in 2005, a 0.6 percentage point decline over 2004 and a 3.8 per cent increase over 1996.

The following table indicates the unemployment rate of the regions of Nova Scotia in 2005 and compares the change over 2004.
