Note Changes:

Changes reflected in the Labour Force Survey (LFS) effective with the January 2005 data release and with historical revisions back to January 1976:

1. Population—rebased to 2001 Census population counts (previous base was the 1996 Census estimates)
2. Industry estimates—classified from the 1997 to the 2002 NAICS
3. Occupation estimates—classified from the 1991 Standard Occupation Classification to the National Occupational Classification 2001 (NOC-S)
4. Geographic boundaries—changed from the 1996 Standard Geographical Classification (SGC) to the 2001 SGC which has affected boundaries of the census metropolitan areas only (CMA boundaries are now aligned with the 2001 Census boundaries).

LFS data for the month of January 2005 was released February 4, 2005 while historical revisions were available January 26, 2005 on CANSIM (Tables 282-0001 to 282-0095) and on the Labour Force Historical Review CD-ROM product in February 2005.

All estimates in the tables are expressed in thousands, with the exception of rates and averages (e.g., average number of hours worked, average duration of unemployment and average wage rates).

Some detailed data are suppressed to ensure respondents' confidentiality. Suppressed cells appear as "0.0" while true zeros or unavailable data are expressed with "-".

NOVA SCOTIA LABOUR FORCE AND EMPLOYMENT IN 2004

Employment in the Province averaged 441,600 in 2004, a gain of 10,300 from 2003 (+2.4%) and 67,100 or 17.9% above the 1995 figure. Between 1995 and 2004, there has been an 19.9% increase in full-time jobs and a 10.2% gain in part-time positions. During this period, full-time and part-time female employment rose 29.9% and 10.5% respectively, while male full-time and part-time employment increased 13.2% and 9.6% respectively. In 2004, while 88.6% of men employed were full-time and 11.4% were part-time, 73.2% of employed women worked full-time and 26.8% worked part-time. Employment in Canada stood at 15,949,700 in 2004, up 1.8% over the previous year and 20.2% over 1995. Other Atlantic Provinces that displayed employment growth from 2003 to 2004 included New Brunswick (+6,600), Newfoundland/Labrador (+2,800 persons) and Prince Edward Island (+600 persons).

In 2004, Nova Scotia's number of unemployed persons decreased by 700 from the previous year. The annual unemployment rate was 8.8% in 2004 as compared to 9.1% in 2003 and 12.3% in 1995. Canada's unemployment rate in 2004 was 7.2%, down 0.4 percentage points from 2003. From 2003 to 2004, the unemployment rate increased 0.3 percentage points to 11.3% in Prince Edward Island and 0.3 percentage points to 5.3% in Manitoba, while it declined 0.8 percentage points to 15.6% in Newfoundland and Labrador, 0.8 percentage points to 7.2% in British Columbia, 0.7 percentage points to 9.2% in Quebec, 0.5 percentage points to 10.3% in New Brunswick, 0.5 percentage points to 4.6% in Alberta, 0.3 percentage points to 5.3% in Saskatchewan and 0.2 percentage points to 6.8% in Ontario,

Employment in the goods-producing sector of the province, which represented 21.1% of total employment in 2004, rose 2.4% over the previous year. Within the goods producing sector in 2004, significant increases in employment was noted in construction (+3,200). There was a 2.8% growth in employment in the service sector during the same period. The greatest increases in employment in the service sector industries from 2003 to 2004 were in business, building and other support services (+2,800 persons), educational services (+2,400) and professional, scientific and technical services (+2,100).

The unemployment rate in Halifax Metro during 2004 decreased 0.5 percentage points over 2003 to 6.1%. The Halifax Metro rate was the lowest of metro areas east of Quebec City. In 2004 an annual growth in the labour force of 6,200 and an increase in employment of 7,000 resulted in an overall decline of 800 in the number of unemployed persons in Halifax Metro. Comparing the regions of Nova Scotia to the previous year, declines in the unemployment rate were noted in the Cape Breton region (-0.4 percentage points to 15.5%), the Southern region (-0.4 percentage points to 10.3%) and the Halifax region (-0.5 percentage points to 6.1%). The unemployment rate increased 0.3 percentage points to 10.0% in the North Shore region and rose 0.3 percentage points to 8.7% in the Annapolis Valley region.
