Under Article 13.01 of the Union Agreement between the Nova Scotia Department of Transportation and Public Works and the Canadian Union of Public Employees, Local 1867, the following opportunity is being posted:



Temporary Mobile Service Mechanic Fleet Services (*Digby*)

Note: This is a term position for a period of approximately six months ending April 1, 2007.

The Mobile Service Mechanic is responsible for performing preventative maintenance; related Equipment Operator training; inspecting, diagnosing and repairing all types of internal combustion and diesel engines, heavy construction equipment and related systems for all road maintenance and snow removal fleet machinery using precision tools, gauges and computer diagnostics. This position will be responsible for equipment in the Digby base.

To qualify, applicants must have successfully completed Grade 12 and/or an equivalent combination of training and experience, plus a Provincial Certificate in Truck and Transport Repair. A Welder "C" certificate of qualification and a knowledge of computer controlled diagnostic technology would be considered assets. Qualification of air conditioning repair and automotive repair would also be assets. The applicant will have a minimum of five (5) years diversified mechanical experience, demonstrated oral and written communication skills and an ability to work in a team environment. A valid Nova Scotia drivers license is required.
